WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenaut Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference, by any Municipal Council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such Municipal Council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such Municipal Council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt certain buildings from the jurisdiction of the Council of the Municipal District of Sandhurst: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation except from the jurisdiction of the Municipal Council of Sandhurst the following buildings, situate and being within the said Municipal District, that is to say:— District, that is to say :--

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor by Proclamation in the Government Gazette to declare that tolks should be payin the Government Gazette to declare that tolls should be payable and collected at any punt or ferry which should be constructed, repaired, or supported at the public expense, and that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare the tolls to be payable at such punts and ferries; And whereas the Punt or Ferry for crossing the river Loddon, at Newstead, on the road from Castlemaine to the Avoca and Adelaide has been constructed at the public expense: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, by virtue of the power and authority by the said Act in me vested, and of all other authority enabling me in this behalf, do by this my Proclamation declare that tolls shall be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry for crossing the river Loddon, at Newstead, on the road leading from Castlemaine to the Avoca and thence to Adelaide, and with the advice of the Executive Council I do hereby declare that the following tolls, and no higher, shall be payable and collected at the said punt or ferry, that is to say or ferry, that is to say-

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

BELFAST.

The petitioners state that they are householders residing in the town of Belfast, in the county of Villiers, and are desirous of availing themselves of the provisions and advantages of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15.

The petitioners further state that the proposed Municipal District does not contain more than nine square miles, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point thereof, and that more than three hundred householders reside within the proposed district.

And the petitioners pray as follows :-

"That your Excellency will take into favorable considera-tion the prayer of this their petition, and proclaim the said district of Belfast a Municipal District within the meaning of the Act of Council before mentioned."
