PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor from time to time to proclaim by notice in the *Government Gazette* the

Roads in the said Colony which should be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said Colony, do hereby proclaim and direct, in pursuance of the said Act, that the line of road hereinafter described, leading from the site reserved for the Township of Broadford, in the County of Dalhousie, to the Creek commonly called or known by the name of the Muddy Creek, being part of the Upper Goulburn Road, in the said Colony, shall be and be deemed a Main Road, within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of the Broadford Reserve, being the centre of the Government Road of 150 links wide, and bearing eastward to the junction of the present roads from Kilmore and Seymour to the Upper Goulburn, and following the said road to the Upper Goulburn in a south-eastwardly and eastwardly direction to the ford at the Reedy Creek; thence south-eastwardly, crossing the range dividing the waters of Reedy and King Parrot Creeks; thence along the south side of the Queen Parrot Creek, crossing the said creek near its junction with the King Parrot Creek; thence along the west side of the King Parrot Creek, crossing the said creek at the south-east corner of J. Murchison's pre-emptive grant at Kerrisdale; thence along the east side of the said creek in a northwardly direction to the ford below the site of the middle Bridge; again crossing the King Parrot Creek, and continuing in the same direction to a ford about two and a quarter miles lower down; crossing the creek, and bearing north-eastwardly and eastwardly to the junction of this road with the road to the Muddy Creek and Upper Goulburn, *via* Tallarook, near Mr. Cotton's pre-emptive grant at Doogalook; thence passing along the south side of said grant, and continuing in a south-eastwardly direction to the bridge over the Muddy Creek.
