Colonial Secretary's Office, Melbourne, 19th January, 1855 PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTI-TUTION.

EMERALD HILL.

N pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, the Lieutenaut Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by three hundred and eighty-seven householders, resident in the district commonly called and known as "Emerald Hill," South Melbourne,

in the County of Bourke, setting forth—
"That the Petitioners are all householders within the meaning of the said Act, are more than one hundred and fifty in number, and are all resident within an area not exceeding nine square miles, containing a population of more than three hundred householders.

than three nundred nousenoiders.

"That the locality generally known as Emerald Hill, within which the Petitioners reside, is a locality presently included within the corporate limits of the Corporation of the City of Melbourne.

"That your Petitioners are desirous that said

locality should cease to be a portion of, or to be or be deemed to be within, the corporate limits of the Corporation of the said City of Melbourne, and have resolved to avail themselves of the provisions of the Act partly above recited to have the same effected; and also to have the said district of Emerald Hill, with an area of nine square miles, constituted a Municipal District, governed by a Council, to be created a Body Corporate in manner, and with and under the several powers, provisions, and conditions prescribed by and contained in the said Act."
And praying His Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council,

"To cause the substance and prayer of this Petition to be published in the Government Gazette in terms of the Act partly above recited; and thereafter, and as soon as the provisions and terms of the said Act will permit—the consent of the Council of the Corporation of Melbourne being first had and obtained—to constitute, by proclamation, the locality generally No. 9.—JANUARY 26TH, 1855.—1.

known as Emerald Hill, with so much of the adjacent localities in the district as shall form an area of nine square miles, into a Municipal District by name, in such proclamation to be declared; and also by the same, or any other proclamation, to define the limits and boundaries of such Municipal District, the same to be a Municipal District under and in terms of, and having a Council created a Body Corporate, for the purposes and with the powers contained in. the Act above described.'

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

THE Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to order the sarrouth Clark to order the seventh Clause of the Govern-ment Regulations of the 1st May, 1853, regarding Public Accounts, to be cancelled, and the annexed Rules substituted instead thereof.

RULES.

1. Collectors of Public Revenue in Melbourne to pay in, daily, into the Treasury, the amount collected by them, previous to the hour of Two P.M.

2. Collectors of Public Revenue in the country

to make similar payments (into the Treasury or Sub-Treasury, as the case may be) weekly, in-

stead of monthly, as at present.

3. The usual vouchers, shewing the head under which each payment is to be credited, must continue to accompany every payment into the

Treasury.

4. In the event of a country collection in any instance amounting to a sum not less than 1000i it must at once be remitted, although the usual period for remitting should not have arrived.

5. But as, in many cases, the collections of the Clerks of Petty Sessions do not amount to above a few pounds in the course of the month, His Excellency directs that such collections, when under 1001., need not be paid in until, as at present, the end of the month.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, in the eighth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An "Act to amend an Act passed in the sixth "year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, "intituled, 'An Act to incorporate the Inhabi-"tants of the Town of Melbourne,'" it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, upon petition from the Council of the Town of Melbourne, to increase from time to time the number of Wards within the said Town, by Proclamation, published in one or more of the Melbourne newspapers, and every additional Ward so appointed should have the same rights, privileges and immunities as any of the other Wards within the said Town; And whereas the Right Worship ful the Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the City of Melbourne have presented to the Lieutenant Governor a petition praying His Excellency to cause the portion of the said City lying northward of Victoria-street, commonly called and known as North Melbourne, to be proclaimed a separate Ward of the said City, under the name and style of "Hotham Ward;" And whereas the burgesses and citizens of North Melbourne have presented to the said Mayor a memorial numerously signed, expressing their concurrence in the prayer of the said petition: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, in virtue of the authority vested in me by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation appoint and direct that all that portion of the City of Melbourne bounded by a line commencing at the centre of Elizabeth-street at its junction with the north side of Victoria-street, thence in a north westerly direction along the centre of Elizabeth-street to the junction of the Sydney and Flemington roads 30 chains 50 links, thence along the western side of the Sydney road to the northern town boundary line 132 chains 50 links, thence westerly along the said line to the Moonee Ponds 96 chains, thence southerly along the said Ponds to the town boundary post on the western town boundary line 97 chains 50 links, thence along the said western boundary line south 92 chains 50 links to the prolongation of the northern side of Victoria-street, thence along Victoria-street easterly 98 chains to the point of commencement, shall be a separate Ward of the said City, by the name, style and title of "Hotham Ward."
