HALF-YEARLY SURVEY FOR HIGH AND LOW PRESSURE STEAM VESSELS.

NOTICE is hereby given that under the fifth clause of the above cited Act the owner of every steam vessel employed as stated is bound to have the vessel and the whole of her machinery surveyed by the Engineer and Shipwright Surveyors appointed for that purpose by the Victoria Steam Navigation Board, in the manner and at the times following—

Low Pressure.—Vessel and machinery—June and December.
High Pressure.—Vessel—June and December.
" Machinery—March, June, September, and December.
