PARTICULARS.

Thomas McSorley is a native of Tyrone, in Ireland, 5 feet 5½ inches high, swarthy, has dark brown hair and grey eyes, and is 28 years of age. He is a gardener. Marks—scars on left eyebrow and left cheek; burn mark outside right arm, lower part; scars on the tip of right forefinger, and the first joint of the second finger of the right hand; blue mark inside left arm, lower part; scar on the palm of the left hand near the wrist; large boil mark under the right side of the breast; large boil mark above the navel; boil mark on the cap of the right knee; two burn marks below the left knee outside; cut inside left shin. He arrived at Adelaide, 1853, on board the ship California, and was convicted at Ballaarat on 21st July, 1855, of wounding with intent.

Further Particulars.—He was transported from Ireland in 1845 to V. D. L. per Rateliffe, was in the police at Port Esperance and Westbury, V. D. L., and also in the police force at Ballaarat or Castlemaine, and shot a man for not showing his license, for which he received a sentence of three or six months. He has since been living at Mr. Dewey's, farmer, about nine miles from Port Fairy, next to Mr. McGuire's station, and issupposed to have gone there again. When last seen he was in the vicinity of the Caledonian Gold Fields.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS. WILLIAMSTOWN.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Senior Military Officer in Victoria has, with the advice of the Executive Council, directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundredand twenty-two householders resident in the town of Williamstown, in the county of Bourke.

The petitioners-state that they are resident householders within the district of Williamstown, the area of which does not exceed nine square miles, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point thereof.
