PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

BELFAST.
IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government has, with the advice of the Executive Council, directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy householders resident in the town of Belfast, in the county of Villiers, together with the names of the petitioners.

WILLIAM C. HAINES.

The petitioners state that they are householders residing in the town of Belfast, in the county of Villiers, and are desirous of availing themselves of the provisions and advantages of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15.

The petitioners further state that the proposed Municipal District does not contain more than nine square miles, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point thereof, and that more than three hundred householders reside within the proposed district.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will take into favorable consideration the prayer of this their petition, and proclaim the said district of Belfast a Municipal District within the meaning of the Act of Council before mentioned."

When an adjournment to the next day, at 7:30 p.m., was proposed by Mr. Miller and seconded by Mr. Bartlett, and upon a show of hands being taken, declared adjourned accordingly.

Saturday, 19th April, 1856.

Pursuant to adjournment, a meeting was held this day, when the remaining candidates, Messrs. Little, Britten, Paul Miller, H. Johnson, Butler, Stillman, Masters, H. St. John Clarke, Farrell, and Snelgrove, addressed the electors.

The meeting then proceeded to the election of councillors, and upon a show of hands being taken, Messrs. D. S. Campbell, Henry Miller, Philip Johnson, W. B. Burnley, Wm. Little, and James Farrell, were declared to have a majority, and Messrs. F. J. Bartlett and A. E. Butler an equality of votes.

It was then decided that a poll should be taken at the Assembly Rooms, Swan-street, on the following Monday, the 21st April, at eight o'clock a.m., and to close at four o'clock p.m.

Monday, 21st April, 1856.

The poll commenced at eight o'clock a.m. this day, and closed at four o'clock p.m., during which period nine hundred electors recorded their votes.

The votes were taken by cards and voting papers, filled up and signed with the name and qualification of each elector. The cards or voting papers were first publicly handed over to Mr. Matthews, one of the assessors, who numbered and declared the same aloud, he then handed them to the Chairman, who initialed them and handed them to be filed by the other assessor, Mr. Henderson. The votes were also registered consecutively by the poll clerks, John Alfred Wild and George M. Roddy.
