## WILLIAMSTOWN.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

HEATHCOTE.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Heathcote:—

No. i. *Wall*.—"A two-foot wall shall be left between each claim.

No. ii. *Claims to be marked by Pegs*.—"Persons marking out claims must do so by firmly fixing in the ground four pegs, one at each corner of the claim, which must be kept visible during the working of the claim.

No. iii. *Jumping not allowed*.—"No party shall be allowed to jump or take forcible possession of another party's claim, but when a claim may be disputed, the party wishing to take possession of it must first make application to any authorised person to inquire into and decide the case.

No. iv. *Extent of Claim in old Workings*.—"Double claims shall be allowed in old workings; land previously worked to be deemed 'old workings.'

No. v. *Extent of Claim in Deep Sinking*.—"In deep sinking, that is, over 20 feet, the extent of claim shall be—

Two miners, 20 feet by 20 feet,  
 Three miners, 20 feet by 30 feet,  
 Four miners, 30 feet by 30 feet.

No. vi. *Quartz Mining*.—"The extent of claim to which each Miner's Right shall entitle the holder shall be—

For one miner, 20 feet along the vein with the dip,  
 For two miners, 35 feet "  
 For three miners, 50 feet "  
 For four miners, 60 feet "

No. vii. *Breadth of Claim in Quartz Mining*.—"For the purpose of depositing the refuse and ore produced from the claim, in all cases (where practicable) a superficial area of ten yards on each side of the claim opened will be allowed.

No. viii. *Plurality of Claims*.—"Plurality of claims in quartz leases will be allowed.

No. ix. *Puddling Mills*.—"Any person wishing to form a water tank or erect a puddling machine must apply to the Warden in charge of the District, who will furnish him with a notice of application which must be posted fourteen days on the site applied for.

No. x. *Claim to holders of Puddling Mills*.—"The extent of claim to which puddlers shall be entitled, shall be thirty-six feet by thirty-six feet on previously worked ground.

No. xi. *Road to Puddling Mills*.—"Where any cart track is formed over worked ground the same shall not be obstructed or destroyed, unless another track has been previously formed by the party who desires to re-work the ground which the old road covers.

No. xii. *Puddling Mill on Creeks*.—"Any person holding a right to a water hole for a puddling mill on the creek, and not working the same for four weeks, or shewing reasonable cause for being idle, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds (£10) if idle after the expiration of the above period.

No. xiii. *Puddling Mills in Gullies*.—"All tanks shall be excavated to the bed rock, and an open channel shall, where practicable, be preserved as near the centre of the gully as possible. The proprietors of each puddling mill shall carry the mullock

or slush from such mill or trough into the centre channel. The Warden shall direct the course of such channel in each gully. Each party occupying the gully shall make their respective portions of the work according to the extent of occupation."

#### LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

YACKANDANDA.

**R**EGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Yackandanda:—

No. i. *Working Beds of Creeks, &c.*—"Where the clearing or working of beds of creeks or water holes would be no injury to the public, permission may be granted to parties of miners to undertake the same. The portion of such beds of creeks or water holes allowed to each miner will be ten yards in length, and not exceeding one hundred and fifty yards in breadth. No greater length than one hundred yards will be allowed, and this clause to be subject to any new rules to be made at the opening of new creeks."

No. ii. *Extent of Claims.*—"The extent of hill or surface claims shall be five yards frontage to the creek, by one hundred and sixty yards back. No claim to be granted exceeding forty yards frontage to the creek, by one hundred and sixty yards back. In no case shall the tailings be allowed to flow into the bed of the creek except by special permission of the warden."

No. iii. *Plurality of Claims.*—"Any miner shall be entitled to hold a claim of the authorised extent, or shares in claims not exceeding in the whole number of shares such extent, provided he employs the requisite number of men holding the Miner's Right."

No. iv. *Responsible Party.*—"The person in whose name the claim stands registered shall be held responsible for the due observance of these regulations, and in the event of a sale being effected, notice shall be given at once to the clerk of the Local Court, and the transfer entered by him and endorsed on the register ticket."

No. v. *Water Privilege.*—"Sluice washing or other water privilege will be allowed only by special sanction, in order that care may be taken to guard against conferring the privilege in places where the permanent supply of water may be injured by the operation."

No. vi. *Diversion of Watercourses.*—"Parties turning the creek shall, on obtaining permission of the warden or other proper officer, make the ditch into which it is to be turned sufficiently wide and deep, so that in cases of floods the water may run as freely as in the original bed."

No. vii. *Removal of Dams.*—"Any dam erected on ground about to be worked shall be removed at the expense of the party about to work the ground on which the dam is situated. Before the removal of any such dam, the party coming in shall render the water as available as it previously was to the party in possession of the claim to which the dam belongs."

No. viii. *Water for Wheels.*—"Parties may demand the privilege of using the water from creeks for the purposes of wheels, provided this does not interfere with washing or sluicing at the time such privilege be granted."

No. ix. *Succession to Water rights.*—"All water rights for purposes of hill or bank washing shall extend only to the claim for which originally granted. On a party working out their claim renewed application shall be made to the Warden for a further allotment of ground, the first right of water falling to the next party, and so on."

No. x. *Forfeiture of Water rights.*—"All right to any race out for conveying water, tail race, or privilege granted for using water in the creek or out of the creek, becomes forfeited when abandoned for the space of fourteen days, unless sickness or some other sufficient cause shall be shown for leaving it."

No. xi. *Encouraging search for New Workings.*—"For the encouragement of prospecting, persons discovering new gold workings not less than two miles distant from the last occupied claim, may have allotted to them, by special sanction, in addition, a third of the ordinary mining claim granted under these regulations, provided the discovery be made public without unnecessary delay."

#### LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS. MOUNT BLACKWOOD.

**R**EGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Mount Blackwood:—

No. i. *Extent of Claims.*—"The extent of claims which each miner's right shall entitle the holder to shall be—

For one miner, 12 feet by 12 feet,  
For two miners, 12 feet by 24 feet,  
For three miners, 18 feet by 24 feet,  
For four miners, 24 feet by 24 feet.

"The extent of claims on quartz veins shall be—

For one miner, 12 feet,  
For two miners, 24 feet,  
For three miners, 36 feet,  
For four miners, 48 feet.

With all dips and angles, than which no greater claim shall be allowed to one party except as hereinafter provided:—

"In cases where it can be satisfactorily proved that two or more parties of miners taking up claims on worked or flooded ground can, by combining, overcome any natural difficulties which may exist by means not detrimental to the interests of the public or other authorised miners, as also when two or more parties of quartz miners may desire to sink one shaft common to all their claims. Every such party must have the sanction of the Warden, and the ground must be worked by the same number of miners as would be required were it divided into smaller claims."

No. ii. *Working or Clearing Beds of Creeks.*—"When the working or clearing of beds of creeks or water holes would be no injury to the public, permission may be granted to parties of miners to undertake the same; the portion of such beds of creeks or water holes allowed to each miner will be ten (10) yards in length irrespective of the breadth, but no party shall be entitled to hold more than eighty (80) yards. Parties having cut a race to enable them to work the bed of the creek or water hole shall be entitled to work the length and breadth of the race, provided it does not exceed the length of the claim."

"Such conditions relative to the working of such beds of creeks and water holes as the interests of the public may require will be imposed, and, if deemed expedient, a sum of money as a deposit may be taken from each miner to ensure the due performance of the same."

No. iii. *Claims to be marked by Pegs.*—"All alluvial and creek claims must be marked out by four (4) pegs at least two (2) feet out of the ground, which pegs must be kept visible during the working of the claim, and a two (2) feet wall left between each claim."

"Quartz claims must be marked out by two (2) pegs at least (2) feet out of the ground, one (1) to be placed on the north and one (1) on the south side of the claim, and the boundaries of such claim shall be a line running east and west through each such peg, and no wall shall be required to be left."

No. iv. *Night and Day Working in Wet Sinkings.*—"In wet sinkings, when a party have sunk their shaft to the water, the party, and all parties having claims within 'three' of the same must work every and all day, or day and night, as may be found necessary, but this rule only shall take effect after the application of three interested parties to the Warden of the District."

No. v. *Claims not to remain Unworked.*—"No claim shall be kept unworked or in reserve (shepherded) for longer than twenty-



four (24) hours, unless satisfactory reasons, such as sickness, or some other urgent cause can be shewn on the claim becoming the subject of dispute.

No. vi. *Forcible Seizure of Claims not allowed*.—"No party shall be allowed to take forcible possession of (jump) another party's claim, but when a claim may be disputed on any of the grounds mentioned in these Rules, the party wishing to take possession of it must first make an application to the Warden of the District to inquire into and decide the case.

No. vii. *Prospecting*.—"For the encouragement of prospecting, any party discovering new gold workings not being within two hundred and fifty (250) yards of other workings, or any party discovering a new lead, or recovering a lost one, shall be entitled to a double claim on a quartz vein, and to a double or treble claim on alluvial sinkings, under the authority of the Warden, providing such discovery be made public without delay.

No. viii. *Double Claims in Old Ground*.—"It shall be lawful for the Warden to grant a double or treble claim on ground previously worked or abandoned."

## MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BYE-LAW TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF WARRNAMBOOL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, 18 Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," section 26, it is enacted, "That it shall be lawful for the Council of any Municipal District to make Bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings, the collection of their rates, the conducting of elections and public meetings of the ratepayers, the determining the validity of disputed elections, the prevention and extinguishing of fires, the suppression of nuisances and houses of ill-fame, compelling residents to keep their premises free from offensive or unwholesome matters, the regulation and licensing of porters, public carriers, carters, water-drawers, and public vehicles, regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat, the establishment of slaughter-houses, the regulation of markets, market dues, fairs and sales, the preservation of public decency and public health, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such Municipal District," such Bye-Laws to have force and effect under the 33rd section of the said Act, upon the assent of the Governor of the said Colony having been obtained thereto under his hand.

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Municipal District of Warrnambool, That from and after the date of the Governor's assent hereto, the proceedings and business of the said Council shall be conducted according to the following Regulations only, which shall be deemed and called the "Standing Orders" of the said Council, until repealed or altered, that is to say:—

## CHAP. I.—Order of Proceeding.

1. That the sittings of this Council shall on all ordinary occasions be open to the public, but any Councillor may require the exclusion of strangers while the sense of the Council is taken as to whether the question proposed shall be discussed with closed doors.

2. At all meetings of the Council the business shall commence so soon as the legal quorum is present; but, should a quorum not be present at the expiration of twenty minutes after the hour appointed for meeting, such circumstance shall be noted (with the names of the Members present) in the Minute Book, and such meeting shall lapse.

3. The first business at each meeting of the Council shall be to confirm the Minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon, except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. At all meetings, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of Petitions, and the bringing up of Reports, shall have the precedence of all Motions.

5. All communications by letter intended for the Council, shall be made and addressed to the Town Clerk, and all Petitions and Memorials shall be addressed to the Chairman and Council, under cover to the Town Clerk.

6. No Motion shall be decided on at any meeting of Council, unless notice in writing, signed by the Councillor proposing, shall have been given at the previous meeting of the Council; nor shall any Report of Committee be decided on, unless similar notice be given, unless in Committee of the whole Council, or the whole Council be present.

7. The Orders of the Day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of the Council.

9. No Bye-Law shall be decided on without due notice (as in cases of Motions), and a copy of the proposed Bye-laws shall be open in the Council Chamber for the inspection of all Ratepayers, free of charge, or of any person duly qualified to vote at Elections under the Act.

10. All business shall be considered in the order in which notice thereof was given.

## CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

1. Any member, when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must arise and address the Chairman, and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down; the member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.

2. Any Councillor rising to make any proposition, or to propose any amendment to the Council, must first state the nature of the same before addressing the Council in support thereof.

3. No proposition once brought before the Council shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council, nor shall any proposition be entertained by the Council until the same be seconded.

4. Councillors moving a proposition shall be held to have spoken on that question, but Councillors merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

5. If more than one Councillor rise at the same time, the Chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

6. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original Motion or upon any Amendment, and after such explanation or reply the question shall be forthwith put to the vote.

7. No Councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

8. The presiding Chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

9 The presiding Chairman shall rise when addressing the Council.

10. Any Councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other Councillor, shall, if required by the Chairman, withdraw such expressions, and make a satisfactory apology to the Council, under a penalty of not more than ten pounds.

11. Any Councillor may require the Clerk to the Council to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.

12. Any Councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Council bearing on the question under discussion.

13. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

14. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the votes of all Councillors shall be entered in the Minutes.

15. The Council shall vote by shew of hands except in cases of elections. (See chap. iii. par. 2.)

16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment; but if the question be decided in the negative, the next motion or Order of the Day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be again entertained, and any business left undecided shall take precedence at the next meeting of the Council.

17. Any Councillor may record his protest against any decision of the Council, provided the same be made in writing before the next meeting of the Council, and be couched in respectful language, and be consistent with truth; notice of such intention, however, must be given on the adoption of the Resolution.

18. No Motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous Resolution of the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole Council be duly made for the purpose.

19. The Chairman of the Council, when appointed on Committees, shall be Chairman thereof, and the Standing Orders of the Council shall be observed in all Committees, except as to the number of times limited for speaking.

20. The Clerk to the Council shall have charge of the Common Seal of the Corporation, and shall be responsible for the same, and verify each impression by his signature, and shall not affix the same to any document without the order of a majority of the Council; and for using the same to verify documents not belonging to or for the use of the Council shall charge a fee of ten shillings.

## CHAP. III.—Elections.

1. No Election to any office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until four clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year before proceeding to the Election.

2. At all such Elections, the voting shall be (except at that of Chairman of the Council) on cards or paper, to be provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports, and sign his own. No others will be received; and the Town Clerk shall preserve the same as a record.

3. No Councillor shall be received as surety for any officer, nor shall any Auditor or other officer become surety for any other employé of the Council, or for any work to be done for the Council. And in all cases where security shall be required the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

4. Any one or more of the Standing Orders may be suspended *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the consent of a majority of the Council.
