**T**HE following Rules and Regulations, made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, established at Warrnambool, having been submitted to the Lieutenant Governor and Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Council 17th Vict., No. 12, are approved.

#### Rules and Regulations of the Warrnambool Public Cemetery, established 1854.

Whereas the Trustees of the said Cemetery, appointed by virtue of the Act of Council, 17th Victoria, No. 12, are empowered to enclose any land to be granted to them for the purpose of a Public Cemetery with walls, rails, fences, or palisades, and to erect suitable gates and entrances, and to lay out and ornament such Cemetery, and to embellish the same with walks, avenues, roads, and shrubs, and to preserve, maintain, and keep in a cleanly and orderly state and condition such Cemetery, and its walls and fences and all monuments, tombstones, enclosures, buildings, erections, walks, and shrubberies therein. And the said Trustees are by the said Act further empowered and authorised to make such rules and regulations, and to do and perform, and cause to be done and performed, all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and for the several other purposes in the said Act mentioned: Now therefore the Trustees of the said Cemetery, in pursuance of the powers and authority so given to them as aforesaid, do make the following Rules and Regulations:—

Before any interment shall take place in the said Cemetery, application for permission shall be made at the office of the Trustees a reasonable time previously, when an order in the form or to the effect set out in the schedule hereto annexed marked B, will be given to the applicant on payment of the charges in the schedule hereto annexed marked A.

All such charges must be paid when the order for interment is given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery, on a certificate of a Minister of Religion or other sufficient evidence to the satisfaction of the Trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of applying for the order, according to the instructions in schedule C.

The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery, and the same must be observed as punctually as possible.

Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten A.M. to Six P.M. in the months of September to April, both inclusive; and from Ten A.M. to Four P.M. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock P.M. throughout the year.

The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, and all orders for interment shall be given to the keeper at the lodge of the cemetery, or at the office of the trustees, in sufficient time for that purpose and to allow the necessary arrangements to be made.

No fencing round any grave to be erected until approved by the trustees.

No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty, or on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

No dogs, horses, or conveyances, will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

The ground will be open to the public daily, from sunrise to sunset.

The keeper shall have orders to turn out or take into custody, as the case may require, any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to the cemetery, or the regulations for protection of the same, and such persons will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the Act.

#### *Family or Private Burial Places.*

The trustees will permit vaults or graves to be dug, maintained, and kept as family or private burial places, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of any person desirous to have the same, and his representatives for ever; and monuments or tombstones may be erected or placed thereon, in accordance with these rules and regulations, on payment of such fees as shall from time to time be established by them. Permission to have a family or private burial place will be granted at the office of the trustees in the form and to the effect set forth in schedule B hereto annexed. Parties wanting brick graves or vaults, will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent of the party entitled thereto (in writing) must be left with the order. No interment shall take place in any vault or private family burying

place until an order be obtained from the trustees, and payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by them.

All monuments, vaults, graves, burying places, and grave stones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

A drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription shall be submitted to the trustees for approval before permission for the erection or placing thereof shall be given. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used. The trustees shall determine the position of any monument proposed to be erected (when approved by them) according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

A plan of the cemetery, shewing the situation of the purchased and other graves, shall be kept at the Office of the Trustees, and may be inspected at the charge set out in schedule; and registers of all grants will be kept by the secretary.

The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a Board of Survey, according to the practice of the service; but in country districts, where a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

3. If the Board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured by the party requiring it, and the expense charged to the contractor.

4. In the event of any unnecessary delay or failure of the contractors to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

5. Contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the proper form; and on production thereof, properly vouched and completed, to the Civil Commissary General, or Assistant Civil Commissary of the district, for examination, it will be forwarded to the Audit Office, and payment will be made through the Colonial Treasury.

6. The value of all packages to be included in the prices demanded.

7. Security in one-third of the estimated value of entire supply will be required for the due fulfilment of the contract. No tender can be attended to unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible parties proposed as security, stating they are willing to become bound as securities for the contractor accordingly, and the bonds must be executed within twenty days from the day of acceptance of the tender being notified, failing of which the contracts will be again advertised or another tender accepted.

8. Tenders are required to have attached to them the signatures of the party or parties willing to supply the Government with the articles enumerated, as also the names of the persons proposed as sureties for the due fulfilment of their contracts, stating fully the addresses or residence.
