WARRINGAL CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Warringal:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

the ground or vault is opened.

2. Applications for permission to make a vault or creet a monument in the Cemetery, to be made to the Trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in the schedule A.

3. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, and the person applying produced to the Trustees that the relations

on evidence being produced to the Trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and

charges.

4. The Trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees or some person duly appointed by them.

5. All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and sences, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the

owners.

6. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate or

7. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the Trustees for their approval.
8. In the erection of tablets coper cramps must be used.

9. Wooden fencings allowed, but if not kept in proper repair
may be removed by order of the Trustees.

10. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or
other person appointed by the Trustees, such notice to be
given between the hours of 10 a.m. and sun-set the previous
day.

11. In case an interment is to be made in any private vault
or grave, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left

11. In case an interment is to be made in any private valit or grave, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.

12. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of

giving the order.

13. The procession to arrive at the Cemetery punctually at

13. The procession to arrive at the Cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

14. The usual hours for interment will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st of September to 30th April, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months of the year.

15. A plan of the Cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in Schedule A.

16. Any person wantonly and wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tomb-stone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the Cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished, as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria, No. 12.

17. The Trustees reserve the right to recommend any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
