PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES.

EAST COLLINGWOOD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by Three hundred and fifty-eight householders, resident in the municipal district of East Collingwood, in the County of Bourke.

The Petitioners state that they feel convinced that the boundaries which have been proclaimed for the Municipality of East Collingwood will be inadequate for the wants of that locality, and pray as follows:—

“ In accordance therefore with clause 2 of the Municipal Act, ‘ wherefore it shall be lawful for your Excellency, with advice of the Executive Council, to vary and alter the boundaries of any proclaimed locality, ’ your Petitioners would therefore pray that your Excellency, with advice aforesaid, will be pleased to annex to the boundaries of East Collingwood the following portions of unoccupied lands:—Commencing at the junction of Smith-street and Reilley-street, bearing north to the southern boundary line of portion 90, or Westgarth-street; thence to the Merri Creek, along the Creek to the boundary of the Township of Northcote, along the western and southern boundaries of the said township, and continuing the southern boundary to the Merri Creek; thence by the Merri Creek to a point in a line with the northern boundary line of the land sold and known as the Quarry Allotments; then westerly by the northern line of the said allotments unto its junction with Hoddle-street; then

south by Hoddle-street to Reilley-street; then westerly on to the starting point.

FORAGE—SALE OF HORSES.

REGULATION.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulation:—

1. Where commutation in money or mileage allowance is given in lieu of forage, the Officer receiving such commutation is required to provide a horse at his own expense in all cases.

2. All horses, the property of Government, except those fed upon forage supplied at the public expense, are to be sold, and the proceeds of the sale are to be paid into the Colonial Treasury.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO
MELBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fourth day of April in the present year, an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*," was extended to the City of Melbourne, as comprised within the corporate limits thereof as then constituted; And whereas it is expedient to except out of the said limits the Municipal District of Emerald Hill: Now I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the City of Melbourne, and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and appoint that the said Act shall extend to and be in force within the area comprised within the said limits of the said City of Melbourne, excepting thereout the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, the boundaries whereof are defined in my Proclamation of even date herewith.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO EMERALD HILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district or place, in Victoria, as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the said Act shall apply to, and be in force

in, the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—Commencing at that point on the south bank of the Yarra Yarra River where it is intersected by the western side of Prince's Bridge; thence by the western side of the main Brighton Road to a point due west from the northern side of the street known as High Holborn-street, parish of Prahran; thence by a line bearing south 57 degrees west to a marked post 92 chains and 25 links more or less; thence by a line bearing south 26 degrees 15 minutes west 15 chains and 30 links more or less to the sea coast; thence by the sea coast to the western boundary of Dundas-street, Emerald Hill; thence by the western boundary of that street 16 chains more or less; thence by a line north 12 degrees east 56 chains more or less till it intersects the southern boundary of the Sandridge Road; thence by a line west 13 degrees north 16 chains more or less till it intersects the southern boundary of the land occupied by the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway; thence by that boundary to the Yarra Yarra River; thence by the south bank of that river to the commencing point.

SCHEDULE B. REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Specification of manner in which the Streets, Courts and Alleys enumerated in Schedule A., referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, in the Town of Geelong.

THE natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than one foot in one hundred and thirty-two, and, where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline. The transverse section of the right-of-way is to show a roadway whose crown shall not be more than three inches above the kerbs of the footway, and the fall from the crown to the water channels is to be at the rate of one foot in twenty-four feet. On either side of the roadway there is to be a water channel, two feet wide, consisting of three rows of bluestone pitchers eight inches deep and eight inches wide, made square on the ends with upright sides, set on sand and well rammed, so as to subside two inches; the bottom of the channel is to be six inches below the tops of the kerbs. On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than four feet wide, which is to be separated from the roadway by a hardwood plank, ten inches by three inches, set on edge, and fastened with five inch spikes to piles four inches by four inches, three feet long, driven into the ground not more than eight feet apart. These footways are to receive a coat of gravel three inches thick, having a slope towards the kerb of one foot in twelve feet. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of metal broken to two and a half inches in size, laid on six inches thick at the channels and nine inches thick at the crown; and this, when necessary, is to be covered with a binding of loam or sand one and a half inches thick. Wherever private entrances lead from the rights-of-way, they are to be paved the full width with bluestone pitchers in the same manner as the channels; the paving and kerb are to extend from the channel towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway. The whole work must be done to the satisfaction of the Town Surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.
