MARINERS are hereby informed that a Floating Lightship has been moored in three (3) fathoms at the south end of the West Channel, in the position hitherto occupied by the Swan Spit Black Buoy, which latter has been removed.

The above Lightship has one (1) mast surmounted with a ball, which, with the hull, is painted red, having "Swan Spit" marked in white letters on both sides, and will exhibit on and after this date, from sunset to sunrise, a single fixed light of the natural color, visible in ordinary weather eight (8) miles.

The following bearings were taken from on board the Lightship at slack water:—

Upper Lighthouse, Shortland's Bluff, S. 56 W.
 Royal George Fairway Buoy (white), S. 37 W.
 Swan Spit (white) Beacon, N. 83 W.

In the event of the Lightship parting her cables, or drifting from her present position, the light will be discontinued, and two ordinary signal lanterns, colored red, hoisted by night, one on the forestay, the other on the signal staff aft, and a blue flag hoisted by day over the ball, until the vessel has been re-moored.

To prevent any mistakes being made by vessels entering the West Channel at night from the northward, the upper light on Shortland's Bluff has been darkened from N.E. by E., round northerly to W. by N., and the lamps so extinguished transferred to seaward, which will increase the power of the light in that direction.

ALTERATIONS IN BUOYS AND BEACONS, WEST CHANNEL.

The depth of water on the two (2) knolls above the Swan Spit having increased to sixteen (16) feet, the two (2) chequered buoys which were moored over them have been removed, and the position of the knolls indicated by four (4) beacons, two (2) on the extreme part of Swan Point, bearing from each other S. 49 W., N. 49 E., the lower one (1) painted black, upper one red, and two square headed beacons placed opposite the knolls, bearing from each other S. 68 E., N. 68 W., the westernmost painted black, the easternmost red.

Vessels desirous of passing to the eastward of the knolls will clear them by keeping the black beacon on Swan Point a little open to the eastward of the red beacon until the two (2) Williamsand beacons have been brought in one, and opened out a sail's breadth north or south of each other, according as the vessel may be bound up or down the channel.

Vessels desirous of passing to the westward of the knolls will clear them by keeping the black beacon on Swan Point half a sail's breadth open to the westward of the red one, until the two Williamsand beacons have been brought in one and opened out a sail's length north or south of each other, according as the vessel may be bound up or down channel.

The white fairway buoy below Swan Spit and the white buoy on the N.W. elbow of Williamsand have been removed, and replaced with larger ones of the same color, each surmounted with a staff and ball colored white.

The other three white cask buoys on Williamsand have also been removed, and replaced by large cone buoys of the same color, and an additional white cone buoy placed midway between the N.W. elbow buoy and the northernmost white buoy on Williamsand.

The black cask buoy moored off Swan Bay has also been removed, and replaced by a large cone buoy of the same color.

The depths are at low water spring-tides, bearings by compass.

MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

FIRST HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF WARRNAMBOOL MADE PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS' ACT, 18 VICTORIA, No. 15.—ADOPTED BY COUNCIL 13TH AUGUST, 1856.

ORGANISATION.

THE township of Warrnambool was constituted a municipal district by His late Excellency Sir Charles Hotham, by a Proclamation dated the 6th of December, 1855.

The following is the area of the municipal district.

A public meeting of the resident householders and of the landowners within the municipal district was held at the Court House, Warrnambool, on the 2nd of January last, in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Institutions' Act, Daniel Joseph Tierney, Esq., M.D. having been duly appointed Chairman. The meeting elected Messrs. William Osborne Allan and Lovel Byass to act as assessors, and decided that the Council should consist of seven members who should not receive pecuniary consideration. A poll was held the next day, when the following resident ratepayers were elected members of the Council, namely: James Coulstock, William Bateman, junior, John Macdonald, Samuel MacGregor, John Elliott, George Bostock, and James Hayes.

The first meeting of Council was held on the 9th of January last, when Councillor Samuel MacGregor was elected Chairman for the current year.

The provisions of the management of Towns Act, 18 Victoria No. 14, sections 5 to 10 inclusive, had been extended to the town by a Proclamation dated the 4th of June, and gazetted on the 5th of June, 1855.

The Council accepted the tender of Mr. James Hider for the valuation of property within the municipality for assessment, and the preparation of the ratepayers' roll. The result was 606 assessments of the aggregate annual value of £20,774. A Court of Revision was held at the Council Chamber on the 23rd of April last, but the appeals against the assessment were few in number, and the reduction of the assessment was inconsiderable in amount.

The following officers were appointed at the dates affixed to their respective names.

Town Clerk—Mr. Alfred Meredith Jukes, 10th January, 1856.

Engineer—Mr. Hughbert Baker, 30th January, 1856.

Honorary Treasurer—Mr. Samuel Hannaford, manager of the Bank of Australasia, Warrnambool, 27th February, 1856.

Inspector of Slaughter Houses, Weights and Measures, and Nuisances—Mr Alfred South, sergeant-major Mounted Police, 26th March, 1856.

Rate Collector—Mr. James Hider, 23rd April, 1856.

The Council not being satisfied with the engineer, passed a resolution on the 30th of April last, that his services should be dispensed with at the expiration of one month from that date, and called for applications for the office thus vacated. The Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works having courteously consented, at the request of the Council, to make a selection from the candidates for the office, selected Mr. Andrew Kerr, late of the City Surveyor's Office, Melbourne, whose appointment as town surveyor was formally confirmed by the Council on the 9th of July last.

The Council, on the 30th of January last, passed a Bye-law for regulating their proceedings by standing orders, which was assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government on the 19th of February last, and gazetted the same day.

The Council at first met, through the courtesy of the Resident Magistrate, at the Court House, Warrnambool: they subsequently removed to offices in Liebeg-street, and have lately taken more eligible premises in Timor-street.

The Council have procured a common seal, the design and motto of which were approved of by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

The Council have made the following applications to the Government, with the results mentioned:—

Control over Town Reserve: not granted, the Government having no power to give the control in question, but a modification of the laws contemplated resting such control in municipal authorities generally.

Copy of *Government Gazette* from commencement of present year: granted.

To set out breadth of carriage and footways: will be complied with as soon as streets proclaimed.

Grant of an acre of land in section 4, Warrnambool, as a site for a Town Hall: complied with.

Control and supervision of jetty: under consideration.

Map of Township: granted.

Additional police force: under consideration.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Before proceeding to the formation of the streets, the Council considered it advisable that the streets and roads within the township should be cleared of trees and stumps. This work is now nearly accomplished.

A great improvement has also been effected in Timor-street by levelling a portion of the street, a hill opposite the Court House having been cut down and a part of the street filled up which was previously under water during the rainy season.

FINANCE.

The Council decided, on the 11th of April last, that the rate on the assessment for the current year should be One shilling in the pound; the greater portion of which rate has now been collected.

The sum of £4000 was granted to the municipality by the legislature out of the general revenue for the year 1856, and a moiety of this sum has been received.

The Council were indebted to the Bank of Australasia for payment of their current liabilities until they were in funds; the bank having authorised them to open an account and to draw cheques to the amount of £500.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

STATEMENT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL FOR THE DISTRICT, FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDING ON THE 5TH AUGUST, 1856.

THE Council held their first meeting on the 5th February, 1856, when Mr. Thomas Must was elected chairman. A convenient place for the meetings of the Council being necessary, application was made to the Government for the use of one of the unoccupied rooms in the building used for the Government Offices, which was granted, and a convenient set of rooms placed at the disposal of the Council. The attention of the Council was at an early period directed to the necessity of procuring from the general revenue an annual grant for the improvement of the municipality; the sum of £4000 was voted for this purpose, of which £2000 have been received. The assessment of all rateable property within the town, and the preparation of the Ratepayers' Roll, was proceeded with as early as practicable. The assessment shows a gross rateable value of about £30,000, and the number of ratepayers on the roll amounts to 458. To enable the Council to defray their current expenditure before the Government grant could be received and a rate collected, a cash credit was opened with the Bank of Australasia on the personal responsibility of the members of the Council. It being the opinion of the Council that the most important duty devolving upon them was the repairing the public streets of Portland, which had hitherto been almost totally neglected, contracts were entered into for the supply of a large quantity of road metal, which was accordingly carted into town during the short interval of dry weather intervening between the appointment of the Council and the setting in of the wet season, and broken at leisure. This step was the means of furnishing employment to a considerable number of laborers who happened at that time to be out of employ, and has placed the Council in a position to take immediate advantage of the spring when it arrives by doing as much towards the improvement of the streets as the limited fund at the command of the Council will admit of. As the sanction of the Governor is required to the mode of expending all money obtained from the general revenue, a Bye-law was passed authorising the expenditure of the £4000 voted to the Council in repairing the principal streets in the town. In pursuance of the power vested in the Council for that purpose, the following officers were appointed, at the salaries specified, viz.:—

Clerk to the Council, salary	£200 per annum.
Surveyor	150 "
Rate Collector	150 "

The following are the improvements in the streets which have been made since the election of the Council, viz.:—

Levelling and metalling the road from the Jetty to Bentinck-street.

Repairing a portion of Bentinck-street which had been metalled about two years previously.

Laying down three inverts, and repairing dangerous portions of Percy-street.

Clearing the water-courses at the sides of several of the streets, so as to prevent the water from flowing across the streets.

Forming a temporary wooden bridge across a creek in Otway-street, so as to render it passable for drays.

Forming an embankment at the south end of Bentinck-street across a water-hole in the middle of the road, and cutting down the hill above preparatory to metalling.

On the 29th April a rate of one shilling in the pound was struck, and a Bye-law, authorising its collection, was subsequently passed, and approved by the Acting Governor, and the rate is now in the course of collection. There have been various communications with the Commissioner of Public Works, with reference to the expenditure of the sum of £12,000 voted for Public Works, not under the control of the municipality, and as to which the opinion of the Council was requested; they accordingly recommended that that sum should be expended in the erection of a new Jetty and Gauging Shed at the end of Julia-street, the erection of a Post Office on the Crown Reserve

in Bentinck-street, adjoining the Custom House, the enlargement of the Gaol and Lock-up House; but none of these works have as yet been commenced.* The surveyor appointed by the Council, soon after their election, not having given satisfaction to the Council, he was, on the 15th July, suspended, and he subsequently tendered his resignation, which was accepted, and the office is now vacant. The question of a permanent endowment of the municipality, out of the general revenue of the Colony, and other questions mooted by the different Municipal Councils in the Colony, have been under the consideration of the Council, and Mr. Browning, one of the members of the Council, was appointed to represent them at a proposed meeting of delegates which was afterwards held at Melbourne on the 4th August, and which was attended by Mr. Browning. The following applications have been made to the Government, and complied with:—

The supply of the *Government Gazette* for the use of the Council.

The increase of the grant for an endowment for the current year.

The surveying and marking out the road leading from the jetty to Bentinck-street, and a road from the east end of Gawler-street along the cliff to Hoddle-street.

The following applications have not been complied with:—

The supply of a copy of the Votes and Proceedings of the Legislative Council for the use of the Municipal Council.

The supply of a map of the Municipal District for the use of the Council.

An application that the reserved lands between Bentinck-street and the sea, north of Gawler-street, should be placed under the control of the Council, was met by a reply from the Surveyor General that the lands in question would be reserved for the present.

An application was also made that contractors for public works in Portland might be permitted to quarry stones on Crown lands without paying a license fee; this was not conceded, but it was intimated to the Council that if they wished it portions of land in the suburbs might be set apart for quarrying stones for public purposes, and the District Surveyor has been instructed to mark out such reserves.
