QUARANTINE—MAURITIUS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government that the disease called Cholera prevails at the Island of Mauritius: Now therefore I, Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, in pursuance of the power in me vested, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and direct that all ships and vessels arriving in this Colony from the said Island of Mauritius, on board of which the disease called Cholera shall be at, or shall have appeared previous to, the arrival thereof in this Colony from the said Island, and the crews and passengers of such ships and vessels, shall in every case perform Quarantine for a period of not less than thirty clear days from the convalescence of the last case of Cholera; and if no case of Cholera shall have appeared on board of such ships and vessels, nevertheless such ships and vessels, and the crews and passengers on board thereof, shall perform Quarantine for a period of three clear days.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
