MINING COMMISSION.

His Excellency Major-General Macarthur, the Senior Military
Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of
Victoria, &c., &c. in Council.

To Frederick McCoy, Esquire, Professor of Natural Science in the University of Melbourne, Fellow of the

Geological Society of London, Honorary Fellow of the Cambridge Philosophical Society, &c., JOSEPH ANDERSON PANTON, Esquire, Resident Warden at Sandhurst, in the said Colony, and Alfred Richard Cecil Selwyn, Esquire, Geological Surveyor of the said Colony,

Whereas it is deemed expedient to collect accurate information regarding the physical features of the Colony of Victoria, and its geological and mineralogical character, and to examine into the position and mode of occurrence of gold and other mineral deposits therein, the modes of working or procuring and treating the ores,

occurrence of gold and other mineral deposits therein, the modes of working or procuring and treating the ores, and to collect specimens illustrative of the geological structure and mineral character of each locality:

Now Know ye that We, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, confiding much in your fidelity, scientific knowledge, and ability, do by these Presents constitute and appoint you Frederick McCoy, Joseph Anderson Panton, and Alfred Richard Cecil Selwyn, to be our Commissioners for the purposes herein mentioned:

And We do by these presents commission you to examine and ascertain, 1stly, the physical features of the said Colony; 2ndly, the geological characters of the solid rocks and drifts in gold regions; 3rdly, the mineral character of solid rocks and drifts; 4thly, the position and mode of occurrence of gold and other minerals of economic value, whether in drift or solid rock; 5thly, the modes of working or procuring and treating the ores.

And to the end that these several purposes may be accomplished in the most efficient and practical manner, We do by these Presents commission you to obtain and furnish, 6thly, vertical sections of shafts with measurements, lithological descriptions, and drawings on a scale of forty feet to one inch; 7thly, horizontal sections through the greatest number of shafts, on a smaller scale; 8thly, descriptions and drawings to scale of machinery and implements in use; 9thly, a suite of specimens from each district illustrative of the geological structure and mineral character of the leadity.

And We do by these Presents further commission you to report separately on each mining district, defining the same by natural features, as river basins or drainage areas; a map shewing the physical features and geological characters of each district to accompany the Report.

And We do by these Presents constitute and appoint you FREDERICK McCov to be the Chairman of Our

And We do hereby grant unto you our said Commissioners power and authority to call before you such persons by whom you may be the better informed upon the subject of this Our Commission, and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers and records, as may afford the fullest information

on the subject, and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And for your further assistance in the execution of the premises We do hereby appoint JACOB BRACHE,
Esquire, to be Secretary and Mechanical Draftsman to this our Commission, whose services you may use as occasion may require.

And We do hereby direct and appoint that you do report to the Surveyor General of Victoria, in writing under your hands and seals, your proceedings, and also your opinions on the subject herein referred to you; and that you do also report, from time to time, to the said Surveyor General, in writing under your hands, the progress you are making in the execution of this our Commission.

And lastly, We do by these Presents ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners or any two of you may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time

by adjournment.

In witness whereof we have hereunto affixed the Scal of the Colony, at the Government Offices in Melbourne, this second day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

THE accompanying Convention between Her Majesty and the Emperor of Japan, for regulating the admission of British Ships into the Port of Japan, together with the Regulations in force for the Port of Nagasaki, are published for general information.

Convention between Her Majesty and the Emperor of Japan, signed at Nagasaki, in the English and Japanese languages, 14th October, 1854.—Ratifications exchanged at Nagasaki, 9th October, 1855.

Convention for Regulating the Admission of British Ships into the Ports of Japan,

INTO THE PORTS OF JAPAN.

It is agreed between Sir James Stirling, Knight, Rear-Admiral, and Commander-in-Chief of the ships and vessels of Her Britannic Majesty in the East Indies and seas adjacent, and Mezi-no Chekfa-no Kami, Obunyo of Nagasaki, and Nagai Lvan Ocho, Omedski of Nagasaki, ordered by His Imperial Highness the Emperor of Japan to act herein, that:

1st. The ports of Nagasaki (Fisen) and Hakodadi (Matsmai) shall be open to British ships for the purposes of effecting repairs, and obtaining fresh water, provisions, and other supplies of any sort they may absolutely want for the use of the ships.

2nd. Nagasaki shall be open for the purposes aforesaid from and after the present date, and Hakodadi from and after the end of fifty days from the Admiral's departure from this port. The rules and regulations of each of these ports are to be complied

3rd. Only ships in distress from weather, or unmanageable, will be permitted to enter other ports than those specified in the foregoing Articles, without permission from the Imperial Government.

4th. British ships in Japanese ports shall conform to the laws of Japan. If high officers or commanders of ships shall break any such laws, it will lead to the ports being closed. Should inferior persons break them, they are to be delivered over to the commanders of their ships for punishment.

5th. In the ports of Japan, either now open, or which may hereafter be opened, to the ships or subjects of any foreign nation, British ships and subjects shall be entitled to admission, and to the enjoyment of an equality of advantages with those of the most favoured nation, always excepting the advantages accruing to the Dutch and Chinese from their existing relations with Japan.

Exposition of the Articles of the Convention of Nagasaki of the 14th of October, 1854, agreed to on the 18th of October, 1855, by their Excellencies the Rear-Admiral Commanding-in-Chief and the Japanese Commissioners.

· 1st. "The ports of Nagasaki (Fisen) and Hakodadi (Matsmai) shall be open to British ships for the purposes of effecting repairs, and obtaining fresh water, provisions, and other supplies of any sort they may absolutely want for the use of the ships."

Exposition.

The first Article of the Congranding of Nagasaki and Hakodadi to British ships for repairs and supplies. It opens the whole and every part of those ports; but ships must be guided in anchoring by the directions of the local Government. Safe and convenient places will be assigned where ships may be repaired. Workmen, materials, and supplies will be provided by the local Government according to a tariff to be agreed upon, by which also the modes of payment will be regulated. All official communications will hereafter, when Japanese shall have time to learn English, be made in that language. A British burial-ground shall be set apart on Medsume Sima, fenced in by a stone wall, and properly protected. Exposition.

"Nagasaki shall be open for the purposes aforesaid from and after the present date; and Hakodadi from and after the end of fifty days from the Admiral's doparture from this port. The rules and regulations of each of these ports are to be complied with."

3rd. "Only ships in distress from weather, or unmanageable, will be permitted to enter other ports that those specified in the foregoing Articles, without permission from the Imperial Government."

The second Article provides that at each of the ports of Nagasaki and Hakodadi the Port Regulations shall be obeyed; but the Japanese Government will take care that they shall not be of a nature to create embarrassment, nor to contra-dict in any other way the general tenour and intent of the Treaty, the main object of which is to promote a friendly inter-course between Great Britain

The third Article declares that only ships in distress from weather, or unmanageable, shall enter other ports than Nagasaki and Hakodadi without permission from the Imperial Government; but ships of war have a general right to enter the ports of friendly Powers in the unavoidable performance of public duties, which right can neither be waived nor restricted; but Her Majesty's ships will not enter any other than open ports without necessity, or without offering proper explanations to The third Article declares that without necessity, or without offering proper explanations to the Imperial authorities,

The fourth Article provides that British ships and subjects in Japanese ports shall conform to the laws of Japan; and that if any subordinate British subjects commit offences against the laws, they shall be handed over to their own officers for punishment; and that if high officers or commanders of ships shall break the laws, it will lead to the closing of the ports specified.

All this is as it should be; but it is not intended by this Article that any acts of individuals, whether high or low, previously unauthorised or subsequently disapproved of by Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain, can set aside the Convention entered

The fifth Article secures in the fullest sense to British ships

and subjects in every port of Japan, either now open or here-after to be opened, an equality in point of advantage and accom-modation with the ships and subjects or citizens of any other

subjects or citizens of any other foreign nation, excepting any peculiar privilege hitherto conceded to the Dutch and Chinese in the port of Nagasaki. If therefore any other nation or people be now or hereafter permitted to enter other ports than Nagaski and Hakodadi, or to appoint Consuls, or to open trade, or to enjoy any advantage or privilege whatever, British ships and subjects shall, as of right, enter upon the enjoyment of the same.

An arrangement made subsequently to the Convention requires that British ships intending to visit Japan, shall be provided with a document in proof of their nationality, and as a check upon the conduct of vessels in Japanese ports; and Her Majesty's Government has directed a form of certificate of registration to be adopted\(^*\) which has been accepted as satisfactory by the Japanese authorities; and merchant ships arriving in Japanese ports are to submit their certificate of registration to the officers to be appointed by the Japanese authorities, and to permit them to make such extracts from it as may seem good to them, before such ships can be admitted to obtain repairs and supplies. Her Majesty's slips of war will not be provided with such documents; but the officers in command, upon proper application, will afford all reasonable information regarding their ships.
