IN pursuance of the provisions of the first clause of an Act passed in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "*An Act for the Protection and Management of Wharfs*" (Act 17 Victoria, No. 27), His Excellency the Senior Military Officer in Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following rules and regulations for the protection, preservation, and good management of the Public Wharfs at Melbourne.

### Regulations for the Protection and Management of the Public Wharfs at Melbourne.

1. In the event of any goods which may be landed on any of the public wharfs being allowed to remain on such wharf more than twenty-four hours, notice will be served on the owner or consignee of such goods, and if they are not removed within three days from the date of such notice, the goods will be taken by the wharfinger to the Customs Reserve, or some place duly appointed for that purpose, and there dealt with according to the second section of the above recited Act.

2. Importers and others landing timber from vessels in the river will be allowed, upon making application to the wharfinger, to use such portion of land as he may allot to them upon the vacant block between the storing yard allotments and the footpath, for the purpose only of arranging and assorting their timber, and for a period not exceeding seven days.

3. Any timber not removed within the above mentioned time will be conveyed to the Customs Reserve, and there dealt with in accordance with the provisions of the section and Act above recited.

4. All retail trade in timber on the wharfs or wharf land is forbidden.

# PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

## WILLIAMSTOWN.

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said Colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a Road District for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every Road District thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such Road District: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the undermentioned portion of the said Colony to be a Road District, and that the boundaries of such Road District shall be as follow, viz.:-Commencing at a point on the sea coast forty chains east of the mouth of the Fitzroy River; thence northwards by the western boundary of Peyton and Mowbray's run to the run occupied by T. A. Brown; thence by part of the southern and by the western boundaries of the said run to the run occupied by R. and W. Jamieson; thence by the south-western and by the western boundaries of the runs occupied by R. and W. Jamieson, Samuel McGregor, John McKellar, and James Whyte, respectively, to the northern boundary of the said James Whyte's run; thence by the said northern boundary and by the northern boundary of John Mooney's run to Henry Phillip's run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of the said H. Phillip's run to John Toomey's run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the eastern boundary of the County of Normanby; thence by the eastern boundary of the said County to the County of Dundas; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of the said County of Dundas to the County of Follett; thence by the northern and western boundaries of the said County of Follett to the sea coast; and thence by the sea coast easterly to the aforesaid

tioned point of commencement, except that portion of the County of Normanby included within the Municipal District of Portland: And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that such Road District shall be called and known by the name of "The Portland Road District."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said Colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a Road District for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every Road District thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such Road District, and from time to time to revoke any such Proclamation, and vary and alter the boundary of any such District as might be necessary and advisable: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Lieutenant Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, "The Belfast Road District" was proclaimed and the boundaries thereof were defined: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the said Road District: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said "Belfast Road District:" And I do hereby proclaim and declare, that the undermentioned boundaries shall henceforth be the boundaries of the said Belfast Road District, that is to say:—Commencing at a point on the sea coast forty chains east of the mouth of the Fitzroy River; thence northwards by the western boundary of Peyton and Mowbray's run to the run occupied by T. A. Brown; thence by part of the southern and by the western boundaries of the said run to the run occupied by R. and W. Jamieson; thence by the south-western and by the western boundaries of the runs occupied by R. and W. Jamieson, Samuel McGregor, John McKellar, and James Whyte, respectively, to the northern boundary of the said James Whyte's run; thence by the said northern boundary and by the northern boundary of John Mooney's run to Henry Phillip's run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of the said Henry Phillip's run to John Toomey's run; thence by the northern boundary of the run occupied by the said John Toomey to the Agricultural Reserve at Mount Rouse; thence by part of the western and by the northern boundary of the said reserve to the run occupied by James Ritchie; thence east by the northern boundary of James Ritchie's run; thence southwards by the eastern boundaries of the runs occupied by James Ritchie, Henry Goltreux, P. and G. Macarthur, Robert Whitehead, J. Ware, and William Lindsey, respectively, to the Town Reserve of Woolsthorpe; thence by the eastern boundary line of the said reserve and a line south-westerly to the north-west angle of portion G, parish of Yarpark; thence by a line bearing south to portion 20 in the said parish; thence by part of the northern and western boundaries of the said portion to the Yangery Creek; thence by the Yangery Creek southwards to a bridge on the Woodford Road; thence by that road westerly 74 chains and 25 links, more or less; thence by a road due south to Rutledge's Special Survey; thence by the northern boundary of the said Special Survey and by the boundary between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane and a line south to the sea coast; and thence westerly by the sea coast to the aforesaid point of commencement.

## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, OF EMERALD HILL.

STATEMENT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR THE HALF YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER, 1855, UNDER CLAUSE 43 OF THE 18TH VICTORIA, No. 15.

THE District of Emerald Hill having been erected into a Municipality by virtue of the proclamation of His late Excellency Sir Charles Hotham, K.C.B., Governor of the Colony of Victoria, bearing date the 26th day of May, 1855, and made in pursuance of the provisions of the 18th Victoria, No. 15, on the 29th day of June last, Messrs. Albert Hancock, Peter McLean Ross, Charles Chessell, Henry South Gardner, James Service, Robert Stirling Anderson, and James O'Brien, were duly elected as the members of the first Council for the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, and on the 4th day of the following month Mr. James Service was chosen Chairman of the Council.

The first duties attended to by the Council in framing the necessary bye-laws for the proper regulation of their own proceedings, procuring the extension of the Health of Towns Act to the Municipality, taking measures for the accurate valuation of all rateable property within the Municipality, and arranging for the establishment of a Court of Petty Sessions in suitable premises within the District.

In consequence of a total want of funds the Council were unable for some time to effect any considerable improvements beyond procuring the removal of the filth and rubbish that during the two previous years had been accumulating to a very offensive extent upon the various reserves, streets and roadways, filling up the numerous holes and pitfalls then existing within the township, which improvements were however efficiently performed out of funds advanced in anticipation of the rates. - Public notice was also given to the inhabitants of the important provisions contained in the various Acts in force within the Municipality, and the inhabitants generally having seconded the wishes of the Council in that respect, the sanitary condition of the District has been much improved and is now in a state affording much satisfaction to the Council.

Shortly after the election of the Council a Town Clerk was appointed, and upon the completion of the valuation of the District an officer was appointed to perform the duties of Collector of rates, surveyor, and inspector of nuisances, since which latter appointment on the 18th of September last, the improvements contemplated by the Council have been carried on with considerable efficiency, under the supervision of the various Committees appointed by the Council to give effect to their resolutions in many important matters.

A bye-law for the prevention of fire and the Dog Act, 6 Will. IV., No. 4, having been approved of by the Governor, have been duly proclaimed and enforced within the Municipality, and a committee, appointed by the Council, is at present engaged in preparing the necessary bye-laws for the regulation of licenses in the various departments pointed out by the Municipal Institutions Act.

A manure dépôt has been provided, and the Council have procured either the alienation or promise of land in suitable localities within the Municipality for the establishment of a cemetery and slaughter houses, as also for the erection of public buildings, markets, &c., so soon as the funds at the disposal of the Council may be available for such various purposes. The impassable condition of Clarendon-street having been early brought under the notice of the Council, and the necessity of at least one proper entrance to the town from the Sandridge Road being imperative, the Council entered into a

contract for the proper formation of Clarendon-street, and the works are now considerably advanced. Various other streets within the township also have been, or are in the course of formation, by the mere construction of footpaths which have been formed of a width of 20 feet, to admit of a row of trees being planted along the outer edge so soon as the Council may be in funds to effect so desirable an improvement.

The District having been so thoroughly neglected while under the control of the Melbourne Corporation its requirements are now numerous or extensive, and accordingly urgent and frequent applications have been made by the Council to Government for a grant of 10,000*l.* in aid of local improvements, and with every prospect of such grants being passed in the Estimates now before the Legislative Council, the Governor having willingly recognised the claim of the Council for aid, apart from the fact that upwards of 137,000*l.* has already passed into the Public Exchequer from the sale of land within the Municipal District of Emerald Hill.

The toll upon the Sandridge Road occupied the attention of the Council at an early period, and after considerable difficulties occasioned by the ever watchful interference of the Melbourne Town Council, the toll was surrendered by the Government and re-established by the Council under the provisions of a bye-law, from the 1st day of January, 1856, on a considerably reduced scale, and while the heavy outlay required for the proper maintenance of the road precludes the hope of the toll being speedily removed, the Council anticipate that still further reduction in the scale of fees may be reasonably held out.

The Council have further to report that a cattle run, suitable to the wants and wishes of the district, has been marked out by Government for the exclusive use of the inhabitants.

The Council have taken steps to procure the establishment of a Post-office within the township, but hitherto without effect.

Steps have also been taken to procure direct communication with St. Kilda and Melbourne, by means of a road from the Junction at St. Kilda to the southern extremity of Cecil-street, and from the northern extremity of either Cecil or Clarendon-street across the Yarra to Spencer-street, and these objects still occupy the attention of the Council.

During the period embraced in the report, the Council have procured the district boundaries to be marked; procured suitable positions from whence loam and gravel may be obtained; furnished reports to the Central Board of Health; taken steps to procure the amendment of 18 Victoria, No. 15, in reference to this district; procured the erection of a temporary Court House by the Government, which will in future save the rent hitherto paid by the Council on account of police purposes.

Many other matters at present occupy the earnest attention of the Council, which do not properly come within the limits of this report, but which the Council anticipates being of great benefit to the locality when perfected.
