LOCAL COURT DISTRICTS OF CRESWICK AND BALLAARAT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by two several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the fourth day of February, and the twenty-second day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, it was declared and appointed that the Districts therein named should be Local Court Districts, within the meaning of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "An Act to amend the Laws relating to the Gold Fields," and amongst other things the boundaries of the Local Court Districts of Creswick and Ballaarat were in the said Proclamations defined: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to alter the said Local Court Districts of Creswick and Ballaarat: Now therefore I, Major General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, revoke so much of the said Proclamations as defines the boundaries of the said Local Court Districts of Creswick and Ballaarat, and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby declare and appoint that the boundaries hereinafter described shall be the boundaries of the Local Court Districts of Creswick and Ballaarat respectively, that is to say:—

DISTRICT OF CRESWICK.—Commencing at the source of the Mount Greenock Creek; thence by the Mount Greenock Creek northerly to its junction with the Dry Creek; thence by a line bearing east to the junction of the Tullaroop and Bullarook Creeks; thence by the Bullarook Creek to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence westward by the Great Dividing Range, including the "Sulky Gully Diggings," to the source of the Mount Greenock Creek, the commencing point aforesaid. And the said district shall be called "The Local Court District of Creswick."

DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT.—Commencing at the source of Emu Creek in the Great Dividing Range, thence eastward by the Great Dividing Range, excluding the "Sulky Gully Diggings," to the most eastward source of the River Moorabool; thence southward by the main range dividing the Rivers Moorabool and Werribee to the northern boundary of the Local Court District of Steiglitz; thence by that boundary line to the River Moorabool; thence southward by the River Moorabool to a point due east of the junction of the Woody Yaloak and the Naringhil Creek; thence west by that line to the said junction; thence by a line north-westerly to the Gnarket Ponds; thence by the Gnarket Ponds and a line north to Emu Creek; and thence by Emu Creek to the Great Dividing Range, being the commencing point aforesaid. PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas a treaty of peace and friendship has been signed between Her Majesty and Her Allies, and the Emperor of all the Russias, it is this day ordered by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the Order made by Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the 29th day of March, 1854, by which it is directed "that no ships or vessels belonging to any of Her Majesty's subjects be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the ports of Russia until further order, and that a general embargo or stop be made of all Russian ships and vessels whatsoever now within or which shall hereafter come into any of the ports, harbors, or roads within any of Her Majesty's dominions, together with all persons and effects on board the said ships or vessels," and such parts of any other Orders in Council as prohibit trade with Russia, be henceforth revoked and discharged.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLAARAT, FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING THE 16TH JULY, 1856. MADE PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT, 18TH VICTORIA, No. 15, SECTION 43.

FORMATION OF MUNICIPALITY.

THE District of Ballaarat was duly constituted a Municipality by a Proclamation of His late Excellency, Sir Charles Hotham, on the seventeenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and a public meeting of the resident householders and landowners within the said district was convened on the 14th day of January, 1856, for the purposes prescribed in the Municipal Institutions Act. His late Excellency appointed James Alexander Douglas, Esq., to preside at such meeting.

The meeting elected Messrs. Jabez Job Ham and John Thomas Frederick Bowker to act as assessors. It was decided the Council should consist of seven members, and should not receive pecuniary remuneration; to be elected by voting cards. The following are the names of the resident rate-payers, members of the Council, namely—Messrs James Oddie, Robert Muir, James Stewart, M.D., William Tulloch, Alexander Binney Ranken, John Smith Carver, and Patrick Bolger.

At the first meeting of Council, on Wednesday, the 17th day of January, James Oddie, Esq., was elected Chairman of the Council.

BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 1, section A, parish of Ballaarat; thence by a line bearing one mile twenty-two chains and eight links to a marked post; thence by a line bearing south to the River Yarrowee; thence by the River Yarrowee to the southern boundary of the Township of Ballaarat; thence by the said southern boundary and a line bearing west one mile and ten chains to a marked post; thence by a line bearing north one mile four chains and forty links to the western boundary of the Police Paddock; thence by the western and northern boundary lines of the said Police Paddock to the north-west angle of allotment 2 of section C, in the parish of Ballaarat aforesaid; and thence by a line bearing east, being the south side of a Government road, to the commencing point aforesaid.

Valuators—Messrs. Benson and Nicol, 31st January, 1856. According to the valuator's return of the assessable property within the district, there are 364 assessments, 297 vacant land, and 267 tenements—the whole valued at £40,060.

The Council appointed the following permanent committees, viz. :—

The Public Works, Legislative, Finance, and Market Committee.

Public works completed and in progress :—

1. The Council accepted the tender of Messrs. Doane and Ringrose for the erection of council chambers and small cottage attached—and from Messrs. Dent and Southward, a tender for seats for the large room, which has been found of great service for public meetings, and the Council anticipate a revenue from letting the room for religious and other services.

2. The tender of Messrs. Martin and Scott, for the formation of Lydiard, Armstrong, part of Dana and Mair-streets, was accepted by the Council on the 23rd day of April, 1856, which should have been finished by the 31st July. The Council anticipate, from arrangements since made with the contractors, that the work will soon be satisfactorily completed.

3. The temporary repairs to the bridge across the creek, on the road to the manure depot. (Completed.)

4. The erection of a dam at the outlet of Yuille's Swamp, to preserve an additional supply of water for the summer months. (Completed.)

5. Cutting a drain on the north side of Sturt-street, to render passable, if possible, one side of the street. (Completed.)

6. Water supply.—The attention of the Council, from its first establishment, to the importance of maintaining the water pure, from whence the inhabitants of Ballaarat are supplied, and to prevent any nuisance which would in any way tend to the pollution of the water in Yuille's Swamp, has had every consideration of the Council, and to carry effectually this matter fully out, the application was made to have a road reserved round Yuille's Swamp, and the Bye-Law No. 3 was drawn up.

The Council have also a scheme to bring the water from Yuille's Swamp to the township of Ballaarat, by means of iron pipes; for this purpose a report has been drawn up and submitted to the Government, and an application made for the money required for the undertaking to be advanced to the Municipal Council of Ballaarat.

LEGISLATIVE.

The following Bye-laws have been drawn up and sanctioned by His Excellency the Acting Lieutenant Governor :—

1. A Bye-law to regulate the proceedings of Council by means of standing orders.

2. A Bye-law to regulate the deposit of night soil, offal, and other offensive refuse.

3. A Bye-law for the prevention of the nuisance occasioned by persons throwing the carcasses of animals, rubbish or offensive matter whatsoever into the waters of the Swamp.

4. A Bye-law for the appropriation of the money received from Government (not yet proclaimed).

5. A Bye-law to provide for the cleansing of the footways and water channels.

6. A Bye-law to prevent the nuisance arising from suffering cattle to be at large in the streets and other unenclosed places within the Municipal district.

The following Acts of Legislative Council have been extended to the Municipality of Ballaarat :—

"The Dog Nuisance Act," 6 William IV, No. 4.—17th July, 1856.

"The Public Health Act," 18 Victoria, No. 13.—17th July, 1856.

FINANCE.

The Council have received from Government the first moiety of the Grant voted by the Legislative Council, £3750.

The Council struck a rate of two pounds ten shillings, for the first six months, on all the property assessed, but the Government refused their assent thereto, and in consequence a rate of one shilling in the pound for the whole year was levied on the 6th day of June, and assented to by His Excellency on the 30th day of June.

The Court of appeals against the valuations of the assessable property was held at the Petty Sessions in April. The cases of appeals amounted to seventy, and the reductions made were considerable.

The Market Committee recommended the present camp reserve to be applied for as a market place, in the event of the camp being removed, but for present purposes recommended an application should be made for a reserve north of the Post-office, Mair-street.

7. For road to be reserved round Yuille's Swamp.—Granted, with the exception of that part belonging to the Police Paddock.
8. For the removal of the wooden buildings built on the road at the junction of Lydiard-street and Sturt-street.—Promised.
9. The construction of a bridge across the creek Yarrowee, and the formation of a road to unite Golden Point with the township.—Under consideration.
10. For land for public gardens.—Not yet granted.
11. For the formation of Sturt-street.—Postponed for more favorable weather.

The cause of the Chairman's absence from the Council Meetings was in consequence of attending to the appeal cases, and waiting on the Honorable Surveyor General, in Melbourne.

A special committee was appointed to supply an appropriate design for Municipal Seal. A sketch was supplied by Mr. Robertson, which has been amended and improved on submitting it to the Honorable Chief Secretary.

The Municipal Council rely with confidence on the co-operation of the rate-payers to carry out the necessary improvements and sanitary regulations to establish the Township and district of Ballaarat.
