TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE NEW SOUTH WALES GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES.

In conformity with the provisions of the Public, Works' Loan Acts of the Governor and Council, 19 Victoria, Nos. 13, 25, and 38, Ilis Excellency the Governor General, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to'be notified, that Sealed Tenders, will be received at this Office until noon of Tuesday, the 4th March proximo, from persons desirous of advancing the whole or any portion of the sum of Fifty thousand pounds on the following security, and subject to the undermentioned terms and conditions, viz.—

1. Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must be endorsed, "Tender for Debentures."

2. If the tender be accepted, Debentures for One hundred pounds each, secured on the Consolidated Revenues of New South Wales, will be issued for the sum advanced, and will bear interest at the rate of five per cent, per annum, payable half-yearly, on the 1st of January and 1st of July.
