PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTION.

Beleast.

In pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government has, with the advice of the Executive Council, directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy householders resident in the town of Belfast, in the county of Villiers, together with the names of the petitioners.

By His Excellency's Command, WILLIAM C. HAINES.

The petitioners state that they are householders residing in the town of Belfast, in the county of Villiers, and are desirous of availing themselves of the provisions and advantages of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15.

The petitioners further state that the proposed Municipal District does not contain more than nine square miles, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point thereof, and that more than three hundred householders reside within the proposed district.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will take into favorable consideration the prayer of this their petition, and proclaim the said district of Belfast a Municipal District within the meaning of the Act of Council before mentioned."
