EMERALD HILL.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Vic-
toria, No. 15, the Lieutenant Governor,

3. Patterns of the books required or the forms to be ruled, must, in each case, be attached to or accompany the Requisition upon which they are asked for.

4. The thickness of books required is to be indicated by the number of quires or pages they are to contain, and the length and breadth of the page by inches.

5. In cases where portions of the *Government Gazette*, Acts of Council or Legislative Council Papers are missing, special authority must be obtained by the Officer making the Requisition from the Honorable the Colonial Secretary for the same to be replaced, as required by the third paragraph of the regulation of the 30th May, 1853, headed "*Government Gazette and Printing Office*."

1. Collectors of Public Revenue in Melbourne to pay in, daily, into the Treasury, the amount collected by them, previous to the hour of Two P.M.
2. Collectors of Public Revenue in the country to make similar payments (into the Treasury or Sub-Treasury, as the case may be) weekly, instead of monthly, as at present.
3. The usual vouchers, shewing the head under which each payment is to be credited, must continue to accompany every payment into the Treasury.
4. In the event of a country collection in any instance amounting to a sum not less than 1000*l.*, it must at once be remitted, although the usual period for remitting should not have arrived.
5. But as, in many cases, the collections of the Clerks of Petty Sessions do not amount to above a few pounds in the course of the month, His Excellency directs that such collections, when under 100*l.*, need not be paid in until, as at present, the end of the month.
