PETITION: FOR ALTERATION OF MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES.

EAST COLLINGWOOD.

No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by Three hundred and fifty-eight householders, resident in the municipal district of East Collingwood, in the County of Bourke.

The Petititioners state that they feel convinced. that the boundaries which have been proclaimed for the Municipality of East Collingwood will be inadequate for the wants of that locality, and pray as follows:—

"In accordance therefore with clause 2 of the Municipal Act, 'wherefore it shall be lawful for your Excellency, with advice of the Executive Council, to vary and alter the boundaries of any proclaimed locality, your Petitioners would therefore pray that your Excellency, with advice aforesaid, will be pleased to annex to the boundaries of East Collingwood the following portions of unoccupied lands:—Commencing at the junction of Smith-street and Reilley-street, bearing north to the southern boundary line of portion 90, or Westgarth-street; thence to the Merri Creek, along the Creek to the boundary of the Township of Northcote, along the western and southern boundaries of the said township, and continuing the southern boundary to the Merri Creek; thence by the Merri Creek to a point in a line with the northern boundary line of the land sold and known as the Quarry Allotments; then westerly by the northern line of the said allotments unto its junction with Hoddle-street; then No. 82.—August, 24th, 1855.—1.

south by Hoddle-street to Reilley-street; then westerly on to the starting point.

REGULATION.

TRADE BETWEEN SOUTH AUSTRALIA AND
VICTORIA BY WAY OF THE RIVER MURRAY.
IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of
the Executive Council, has been pleased to

approve and confirm the arrangements understated, which have been made with the Governments of New South Wales and South Australia, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, 17 Victoria, No. 17, section 20, viz. —

section 20, viz.:—

1. The duties, as authorised by the tariff of South Australia, will, in the first instance, be collected at a Custom House in South Australia, upon all goods intended for transit up the River Murray.

2. The Master of every ship trading on the River Murray, beyond the limits of the Province of South Australia, and carrying goods which would be liable to duty if landed in either of the Colonies of New South Wales or Victoria, will be required to enter. South Wales or Victoria, will be required to enter,

his ship outwards at the Goolwa, and before such ship depart deliver to the Collector or other proper snip depart denver to the Collector or other proper officer a content in writing, signed by him, shewing the destination of such ship, her name, country and tonnage, the port of registry, the name and country of the Master, the marks and numbers of the goods laden, and the names of the respective shippers and consigness, and shall make and subscribe a declaration to the truth of such content, as far as any of such particulars can be known to him; and upon the further declaration of the Master of such ship, made before the Collector or other proper officer, to the effect that such goods have been duly landed, as consigned, the Colonial Treasurer will be instructed to place to the credit of the Governments of New South Western Victoria South Wales or Victoria, as the case may be, the amount which would have been leviable as duties of Customs if the goods had been landed in the first instance at some port in either of those Colonies, to the extent that the duty collected on the said goods under the South Australian tariff will admit.

3. In other respects Masters of ships trading on the River Murray will be subject to the provisions of the Customs Regulations Acts of Victoria, 16 Vic., No. 23, 17 Vic., No. 17, 18 Vic., No. 29.
