## ADDITIONAL GENERAL SESSIONS FOR BUNINYONG AND BALLAARAT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of December, A.D. One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the times and places for holding the several Courts of General Sessions then existing in the said Colony were declared and appointed; And whereas it is expedient to appoint, in addition to the said times, another time for holding the Court undermentioned: Now therefore I, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby appoint, in addition to the times already appointed, that the Court of General Sessions hereinafter mentioned shall be holden at the place and time following; that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions for Buninyong and Ballaarat, at Ballaarat, on the first day of September now next ensuing.

And I do hereby further declare and appoint that if the Chairman of the said Court of General Sessions shall not arrive at the said place in time to open such Court on the day so appointed as aforesaid, such Court may be opened and held on any day or days following such day so appointed as aforesaid.

## TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT, SECTIONS V. TO IX., EXTENDED TO BALLAARAT MUNICIPALITY AND EASTERN VICINITY.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Lieutenant Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the tenth day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the section numbered X. of a certain Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, "An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria," was extended to the township of Ballaarat, the boundaries whereof were set forth in the said Proclamation; And whereas it is deemed expedient to extend the operation of the sections numbered consecutively from V. to IX. (both inclusively) of the Act aforesaid to the Municipal District of Ballaarat, and a portion of land traversed by the main road outside of the said District: Now therefore I, Major-General MACARTHUR, the Senior Military Officer and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, in pursuance of the authority of the said Act do by this my Proclamation declare and appoint that the sections of the said Act numbered V., VI., VII., VIII. and IX. shall extend to and operate within the District the boundaries whereof are hereinafter set forth, including therein the Municipal District of Ballaarat and a portion of land traversed by the main road lying beyond the eastern limits of the last named District; that is to say:—Com-

mencing at the north-east angle of allotment 1 of section A. parish of Ballaarat; thence by a line bearing east one mile twenty-two chains and eight links to a marked post; thence by a line bearing south to the River Yarrowee; thence by a line bearing east sixty chains; thence by a line bearing south to a point due east of the southern boundary of the Municipal District of Ballaarat; thence by a line bearing west to the south-western angle of the said Municipal District; thence by a line bearing north one mile four chains and forty links to the western boundary of the Police Paddock; thence by the western and northern boundaries of the said Police Paddock to the north-west angle of allotment 2 of section C in the parish of Ballaarat aforesaid; and thence by a line bearing east, being the south side of a Government road, to the commencing point aforesaid.

And I do hereby further declare that the said Proclamation of the tenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, extending the section of the said Act numbered X. to the district in the said Proclamation defined, shall remain unaltered.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
