PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General Magaritum, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and
Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in
the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled,
"An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of
"Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that it
should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to
time, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim and
declare any such portion of the said Colony as to him should
seem meet, as and to be a Road District for the purposes in the
said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every
Road District thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a
specific name or designation to every such Road District;
Now therefore I, Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military
Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, special name or designation to every such Road District: Now therefore I, Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the undermentioned portion of the county of Grant in the said Colony shall be a Road District, that is to say:—Commencing at the north-east corner of the parish of Duneed at a stake on the south side of the Waurn chain of ponds; bounded on the west by the parish boundary line bearing south four hundred and fifty-four chains eighty-nine links to Thomson's Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the sea coast; by the Barwon River; by the Barwon River, the southern and part of the eastern shores of Lake Conewarre; and again by the Barwon River north-westerly to the junction of the Waurn chain of ponds; and by the said ponds south-westerly to the point of commencement:

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific news are declared to the sea coast.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such Road District shall be "The Conewarre Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Scal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-siz, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
