COMMUTATION FOR FORAGE.

HIS Excellency the Senior Military Officer in Victoria directs it to be notified, for the information of persons entitled to receive a money allowance in lieu of forage, that the rate of commutation for the quarter ending 31st March, 1856, has been fixed, on the recommendation of the Board appointed for that purpose, as follows, viz.:—

In Melbourne, Geelong, Portland, Belfast, Warrnambool, Alberton, and the sea board generally, 4s. per diem.
In Inland Townships, and the interior generally, 6s. 6d. per diem.

To persons having the occasional use of paddocks, one-half of the above scale.

To persons required to keep two horses, one-half more than the above scale.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the first clause of an Act passed in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the Protection and Management of Wharfs" (Act 17 Victoria, No. 27), His Excellency the Senior Military Officer in Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following rules and regulations for the protection, preservation, and good management of the Public Wharfs at Melbourne.

Regulations for the Protection and Management of the Public Wharfs at Melbourne.

1. In the event of any goods which may be landed on any of the public wharfs being allowed to remain on such wharf more than twenty-four hours, notice will be served on the owner or consignee of such goods, and if they are not removed within three days from the date of such notice, the goods will be taken by the wharfinger to the Customs Reserve, or some place duly appointed for that purpose, and there dealt with according to the second section of the above recited Act.

2. Importers and others landing timber from vessels in the river will be allowed, upon making application to the wharfinger, to use such portion of land as he may allot to them upon the vacant block between the storing yard allotments and the footpath, for the purpose only of arranging and assorting their timber, and for a period not exceeding seven days.

3. Any timber not removed within the above mentioned time will be conveyed to the Customs Reserve, and there dealt with in accordance with the provisions of the section and Act above recited.

4. All retail trade in timber on the wharfs or wharf land is forbidden.

PUBLIC WORSHIP.

IT is hereby notified that the following Regulations having been framed respecting the apportionment of monies reserved for Public Worship in Victoria by the Act 18 and 19 Victoria, c. 55, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the same, and direct that they shall take effect from the 1st of January, 1856.

1. The Head of every Christian denomination intending to claim aid under these Regulations is requested to send on or before the 20th day of February in this year, and on or before the 5th of January in each ensuing year, a notice to the Treasurer in the accompanying form (A), and no denomination will be entitled to receive aid during the year unless this notice shall have been given.

2. In cases where no aid has been given during the previous year, the notice must be accompanied by a certificate signed by at least 300 adults that they are *bona fide* members of the denomination, that the head of the denomination has been duly appointed, and that it has a church or chapel for the performance of public worship.

3. A schedule shewing the distribution among the several denominations of the sum appropriated for public worship will be communicated to the heads of denominations, and may be inspected at the Treasury.

Stipends.

4. One-half of the amount allotted to each denomination will be applicable to the payment of stipends.

5. At any time after the allotment referred to in the 3rd section, the head of any denomination may apply to the Treasurer in the form (B), for such stipends as may be required for ministers of that denomination.

6. This application must be accompanied by a declaration in the form C, to the effect that a sum equal to one-half of the gross stipends claimed will be obtained in the course of the year by contributions from other sources; and in cases where a minister is appointed for the first time to any church or chapel, by a certificate in the form (D), signed by at least one hundred adults.

7. No stipend exceeding £500 will be granted, except to the head of a denomination.

8. Payments of stipends, when sanctioned by His Excellency, will be made monthly at the Treasury upon the usual form of voucher.

9. On or before the 31st day of December in each year the head of each denomination is required to send to the Treasurer an account in the accompanying form E, shewing the contributions received during the year, under the declaration provided for in section 6 of these regulations. Should the amount of these contributions received by any denomination fall short of the sum required, a corresponding reduction will be made in the sum allotted to that denomination for the ensuing year.

10. A statement in the form (F) is required to be sent by the head of each denomination to the Treasurer, on or before the 5th of January in each year, shewing the amount of stipend received by each minister during the previous year, and certifying that he has during such time as he shall have received that stipend faithfully performed the duties allotted to him.

Buildings.

11. One half of the amount allotted to each denomination will be applicable towards the erection of churches, chapels, and ministers dwellings.

12. Applications for aid in this respect must be made in form (G) by the head of the denomination to the Treasurer, and must be accompanied by satisfactory proof that the land upon which the buildings are to be erected has been duly conveyed to a trustee or trustees approved by the Governor in Council.

13. No application for aid towards the erection of a church or chapel can be entertained until 200l. at least, shall have been raised by contributions, and actually paid over to the trustees; and in like manner 50l. at least, must have been raised and paid over in the case of an application being made to erect a min-

ister's dwelling; and in support of each application, the head of denomination must forward a list of the contributors, with the amount which each has paid over to the trustees, with a certificate in the accompanying form (H) signed by the trustees that they have actually received the sums therein shown for the erection of the building in question.

14. Upon the above conditions being complied with, grants will be sanctioned by His Excellency out of the sums allotted to each denomination, equal to twice the amount paid to the trustees. But the total amount of the grants to any church or chapel will not exceed 3000*l.*, or to any minister's dwelling 600*l.*

15. Payments (in sums of not less than 50*l.* each) will be made to the trustees from time to time as the building progresses, upon the production of an account in the usual form, supported by the necessary vouchers, for the sums actually expended, and by a certificate from a clerk of works, or (where no such officer is resident within a reasonable distance) from a stipendiary magistrate, that he has examined the building, that the workmanship and materials are good and sufficient, and that he believes the sum specified in the account to have been actually laid out.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF EMERALD HILL.
STATEMENT OF PROCEEDINGS FOR THE HALF YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER, 1855, UNDER CLAUSE 43 OF THE 18TH VICTORIA, No. 15.

THE District of Emerald Hill having been erected into a Municipality by virtue of the proclamation of His late Excellency Sir Charles Hotham, K.C.B., Governor of the Colony of Victoria, bearing date the 26th day of May, 1855, and made in pursuance of the provisions of the 18th Victoria, No. 15, on the 29th day of June last, Messrs. Albert Hancock, Peter McLean Ross, Charles Chessell, Henry South Gardner, James Service, Robert Stirling Anderson, and James O'Brien, were duly elected as the members of the first Council for the Municipal District of Emerald Hill, and on the 4th day of the following month Mr. James Service was chosen Chairman of the Council.

The first duties attended to by the Council consisted in framing the necessary bye-laws for the proper regulation of their own proceedings, procuring the extension of the Health of Towns Act and Management of Towns Act to the Municipality, taking measures for the accurate valuation of all rateable property within the Municipality, and arranging for the establishment of a Court of Petty Sessions in suitable premises within the District.

In consequence of a total want of funds the Council were unable for some time to effect any considerable improvements beyond procuring the removal of the filth and rubbish that during the two previous years had been accumulating to a very offensive extent upon the various reserves, streets and roadways, filling up the numerous holes and pitfalls then existing within the township, which improvements were however efficiently performed out of funds advanced in anticipation of the rates. Public notice was also given to the inhabitants of the important provisions contained in the various Acts in force within the Municipality, and the inhabitants generally having seconded the wishes of the Council in that respect, the sanitary condition of the District has been much improved and is now in a state affording much satisfaction to the Council.

Shortly after the election of the Council a Town Clerk was appointed, and upon the completion of the valuation of the District an officer was appointed to perform the duties of Collector of rates, surveyor, and inspector of nuisances, since which latter appointment on the 18th of September last, the improvements contemplated by the Council have been carried on with considerable efficiency, under the supervision of the various Committees appointed by the Council to give effect to their resolutions in many important matters.

A bye-law for the prevention of fire and the Dog Act, 6 Will. IV, No. 4, having been approved of by the Governor, have been duly proclaimed and enforced within the Municipality, and a committee, appointed by the Council, is at present engaged in preparing the necessary bye-laws for the regulation of licenses in the various departments pointed out by the Municipal Institutions Act.

A manure depot has been provided, and the Council have procured either the alienation or promise of land in suitable localities within the Municipality for the establishment of a cemetery and slaughter houses, as also for the erection of public buildings, markets, &c., so soon as the funds at the disposal of the Council may be available for such various purposes. The impassable condition of Clarendon-street having been early brought under the notice of the Council, and the necessity of at least one proper entrance to the town from the Sandridge Road being imperative, the Council entered into a

contract for the proper formation of Clarendon-street, and the works are now considerably advanced. Various other streets within the township also have been, or are in the course of formation, by the mere construction of footpaths which have been formed of a width of 20 feet, to admit of a row of trees being planted along the outer edge so soon as the Council may be in funds to effect so desirable an improvement.

The District having been so thoroughly neglected while under the control of the Melbourne Corporation its requirements are now numerous or extensive, and accordingly urgent and frequent applications have been made by the Council to Government for a grant of 10,000l. in aid of local improvements, and with every prospect of such grants being passed in the Estimates now before the Legislative Council, the Government having willingly recognised the claim of the Council for aid, apart from the fact that upwards of 137,000l. has already passed into the Public Exchequer from the sale of land within the Municipal District of Emerald Hill.

The toll upon the Sandridge Road occupied the attention of the Council at an early period, and after considerable difficulties occasioned by the ever watchful interference of the Melbourne Town Council, the toll was surrendered by the Government and re-established by the Council under the provisions of a bye-law, from the 1st day of January, 1856, on a considerably reduced scale, and while the heavy outlay required for the proper maintenance of the road precludes the hope of the toll being speedily removed, the Council anticipate that still further reduction in the scale of fees may be reasonably held out.

The Council have further to report that a cattle run, suitable to the wants and wishes of the district, has been marked out by Government for the exclusive use of the inhabitants.

The Council have taken steps to procure the establishment of a Post-office within the township, but hitherto without effect.

Steps have also been taken to procure direct communication with St. Kilda and Melbourne, by means of a road from the Junction at St. Kilda to the southern extremity of Cecil-street, and from the northern extremity of either Cecil or Clarendon-street across the Yarra to Spencer-street, and these objects still occupy the attention of the Council.

During the period embraced in the report, the Council have procured the district boundaries to be marked; procured suitable positions from whence loam and gravel may be obtained; furnished reports to the Central Board of Health; taken steps to procure the amendment of 18 Victoria, No. 15, in reference to this district; procured the erection of a temporary Court House by the Government, which will in future save the rent hitherto paid by the Council on account of police purposes.

Many other matters at present occupy the earnest attention of the Council, which do not properly come within the limits of this report, but which the Council anticipate being of great benefit to the locality when perfected.
