By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to alter the Laws relative to Jurors and Juries in certain Districts," I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, do hereby direct the Courts of Petty Sessions at the towns of Castlemaine and Sandhurst respectively to cause Jury Lists for the Special Districts heretofore declared and appointed under the said Act, wherein the said towns of Castlemaine and Sandhurst are respectively situated, to be prepared: And I do hereby direct, limit, and appoint, that the Jury List for the said Special District of Castlemaine shall be prepared and published on or before the seventh day of April, now next ensuing, and shall be corrected, revised, and recorded on or before the fourteenth day of the said month of April, and that the Jurors' Book shall be made therefrom on or before the twenty-first day of the said month of April, and that such Jurors' Book shall be brought into use and be used in and for the said District from and after the twenty-eighth day of the said month of April: And I do hereby direct, limit, and appoint, that the Jury List for the said Special District of Sandhurst, shall be prepared and published on or before the seventh day of April now next ensuing, and shall be corrected, revised, and recorded on or before the fourteenth day of the said month of April, and that the Jurors' Book shall be made therefrom on or before the twenty-first day of the said month of April, and that such Jurors' Book shall be brought into use and be used in and for the said District from and after the twenty-eighth day of the said month of April.
