CONDITIONS.

The article supplied to be good sound sweet oaten hay, and to be delivered monthly, or as may be required by the Officer in charge of the Station, or if preferred in such quantities as there may be sufficient storage accommodation available at the Station for its protection.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the party receiving the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a Board of Survey, according to the practice of the service. But in country districts, where a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

If the board, arbitrators or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured by the party requiring it, and the expense charged to the contractor.

In the event of any unnecessary delay or failure of the contractors to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and

charged in like manner.
