MUNICIPALITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SUM OF FOUR THOUSAND POUNDS GRANTED OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE FOR THE YEAR 1856 TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted, that every work proposed to be executed by any Municipal Council by funds raised by aid from the Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be the subject of a distinct and separate Bye-law: And whereas by the Act of Council, 19 Victoria, No. 17, being the Act for the appropriation of the Revenue for 1856, the sum of Four thousand pounds is granted to the Municipal Council of Williamstown subject to the conditions of the first recited Act: Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Municipal District of Williamstown, that the said sum of Four thousand pounds shall be expended in the forming, metalling and repairing of the following streets in Williamstown, and in the following order, viz.:—First, Nelson-parade; secondly, Ann-street; thirdly, Thompson-street; fourthly, Cole-street; fifthly, Little Nelson-street south; sixthly, Cecil-street south; seventhly, a portion of Hammer-street, between Ann-street and Thompson-street; eighthly, Parker-street; ninthly, Ferguson-street; tenthly, Little Nelson-street north; eleventhly, James-street; twelfthly, Stevedore-street; thirteenthly, Dover-road; and fourteenthly, Douglas-parade.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 5, made by the Municipal Council of Williamstown, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—A BYE-LAW TO PREVENT THE NUISANCES ARISING FROM SUFFERING CATTLE TO BE AT LARGE IN THE STREETS AND OTHER UNENCLOSED PLACES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT.

WHEREAS an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria was passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," whereby it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be competent for the Council of any Municipal District to make Bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of the public health, and the general good rule and government of such Municipal District, and that no such Bye-law should have any force or effect until the Lieutenant Governor should under his hand have signified his assent thereto; and when such Bye-law should have been consented to, the Lieutenant-Governor should cause publicity to be given thereto in such manner as he should see fit: And whereas it is expedient to make a Bye-law for the more certain prevention of the nuisance occasioned from cattle being allowed to be at large in the streets and unenclosed places within the limits of the said Municipal District: And whereas the said Bye-law has been approved of by His Excellency, and His Excellency has caused the same to be duly published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas the formalities of the said recited Act have been duly complied with: Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the said Municipality in Council assembled, that from and after the date of this Bye-law coming into operation, it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer any kind of swine, or any horse,

ass, mule, sheep, goat, or other cattle belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large in any street or public place, or in any unenclosed place within the said Municipal District, whether the same be or not public property; and any person who shall so offend, shall on conviction before two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty Shillings.

The foregoing Bye-Law, No. 6, made by the Municipal Council of Ballaarat, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government.

MUNICIPALITY OF PORTLAND.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—A BYE-LAW FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," the Council of any Municipal District is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to the fair average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound.

Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Municipal District of Portland, that a rate for the current year of One shilling in the pound on all property in houses and lands within the limits of the Municipal District be imposed and levied.

The foregoing Bye-Law, No. 2, made by the Municipal Council of Portland, has been assented to by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government.

NOTICE TO MASTERS OF VESSELS FREQUENTING THE PORT OF KAIPARA.

The positions of, and bearings from the two large buoys, laid down on the 5th instant, in the main channel entrance to this harbor, are—

The buoy on the inner point of the outer spit to the northward of the main channel may be seen in clear weather at a distance of 3 miles from sea; it is painted red, but without a globe beacon at top. The triangular tuft on the South Head bears by compass from it S.E. and East $\frac{1}{2}$ East, distant about 5 miles; and the centre green patch on the North Head N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ East, distant 6 miles. It is laid down in five fathoms water, the width of the channel on the N.E. being about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile. Vessels should pass on the north-east side if possible, but if obliged to do so on the south-west, not further than half a ship's length from the buoy. The Tory Shoal buoy is visible on rounding the outer buoy at a distance of two miles, to which the course given in Captain Drury's directions will lead: it is in 7 fathoms, and should be rounded only on the south-west side, where the fairway is at least a mile in width. From this buoy the bearing by compass of the triangular tuft on the South Head is S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., and of the centre green patch on the North Head at N.E. by E. This buoy is also red, but with a globe beacon on the top.
