#### PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

The petitioners state that they are householders residing in the town of Belfast, in the county of Villiers, and are desirous of availing themselves of the provisions and advantages of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15.

The petitioners further state that the proposed Municipal District does not contain more than nine square miles, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point thereof, and that more than three hundred householders reside within the proposed district.

#### LOCAL COURT DISTRICTS OF BALLAARAT AND RAGLAN.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, it was declared and appointed that the districts therein named should be Local Court Districts, within the meaning of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "An Act to amend the Laws relating to the Gold Fields," and amongst other things the boundaries of the Local Court District of Ballaarat were in the said Proclamation defined; And whereas it has been deemed expedient to alter the said Local Court District of Ballaarat, and to appoint the portions thereof hereinafter described to be the districts of separate Local Courts respectively: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said Local Court District of Ballaarat, and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby declare and appoint that the districts, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter described, shall be the districts of separate Local

Courts within the meaning of the said Act, and shall be called by the names respectively assigned thereto, that is to say:—

DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT:—Commencing at the source of Emu Creek in the Great Dividing Range; thence eastwards by the Great Dividing Range to the most eastward source of the River Moorabool; thence southwards by the main range dividing the Rivers Moorabool and Werribee to the northern boundary of the Local Court District of Steiglitz; thence by that boundary line to the River Moorabool; thence southwards by the River Moorabool to a point due east of the junction of the Wardy Yaloak and the Naringhil Creek; thence west by that line to the said junction; thence by a line north-westerly to the Gnarket Ponds; thence by the Gnarket Ponds and a line north to Emu Creek; and thence by Emu Creek to the Great Dividing Range, being the commencing point aforesaid. And the said District shall be called "The Local Court District of Ballaarat."

DISTRICT OF RAGLAN:—Commencing at the source of Emu Creek, in the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the most western source of the Fieri Creek; thence by the range dividing the waters of the River Hopkins and Fieri Creek, and a line south to the northern shores of Lake Boloke; thence by the northern and eastern shores of Lake Boloke and a line south-east to the Gnarket Ponds; thence by the Gnarket Ponds and a line north to the Emu Creek; and thence by the Emu Creek to its source in the Great Dividing Range, the commencing point aforesaid. And the said District shall be called "The Local Court District of Raglan."

#### PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO PRAHRAN.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intitled, "An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the said Act shall apply to, and be in force in, the Municipal District of Prahran, the boundaries whereof are set forth and defined in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-third day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled "An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that certain provisions of the said Act relating to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X. in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare to come under the operation of the same respectively or any of them, and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, the sections of the said Act, numbered V., VI., VII., VIII. and IX., were extended to the City of Melbourne, and the country surrounding the corporate boundaries of the said City, and extending a distance of five miles from those

boundaries, and all towns and places within the limits so described, as the same were in the said Proclamation more particularly defined: And whereas the Municipal District of Prahran is comprised within the limits specified in the said Proclamation, and it is deemed expedient also to extend the section of the said Act, numbered X., to the said Municipal District: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, do, by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and appoint that the section of the said Act, being numbered X., shall extend to and be in force within the Municipal District of Prahran, in the county of Bourke, the boundaries whereof are defined in a Proclamation dated the twenty-third day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

BYE-LAWS TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF PRAHRAN.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, 18 Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," section 26, it is enacted, "That it shall be competent for the Council of any Municipal District to make Bye-Laws for the regulation of their own proceedings, the collection of their rates, the conducting of elections and public meetings of the ratepayers, the determining the validity of disputed elections, the prevention and extinguishing of fires, the suppression of nuisances and houses of ill-fame, compelling residents to keep their premises free from offensive or unwholesome matters, the regulation and licensing of porters, public carriers, carriages, water drawers and other public vehicles, regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat, the establishment of slaughter-houses, the regulation of markets, market dues, fairs and sales, the preservation of public decency and public health, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such Municipal District," such Bye-Laws to have force and effect under the 33rd section of the said Act, upon the assent of the Governor of the said Colony having been obtained thereto unto his hand.

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Municipal District of Prahran, That from and after the date of the Governor's assent hereto, the proceedings and business of the said Council shall be conducted according to the following Regulations only, which shall be deemed and called the "Standing Orders" of the said Council, until repealed or altered, that is to say:—

##### CHAP. I.—Order of Proceeding.

1. That the sittings of this Council shall be open to the public, but a majority of the Council may require the expulsion of strangers.
2. At all meetings of the Council the business shall commence so soon as the legal quorum is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of twenty minutes, such circumstance shall be noted (with the names of the members present) in the Minute Book, and the business of such meeting shall lapse.

3. The first business at each meeting of the Council shall be to confirm the Minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon, except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. At all meetings the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, and bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions.

5. All communications presented to the Council must be in the form of Petition or Memorial addressed to the Chairman and Members of the Municipal Council.

6. No motion shall be decided on at any meeting of Council, unless notice in writing, signed by the Councillor proposing, shall have been given at a previous meeting of the Council, nor shall any report of Committee be decided on unless similar notice be given.

7. The orders of the day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of the Council.

8. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the Councillor giving notice be present when called upon, unless by special permission of the Council.

9. No bye-law shall be decided on without due notice (as in case of motions), and copy of proposed bye-laws shall be open in the Council Chambers for inspection of all ratepayers free of charge, or of any person duly qualified to vote at elections under the Act.

10. All business shall be considered in the order in which notice thereof was given, unless by special permission of the Council.

##### CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

11. Any member when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the Chairman, and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down; the member calling to order shall then be heard upon such point of order, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.

12. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment, must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the Council in support thereof.

13. No question once brought before the Council shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council, nor shall any motion be entertained by the Council until the same be seconded.

14. If more than one Councillor rise at the same time, the Chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

15. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment; and after such explanation or reply, the question shall be forthwith put to the vote, but Councillors merely seconding any motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. No Councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion or impute motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

17. The presiding Chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

18. The presiding Chairman shall rise when addressing the Council.

19. Any Councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other Councillor shall, if required by the Chairman, withdraw such expressions and make a satisfactory apology to the Council, under a penalty of not more than ten pounds.

20. Any Councillor may require the Clerk to the Council to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.

21. Any Councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Council bearing on the question under discussion.

22. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment the original motion shall be deemed rejected; and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

23. The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the votes of all Councillors (if a division be called for) shall be entered in the minutes.

24. The Council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of Elections.—See chap. 3, par. 2.

25. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment, but if the question be decided in the negative, the motion then under consideration, or the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be entertained, and any business left undecided shall take precedence at the next meeting of the Council.

26. Any Councillor may record his protest against any decision of the Council, provided the same be made before the next meeting of the Council (in writing), and be couched in respectful language; notice of such intention, however, must be given on the adoption of the resolution.

27. No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year unless a call of the whole Council be duly made for the purpose.

28. That no call of the Council be entertained unless seven clear days, inclusive of the day on which notice shall be given



of making such call, be allowed, and any member who shall without reasonable cause absent himself upon the day on which such call be made shall forfeit a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

29. The Chairman of the Council, when appointed on committees, shall be Chairman thereof, and the Standing Orders of the Council shall be observed in all committees, except as to the number of times limited for speaking.

30. The Clerk to the Council shall have charge of the Common Seal of the Corporation and shall be responsible for the same, and verify each impression by his signature, and shall not affix the same to any document without the order of a majority of the Council; and for using the same to verify documents not belonging to or for the use of the Council shall charge a fee of five shillings.

#### CHAP. III.—Elections.

31. No election to any office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until four clear days notice shall have been given in two or more local daily newspapers, inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year before proceeding to the election.

32. At all such elections the voting shall be (except at that of Chairman of the Council) on cards to be provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name of the candidate he supports, and sign his own. No others will be received; and the Town Clerk shall preserve the same as a record.

33. No Councillor shall have any pecuniary interest in any contract or other work in connection with the Council, nor shall be received as surety for any officer, nor shall any auditor or other officer become security for any other employee of the Council, or for any work to be done for the Council, and in all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

34. Any one or more of the standing orders may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, with the consent of a majority of the Council.
