EXTENSION OF THE WHOLESALE SPIRIT ACT TO KYNETON.

**H**IS Excellency the Officer administering the Government has been pleased to declare the Town of Kyneton, the boundaries of which are specified below, to come under the operation of the 3rd clause of the Act of Council, 13 Victoria, No. 29, so as to constitute it a place at which fermented or spirituous liquor or any mixed liquor part of which is fermented or spirituous may be sold in quantities of not less than two gallons at one time.

The Notice of the 2nd December, 1852, is hereby cancelled.

BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF KYNETON, INCLUDING EAST KYNETON.

Commencing at the north-east angle of Suburban portion XVIII parish of Lauriston; thence south by the west side of a Government Road to the River Campaspe; thence following the course of the Campaspe westward and northward to the north-west angle of the Township Reserve of Kyneton; and thence by a line bearing east to the commencing point aforesaid.
