EAST COLLINGWOOD MUNICIPALITY.

PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by Five hundred and forty-one householders residing within the municipal district of East Collingwood.

The petitioners state that they are desirous of maintaining in proper repair the foot and carriage ways of streets and roads in front of the dwellings and property of the ratepayers along

the municipal boundaries, which are at present limited to the front line of houses or land in Victoria-street, Victoria Parade, Smith-street, and Heidelberg-road, but are unable legally to effect such objects without the extension of the municipal boundaries so as to include therein such footways and the half of such carriage ways, excepting as regards Victoria Parade, of which thirty-three feet from the outer line of the foot-way on the north side will suffice.

That, deeply impressed with the necessity for spacious areas for the health and recreation of the residents of the municipality, a portion of which is densely populated, and anticipating a large accession of population, they desire to bring under notice that the Municipal Council have petitioned for a grant of Studley Park reserve as a place of recreation.

That they consider Studley Park reserve eminently adapted for a place of public recreation from the beauty of its site and its facility of access.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency will be pleased to extend the municipal boundaries of East Collingwood so as to include therein the line of streets and roads and the Studley Park reserve, as petitioned for by the said Municipal Council; the latter, the Studley Park reserve, by a conveyance to such Council in trust for the purposes of health and recreation to the inhabitants of East Collingwood Municipality in particular, and the people of Victoria in general."

MUNICIPALITY OF BELFAST.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE FOOTWAYS, WATERCOURSES, ETC., OF THE PUBLIC STREETS AND THOROUGHFARES OF THE BELFAST MUNICIPALITY, UNDER 18 VICTORIA, Nos. 14 AND 15.

EVERY person requiring to take horses, bullocks, drays, carts, &c., across the footways of the public streets of the municipality to his or her premises abutting thereon, and having obtained permission from the Municipal Council, shall make approaches thereto in conformity with the instructions of said Council, through their surveyor, or other authorised officer.

2. No person shall be permitted to form, nor open any drain, sewer, or other communication with the watercourses of the public streets or thoroughfares, nor to remove the surface of any footway or carriage road, without first obtaining the approval of the Municipal Council, through their surveyor, or other authorised officer.

3. No person shall throw earth, sand, gravel, or rubbish into, nor in any other manner obstruct the watercourses or drains of the streets, or other places in the municipality.

4. No person shall be permitted to ride or drive any beast of burthen, nor drive or wheel any cart, barrow, or other vehicle, upon, along, or across any of the public footways or watercourses within the municipal district, nor shall in any way wilfully cause damage to the said public footways or watercourses.

5. No person shall be permitted to draw or trail any sledge, timber, or other heavy material, upon any footway or carriage road to the injury thereof within the municipal district.

6. No person shall be permitted to place any timber, or other building materials upon any footway, watercourse, or carriage road, nor in any way obstruct such footway, watercourse, or carriage road, whether by allowing any animal or carriage of any description to remain across the same, or by placing goods or materials of any kind thereon, or otherwise, without the permission of the Council having been first obtained.

7. Any person or persons convicted of a breach of any of the regulations under this bye-law, before any two or more justices of the peace, shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 6, made by the Municipal Council of Belfast, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE REGULATION OF BATHING ON THE SEA-COAST, WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EMERALD HILL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria, No. 15, intitled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the Council of any municipal district, established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the preservation of public decency, and the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 26th day of May, A.D. 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the regulation of bathing on the sea-coast within the municipal district of Emerald Hill, in order to ensure the more certain preservation of public decency: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council for the district of Emerald Hill, That from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the following regulations shall be in force respecting bathing on that portion of the sea-coast within the municipal district of Emerald Hill, that is to say:—

1. No bathing shall be permitted at any time in the neighbourhood of the battery, nor within a distance of 200 yards north-west of the same and 200 yards south-east of the same.

2. From a point 200 yards north-west of the battery to another point 500 yards north-west of the same, that is, for a distance of 300 yards, the beach shall be exclusively reserved for the use of females: and no male will be permitted to use the beach for the purpose of bathing at any time in the sea between those two points.

3. No male shall linger about that portion of the beach set apart for females, nor within a distance of 200 yards back from the shore, at any time when the place is occupied by females, either bathing, apparently about to bathe, or having just bathed.

Any person contravening any of the foregoing rules, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 9, made by the Municipal Council of Emerald Hill, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO PORTLAND MUNICIPAL DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General, MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that certain provisions of the said Act relating to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X. in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare to come under the operation of the same respectively or any of them, and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, the sections of the said Act numbered V., VI., VII., VIII. and IX., were extended to the town of Portland: And whereas it is deemed expedient to extend the sections of the said Act, numbered V. to X. (both inclusively) to the municipal district of Portland: Now therefore I, Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the sections of the said Act, being numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X. respectively, shall extend to and be in force within the municipal district of Portland, in the county of Normanby, the boundaries whereof are defined in a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
