EXEMPTED BUILDINGS AT SANDHURST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any Municipal Council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not created or constructed by such Municipal Council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such Municipal Council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt certain buildings from the jurisdiction of the Council of the Municipal District of Sandhurst: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation except from the jurisdiction of the Municipal Council of Sandhurst the following buildings, situate and being within the said Municipal District, that is to say:—

- The Buildings used as places of Public Worship by the—
- Wesleyan Methodist Society—one in High-street, one in Forest-street, one in Napier-street.
- Members of the Church of England—one in Mackenzie-street one in Napier-street.
- Members of the Jewish Synagogue—one in Dowling-street.
- Members of the Presbyterian Church—one in Myers-street.
- Members of the Congregational Church—one in Epsom-road.
- The Buildings used as schoolhouses by—
- Members of the Church of England—one in Mackenzie-street.
- Board of National Education—one in Napier-street.
- The Building used as a school-house and place of worship by Members of the Roman Catholic Church in McCrae-street.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventh day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to declare that tolls should be payable and collected at any punt or ferry which should be constructed, repaired, or supported at the public expense, and that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the tolls to be payable at such punts and ferries; And whereas the Punt or Ferry for crossing the river Loddon, at Newstead, on the road from Castlemaine to the Avoca and Adelaide has been constructed at the public expense: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, by virtue of the power and authority by the said Act in me vested, and of all other authority enabling me in this behalf, do by this my Proclamation declare that tolls shall be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry for crossing the river Loddon, at Newstead, on the road leading from Castlemaine to the Avoca and thence to Adelaide, and with the advice of the Executive Council I do hereby declare that the following tolls, and no higher, shall be payable and collected at the said punt or ferry, that is to say—
