PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES.

EAST COLLINGWOOD.

N pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by Three hundred and fifty-eight householders, resident in the municipal district of East Collingwood, in the County of Bourke.

By His Excellency's Command, WILLIAM C. HAINES.

The Petititioners state that they feel convinced that the boundaries which have been proclaimed for the Municipality of East Collingwood will be inadequate for the wants of that locality, and pray as follows:—

"In accordance therefore with clause 2 of the Municipal Act, 'wherefore it shall be lawful for your Excellency, with advice of the Executive Council, to vary and alter the boundaries of any proclaimed locality,' your Petitioners would therefore pray that your Excellency, with advice aforesaid, will be pleased to annex to the boundaries of East Collingwood the following portions of unoccupied lands:—Commencing at the junction of Smith-street and Reilley-street, bearing north to the southern boundary line of portion 90, or Westgarth-street; thence to the Merri Creek, along the Creek to the boundary of the Township of Northcote, along the western and southern boundaries of the said township, and continuing the southern boundary to the Merri Creek; thence by the Merri Creek to a point in a line with the northern boundary line of the land sold and known as the Quarry Allotments; then westerly by the northern line of the said allotments unto its junction with Hoddle-street; then No. 79.—August 17th, 1855.—1.

south by Hoddle-street to Reilley-street; then westerly on to the starting point.

1. Where commutation in money or mileage allowance is given in lieu of forage, the Officer receiving such commutation is required to provide a horse at his own expense in all cases.

2. All horses, the property of Government, except those fed upon forage supplied at the public expense, are to be sold, and the proceeds of the sale are to be paid into the Colonial Treasury.

HEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fourth day of April in the present year, an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for promoting the Public "Health in populous places in the Colony of "Victoria," was extended to the City of Melbourne, as comprised within the corporate limits thereof as then constituted; And whereas it is expedient to except out of the said limits the Municipal District of Emerald Hill: Now I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the City of Melbourne, and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and appoint that the said Act shall extend to and be in force within the area comprised within the said limits of the said City of Melbourne, excepting thereout the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, the boundaries whereof are defined in my Proclamation of even date herewith.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO EMERALD HILL,

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency STR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act. passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislativo Council of the Colony of Victoria, in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An "Act for promoting the Public Health in "populous places in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district or place, in Victoria, as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the said Act shall apply to, and be in force

in, the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—Commencing at that point on the south bank of the Yarra Yarra River where it is intersected by the western side of Prince's Bridge; thence by the western side of the main Brighton Road to a point due west from the northern side of the street known as High Holborn-street, parish of Prahran; thence by a line bearing south 57 degrees west to a marked post 92 chains and 25 links more or less; thence by a line bearing south 26 degrees 15 minutes west 15 chains and 30 links more or less to the sea coast; thence by the sea coast to the western boundary of Dundas-street, Emerald Hill; thence by the western boundary of that street 16 chains more or less; thence by a line north 12 degrees east 56 chains more or less till it intersects the southern boundary of the Sandridge Road; thence by a line west 13 degrees north 16 chains more or less till it intersects the southern boundary of the land occupied by the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway; thence by that boundary to the Yarra Yarra River; thence by the south bank of that

river to the commencing point.

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria, No. 35, intituled, "An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of Streets, "Courts, and Alleys on private property within the Town of Geelong," it is amongst other things enacted, That where any street, court or alley, on private property, in the Town of Geelong, shall not be, or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Council of the said town; it shall be lawful for the said Council at any time and from time to time by any Orden under the hand of the Manner. for the said Council, at any time and from time to time, by any Order under the hand of the Mayor or Town Clerk of the said town, for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sowered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said Council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such street, court, or alley, on each side thereof, shall in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such Order, at their respective costs, charges and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, macadamize, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair, so much of the said street, court or alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to, and co-extensive with, their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts or alleys respectively; And whereas the streets, courts and alleys enumerated in the Schedule to this Order annexed, marked A., have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, to the satisfaction of the Council of the Town of Geelong: Be it now ordered by the Council of the said town, that the streets, courts and alleys enumerated in the Schedule to this Order annexed, marked A., shall, within ten days from the date of this Order coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, in such manner as is expressed in the Schedule to this Order annexed, marked B.; and it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts and alleys enumerated in the Schedule to this Order annexed, marked A., that if they, or any of them, shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamize, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair the street, court, or alley on which their tenements respectively adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this Order, then the Council of the said town will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts and alleys, and pave, flag, macadamize, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this Order, and will thereupon ascertain, determine and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate parts of the costs, charges and expenses thereof, according to, and co-extensive with, their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition of the pavement, flagging, macadamizing, levelling, drainage, and seworage in which such streets, courts, or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this Order.

### SCHELULE B. REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Specification of manner in which the Streets, Courts and Alleys enumerated in Schedule A., referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, in the Town of Geelong.

THE natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than one foot in one hundred and thirty-two, and, where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline. The transverse section of the right-of-way is to show a roadway whose crown shall not be more than three inches above the kerbs of the footway, and the fall from the crown to the water channels is to be at the rate of one foot in twenty-four feet.
