LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

WARANGA.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Waranga:—

vii. Conditions on which claims may be held in reserve.—Any miner or miners who may be unable to work from any accident or illness, or who shall be in attendance upon any sick person or court of justice, or whose absence from his or their claim has been caused by some urgent business (the proof of which shall lie upon him or them), shall be entitled to hold such claim in reserve or unworked for the necessary length of time.

time.

viii. Alluvial claims to be properly pegged —The holder or holders of any claim on whatever kind of auriferous land (except on reefs or veius of quartz, they being specially provided for), shall, for the information of all other persons, mark the boundaries of his or their claim by driving in a substantial peg at each corner of the claim, standing at least one foot above the ground, and kept at all times clear of any rubbish or soil thrown out or deposited, and no person or persons shall remove, injure, destroy, or cover any such peg put in for the purpose of marking the corners of any claim.

IX. Prospectors' claims.—Prospectors shall be entitled to frontage claims, and discoverers of a lost lead shall be deemed prospectors.

prospectors.

x. Claims may be registered for thirty days.—Any miner or party of miners having sunk a claim to the depth of thirty (30) feet, and being unable to work it from want of funds or ill health, may, upon application to the Clerk of Local Court, register his or their claim for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days—such claim to be marked with a post at least four (4) inches square, with the number and date of registry thereon.

xi. Water not to be taken from dams, &c.—No person or head to be taken from dams, &c.—No person or the owner. xi. Water not to be taken from dams, &c.—No person or persons shall, without the knowledge and consent of the owner or owners thereof, take away from, make use of, or defile any water which may be in any private well, waterhole, or dam held by him or them by authority; nor shall any person or persons damage, or take away any covering or portion of any covering which may have been placed over any well, nor dig into, cut through, nor undermine the bank or side in such a many and any all waterhole or dam to lose manner as might cause any well, waterhole or dam to lose water when full.

xii. Ground on which machines stand not to be duy upon.—No person or persons shall dig upon or undermine the portion of ground which may have been assigned to any miner or miners, or other persons, by any competent officer, for the erection or construction upon it of any engine, machine, mill, or other apparatus for the extraction or separation of gold from any other substance, or for any other purpose, nor within the distance of ten (10) feet, unless in the opinion of the warden such undermining only for its depth will not be injurious.

xiii. No studge drain to be injured or diverted.—No miner or miners, or other persons, shall, on any pretence whatever, dig upon or into, divert, undermine, or cast into it anything which may tend to stop up any existing sludge channel, whether the same be a public or private channel, unless the neighbours, or any other person or persons working in the adjoining ground, and liable to be damaged thereby, shall have previously consented to such being done, or unless on examination into the matter on the spot, the warden of the district has specially authorised him or them to do so.

xiv. Damage to roads, &c., by sludge, &c., remedica by owners of mills, &c., within a quarter of a mile.—When the united sludge or water discharged by any number of engines, mills, machines, or other apparatus, shall run upon or in any way damage any public road, footpath, or crossing place in ordinary use, or workable ground, it shall be competent for the warden of the district to direct the owners of all the engines, mills, machines, or other apparatus situated within the distance of one quarter of an mile of such road, footpath, erossing place, or workable ground, and discharging sludge or water into the drain or ourse complained of, to stop such discharge, and every owner of any engine, mill, machine or apparatus, when so directed, shall cease such discharge of sl

xv. Quartz claims to be marked by posts.—Any miner or party of miners who may be in possession of any quartz claim shall, for the information of all other persons, mark the boundaries of

of the information of all other persons, mark the boundaries of his or their claim, by the erection of posts at each end of the claim at least three (3) inches square, standing two (2) feet above the ground, and kept at all times clear of rubbish, or any thing which may tend to conceal them from view.

XYI. Well between quartz claims to be allowed.—In all cases a wall of three (3) feet, shall be allowed, between the claims of different parties of miners, under whatever document such claims may be held, and whenever any miner or miners, in marking off any new claim, shall have neglected to leave the proper space for the wall, it shall be competent for the warden to deduct the necessary length from the claim last marked off, and assign it as a wall between such claim and the adjoining claim first marked; and in like manner when any miner or miners shall have marked off more than the proper width for a wall, the warden may curtail such excess, and assign it to the holders of the claim first marked; or if he should deem it advisable, may order the boundary posts of the claim last marked to

wait, the water may cuttain such excess, and assign to the holders of the claim first marked; or if he should deem it advisable, may order the boundary posts of the claim last marked to be removed to their proper relative position.

XVII. Prospectors on quartz reefs.—Any party of miners may, if desirous to prospect a reef of quartz, hold their full amount of claim, provided they employ a sufficient number of men to sink a shaft until the payable quartz is reached, when it shall be imperative for them to employ the full number of miners in proportion to the extent of claim they shall occupy.

XVIII. Distance between dams.—No dam shall be hereafter erected at a less distance than one (100) hundred yards from any other dam on the same watercourse.

XIX. Permission to make dams to be applied for to Local Court.—Parties applying for permission to make a dam must post a notice on each side of the gully in which they intend to creet the dam, and make application in writing, and lodge the same with the clerk not less than three days prior to the sitting of the local court.

xx. Flooding payable ground prohibited.—No miner or miners shall be allowed to flood or otherwise impede the working of payable ground.
