SANDHURST.

REGULATION made by the Local Court of the District of Sandhurst :—

No. viii. *Invasion of Claims.*—"No claim can be jumped under the Miner's Right (if objected to by the owner) without the special authority of the Warden, and any person or persons being the holders of the Miner's Right, shall have liberty at any time to leave their claims for the space of forty-eight hours, instead of twenty-four hours as at present."

LOCAL COURT REGULATION.

BALLAARAT.
REGULATION made by the Local Court of the District of Ballarat:—
No. viii. *Abolition of Shepherding*.—"After the words, *at once proceed to sink*, in Rule iii. of the Ballarat Local Court Rules, such Rule shall be altered to read as follows:—
"At the end of the month's notice, should the regulation not be complied with, the claim shall be considered as jumped or forfeited, if not regularly worked, upon the Warden of the District visiting it and declaring it to be so liable. And in every case of jumping, the parties intending to obtain the ground shall procure the presence of the Warden, and his sanction before taking possession.
"Regularly worked implies being worked by the full number of men day and night."

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, it was among other things declared and appointed that a County Court for the district of Bourke should be held on the fifth of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and all subsequent years until otherwise ordered; And whereas it is expedient to alter the day so appointed for the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and the Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, by virtue of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby appoint that the County Court of Bourke shall be holden on the fourth day of February, instead of the fifth day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and on the fifth day of February in all subsequent years, as in the said Proclamation mentioned.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency MAJOR-GENERAL MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "*An Act to make provision for the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors, and of Refreshments, in certain Districts*," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said Colony to be a District, subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such District: Now I, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the said Colony, do, by this my Proclamation, declare the following part or portion of the said Colony to be a Special Licensing District, under the provisions of the said Act, the boundaries whereof are hereby defined as follow, that is to say:—

Commencing at the junction of Arthur's Creek and Sugar Loaf Creek, thence by a line bearing east to View Hill Creek; thence by View Hill Creek southwards to the River Yarra Yarra; thence by the River Yarra Yarra to the north-east angle of the parish of Yering; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said parish of Yering to the parish of Warrandyte; thence by the eastern, southern and south-western boundaries of the said parish of Warrandyte to the north-western angle of section 17; thence by a line northerly, crossing the River Yarra Yarra, to the commencing point aforesaid.
