The accounts should be headed, "The Department of Medical," &c. and, after being signed respectively by the claimant and the officer at whose request the attendance was given, should be forwarded to the Chief Medical Officer.

The amount may be paid either at the Treasury in Melbourne, or at one of the Sub-Treasuries, as the claimant may desire.

CONSTRUCTION OF ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH FROM MELBOURNE TO CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST, AND FROM GEEELONG TO BALLAARAT.
