WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, in the eighth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to amend 'an Act passed in the sixth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled 'An Act to incorporate the inhabitants of the 'Town of Melbourne,'" it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, upon Petition from the Council of the Town of Melbourne, to increase from time to time the number of Wards within the said Town, by Proclamation published in one or more of the Melbourne newspapers, and every additional Ward so appointed should have the same rights, privileges, and immunities as any of the other Wards within the said Town: And whereas the Right Worshipful the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of the City of Melbourne have presented to His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, a Petition, praying His Excellency to cause the portion of the said City lying northward of Victoria-street, and eastward of the main road to Sydney, commonly called and known as Carlton, to be proclaimed a separate Ward of the said City, under the name and style of "Smith Ward:" And whereas the burgesses and citizens of North Melbourne have presented to the said Mayor a memorial, numerously signed, expressing their concurrence in the prayer of the said Petition: No. 20.—FEBRUARY 15TH, 1856.—4.

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said Colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a Road District for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every Road District thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such Road District, and from time to time to revoke any such Proclamation, and vary and alter the boundary of any such District as might be necessary and advisable: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Lieutenant Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the tenth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, "The Warrnambool Road District" was proclaimed, and the boundaries thereof were defined: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the said Road District: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said Warrnambool Road District: And I do hereby proclaim and declare, that the undermentioned boundaries shall henceforth be the boundaries of the said Warrnambool Road District, that is to say:—Commencing at a point on the sea coast due south of the boundary line between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane respectively, in the parish of Yaugery, in the county of Villiers; thence by the coast line south-easterly to the eastern boundary of the county of Heytesbury; thence by the eastern boundary of the said county of Heytesbury, and by the eastern, northern, and part of the western boundaries of the county of Hampden to the Town Reserve of Hexham; thence by the northern boundary of that reserve and a line south-westerly to the north-east angle of the Town Reserve of Woolsthorpe; thence by the eastern boundary of the said reserve, and a line southward to the north-west angle of portion 6, parish of Yarpurk; thence by a line bearing south to portion 20, in the said parish; thence by part of the northern and western boundaries of the said portion to the Yaugery Creek; thence by that creek southwards to a bridge on the Woodford-road; thence by that road westerly 74 chains and 25 links, more or less; thence by a road due south to Rutledge's Special Survey; thence westerly by part of the northern boundary line of the said special survey, and thence southward by the boundary between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane respectively, and a line south to the sea coast, the commencing point aforesaid; except that portion of the county of Villiers included within the Municipal District of Warrnambool.

LOCAL COURT REGULATION.

HEATHCOTE.

REGULATION made by the Local Court of the District of Heathcote:—

No. i. *Wall*.—"A two foot wall shall be left between each claim.

No. ii. *Claims to be marked by Pegs*.—"Persons marking out claims must do so by firmly fixing in the ground four pegs, one at each corner of the claim, which must be kept visible during the working of the claim.

No. iii. *Jumping not allowed*.—"No party shall be allowed to jump or take forcible possession of another party's claim, but when a claim may be disputed, the party wishing to take possession of it must first make application to any authorised person to inquire into and decide the case.

No. iv. *Extent of Claim in old Workings*.—"Double claims shall be allowed in old workings; land previously worked to be deemed 'old workings.'

No. v. *Extent of Claim in Deep Sinking*.—"In deep sinking, that is, over 20 feet, the extent of claim shall be—

Two miners, 20 feet by 20 feet,
Three miners, 20 feet by 30 feet,
Four miners, 30 feet by 30 feet.

No. vi. *Quartz Mining*.—"The extent of claim to which each Miner's Right shall entitle the holder shall be—

For one miner, 20 feet along the vein with the dip,
For two miners, 35 feet
For three miners, 50 feet
For four miners, 60 feet

No. vii. *Breadth of Claim in Quartz Mining*.—"For the purpose of depositing the refuse and ore produced from the claim, in all cases (where practicable) a superficial area of ten yards on each side of the claim opened will be allowed.

No. viii. *Plurality of Claims*.—"Plurality of claims in quartz leases will be allowed.

No. ix. *Puddling Mills*.—"Any person wishing to form a water tank or erect a puddling machine must apply to the Warden in charge of the District, who will furnish him with a notice of application which must be posted fourteen days on the site applied for.

No. x. *Claim to holders of Puddling Mills*.—"The extent of claim to which puddlers shall be entitled, shall be thirty-six feet by thirty-six feet on previously worked ground.

No. xi. *Road to Puddling Mills*.—"Where any cart track is formed over worked ground the same shall not be obstructed or destroyed, unless another track has been previously formed by the party who desires to re-work the ground which the old road covers.

No. xii. *Puddling Mills on Creeks*.—"Any person holding a right to a water hole for a puddling mill on the creek, and not working the same for four weeks, or shewing reasonable cause for being idle, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds (£10) if idle after the expiration of the above period.

No. xiii. *Puddling Mills in Gullies*.—"All tanks shall be excavated to the bed rock, and an open channel shall, where practicable, be preserved as near the centre of the gully as possible. The proprietors of each puddling mill shall carry the mullock or slush from such mill or trough into the centre channel. The Warden shall direct the course of such channel in each gully. Each party occupying the gully shall make their respective portions of the work according to the extent of occupation."
