ROAD FROM WANGARATTA TO BEECHWORTH.

OTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan describing the exact course and bearings of and the admeasurements required for an alteration proposed to be made by the Central Road Board in the line of road leading from Wangaratta to Beechworth, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as they are known, and also an estimate of the said work, have been deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, Melbourne. The particulars of the proposed alteration are as follows:—

The diversion commences at a road one chain wide, bounding the south-east side of section H, in the agricultural allotments north of Wangaratta, bearing south 38 degrees east 24 chains, passing through the property of C. Chandler; and thence south 3 degrees west 24 chains 80 links, width 3 chains, embracing the east angle of portion H, section B, the property of G. F. Docker.

The quantity of land required to be taken for the proposed alteration is two acres three roods and twenty-six perches, and the estimated cost of

effecting the said work is £70 12s. 3d. All persons affected by the proposed alteration

are required to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Central Road Board, Melbourne, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said alteration, failing which they will be thereupon precluded from making any such objection or claiming any compensation whatsoever.
