POLLING DAY AT TIMBOON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause to be adopted such measures as might be necessary for removing any obstacle or the doing of or the omission to do any act of a technical or formal nature by which, or the want of which, the due course of any election might be impeded: Provided that the measures so taken as aforesaid should be forthwith declared by the Governor, by a Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas the twenty-third day of the current month of October was appointed for taking the poll at the election for the Electoral District of Polwarth, Ripon, Hampden, and South Grenville, but no poll was taken on that day at Timboon, one of the polling places for the Hampden division of the said district: Now therefore I, Major General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation declare that, with the advice of the Executive Council, I have appointed the poll to be taken at Timboon aforesaid, for the Hampden division of the said electoral district of Polwarth, Ripon, Hampden and South Grenville, on Thursday, the thirtieth day of the current month of October, in lieu of the day so previously appointed as aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
