N pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred

and sixty-one landowners and householders of the Town of Warrnambool, in the County of Villiers.

The Petitioners state that they are anxious to avail themselves of the provisions of the " Municipal Institutions Act," believing that it will be of benefit to the Town by giving the Inhabitants the power to a certain extent of governing themselves; and pray as follows:—
