## RATIONS FOR IMMIGRANTS AND PRISONERS.—REGULATION.

HIS Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct that the Scales of Rations, Nos. 1, 9 and 10, contained in the 51st clause of the Regulations of the 6th September, 1855, respecting Stores and Transport, be cancelled, and that the following amended Scales be observed in lieu thereof:—

### No. 1.

Immigrants—For each statute adult:—

Wheaten Breat	...	1 lb.
Fresh Meat	...	1 lb.
Potatoes	...	8 oz.
Sugar	...	2 oz.
Tea	...	$\frac{1}{2}$ oz.
Salt	...	$\frac{1}{2}$ oz.
Soap	...	$\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

### No. 9.

Prisoners confined in lock-up or watchhouse:—

Wheaten Bread	...	24 oz.
Soap	...	$\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

### No. 10.

Prisoners confined at hard labor in lock-up:—

Wheaten Bread	...	24 oz.
Fresh Meat	...	16 oz.
Salt	...	$\frac{1}{2}$ oz.
Soap	...	$\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

The above Scales of Rations are to be adopted in all contracts entered upon after this date: but contracts at present in force are to be carried out in accordance with the scales which may have been contracted for in each instance.

#### LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

BEECHWORTH.

**R**EGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Beechworth:—

**XLII. Extent of claim in wet, worked, or flooded ground.**—All wet, worked, or flooded ground hereafter granted shall not exceed eighty yards in length by forty yards in width to each claimholder, it being imperative upon such claimholder to have at least one man holding a miner's right employed for every five yards of front measurement upon the claim, the breadth of claim to be taken with frontage to the creek. All such claims to be duly registered by the Warden. Rule No. XVII. gazetted on the 7th of March, 1856, and Rule No. XXV., gazetted on the 23rd of May, 1856, are hereby cancelled.

**XLIII. Extent of claim in partially worked or new ground.**—Sluicing claims on partially worked ground (except where rules of the Local Court otherwise provide) shall be to each claim-

holder one hundred yards in length by thirty yards in width, irrespective of depth of sinking, and in new ground one hundred yards in length by thirty yards in width, provided the sinking does not exceed three feet, it being imperative upon each claimholder to have at least three men holding miner's rights employed upon the claim. All such claims to be duly registered by the Warden.

#### LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

AVOCA.

**R**EGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Avoca:—

**XXI. Injury to shafts.**—No party shall be allowed to remove the pipeclay, or any other substance from the top of any shaft, without leaving an embankment around the mouth of the same sufficient to prevent the water running into such shaft, and thereby making its way into the adjoining claim; neither shall any party be allowed to cut a drain into any shaft whereby another party may be injured.

**XXII. Boundary pegs not to be shifted.**—No person shall remove any peg marking the boundaries of another's claim.

**RULES FOR AMALGAMATION.**

**XXIII. Amalgamation of claims allowed.**—In wet sinkings, whether in ground worked or unworked, wherever it can be proved satisfactorily that two or more parties can by combining overcome any difficulty which may exist in working their claims separately, or can by the application of machinery in any way facilitate the working of the same, such combination shall be authorised, and the claims of parties so combining shall be termed amalgamated claims, and shall be subject to the following regulations.

**XXIV. Special permission for amalgamated claims.**—In no case will amalgamated claims be allowed without a special permission from the Warden of the district, and when more than three claims are amalgamated it must be by special recommendation of the Local Court, and all such applications must be made to the Local Court through the Clerk of the Court at least eight days previous to the permission being given for such amalgamation.

**XXV. Applications to state particulars.**—In all cases the application for an amalgamation shall state—

1. Date of application.
2. Situation or plan of the grounds.
3. Whether on worked or unworked ground.
4. Name or title of each firm or company.
5. Names in full, also date of miner's right of each shareholder.
6. A description of machinery proposed to be employed in working the ground.

**XXVI. Notice of application.**—In all cases a notice of such application as described above shall be kept posted on some conspicuous portion of the ground applied for, and also lodged with the clerk of the Local Court at least eight days previous to the granting of such amalgamation.

**XXVII. Inspection of ground.**—Upon such application being made to the Local Court, the Court may appoint some competent person to inspect the grounds, who shall report in writing to the Court on the expediency of making the grant for such amalgamation.

**XXVIII. Objections to be made to the Local Court.**—All objections to such grants must be made to the Local Court through the Clerk of the Court, in writing, on or before the day such application is to be considered by the Court.

**XXIX. Amalgamation of quartz claims subject to the foregoing rules.**—All the rules which refer to the amalgamation of claims in alluvial sinking shall be applicable to quartz mining also.

#### LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

AVOCA.

**S**PECIAL Regulations made by the Local Court of the District of Avoca, exclusively applicable to the lead known as the "Avoca Lead."

**Special Rules to facilitate the better working of the wet or deep sinkings on the "Avoca Lead," commencing at the Fifth claim from the Alma whim:—**

1. **Extent and position of claim.**—The extent of claim for every six men holding miner's rights shall be eighty feet along the course

of the lead, irrespective of the width, and subject to the following regulations, viz.:—The claim to be marked with slabs at right angles with the supposed course of the lead, and shall be numbered consecutively. A wall of two feet only between such claims shall be allowed.

ii. *Deviation of lead.*—In cases where the lead changes its course, the position of the original claims shall be altered, the same taking precedence as before according to their numbers.

iii. *Junction, intersection, &c., of leads.*—Where two leads join or cross each other, or where the lead changes its course or turns at right angles, the width of the claim shall be double its length only.

iv. *Claims to be worked without intermission.*—Within one week of the marking of the claim the parties shall commence to sink, and continue to do so without intermission (Sundays excepted).

v. *Night and day working.*—All parties holding claims within eight in any direction from the last hole bottomed on the lead, shall sink their shafts all day and night.

vi. *Adjoining claims to be worked equally.*—When the parties mentioned in the last rule shall strike the water, each party so striking must have sufficient manual force or machinery to enable them to sink equal with the adjoining claims.

vii. *Names to be posted.*—The name of such parties always to be kept posted on some conspicuous part of the claim.

viii. *Vacant shares.*—In case of parties not keeping the full complement of six men, it shall be lawful for any man or men to take any vacant shares and work them for their own benefit.

ix. *Drains to be maintained by each claim.*—Parties belonging to each claim shall cut a sufficient drain from their shafts to a main drain, to be cut across each claim by the holders of the claim, and always keep the same clear for the water.

x. *A flag to be hoisted on claims striking the lead.*—Parties when sinking who shall strike the lead, or payable gold, shall hoist a flag over their claim.

xi. *Adjoining claimholders to inspect drive.*—Such parties shall admit a person from the two adjoining claims to their drive if required so to do.

xii. *Applications for frontage claims.*—Any party desirous of obtaining a frontage claim must post a notice on the site, and lodge an application at the Warden's Office seven clear days before the application is entertained: upon approval a written sanction will be given by the Warden.
