LOCAL COURT REGULATION.

AVOCA.

REGULATION made by the Local Court of the district of Avoca:—

CHAP. II.—CLASS A.—DRY SINKINGS.

VI. *Extent of claim in dry sinkings.*—The extent of claim in dry sinkings shall be—

For one miner twelve (12) by twenty-four (24) feet.

For two miners twenty-four (24) by twenty-four (24) feet.

For three miners twenty-four (24) by thirty-six (36) feet.

For four miners twenty-four (24) by forty-eight (48) feet.

The regulation of the Avoca Local Court, No. 11. of chap. II, gazetted on the 19th June, 1857, is hereby annulled.

The foregoing Regulation, No. vi. of chap. II, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

HEATHCOTE.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Heathcote:—

XXVIII. *Flooded claims, how dealt with.*—When any two or more sluicing claims communicating with each other in such a manner that water can pass from one claim to the other shall be flooded with water, either from natural drainage or other causes, it shall be competent for the owners of any claim so flooded to call upon the warden to enquire into the matter, and after forty-eight (48) hours notice has been given by such claimholders (either by personal service or public notice posted on the spot), it shall be competent for the warden to make such order relative to the joint pumping or bailing of any claim as to him shall appear proper.

XXIX. *Quartz claims.*—The extent of claim to which each miner's right shall entitle the holder shall be:—For one miner twenty (20) feet, for two miner's forty (40) feet, for three miners sixty (60) feet, for four miners eighty (80) feet, for five miners one hundred (100) feet, and for six miners one hundred and twenty (120) feet, than which no greater area shall be allowed.

The local court regulation No. VI., assented to on the 15th February, 1856, is hereby annulled.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. XXVIII. and XXIX. have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

WARANGA.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the district of Waranga:—

XXII. *Prospectors of quartz reefs, &c.*—Any miner or party of miners desirous of prospecting a quartz reef, will be allowed thirty (30) working days for that purpose prior to leasing (application for a lease to be made at the next sitting of the No. 100.—SEPTEMBER 1st, 1857.—1.

Local Court after expiration of the said thirty days), provided the said miner or party of miners deposits with the clerk of Local Court an open statement, in writing, under date, of his or their intention, naming as accurately as possible the locality and extent of ground proposed to be leased (in event of a payable reef being found); a copy of the same to be posted in a conspicuous position on the claim. Forty-eight (48) hours absence from the claim to be sufficient evidence of abandonment, except in cases as provided for in clause seven (VII.) of these regulations.

Regulation No. IX., of Waranga Local Court, gazetted on the 19th December, 1856, is hereby annulled.

XXIII. *Damage to roads.*—No person or persons shall mine, undermine, or excavate on or within eight feet of any road or cart-track, or in any manner obstruct or damage the same without a written permission from the warden of the district, and any person or persons having obtained such permission shall erect a fence of timber or other material sufficient for the protection of life and property.

Regulation No. IV., of Waranga Local Court, gazetted on the 17th October, 1856, is hereby annulled.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. XXII. and XXIII., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

LOCAL COURT REGULATION.

YACKANDANDAH.

REGULATION made by the Local Court of the district of Yackandandah:—

XX. *Measurement of sluice heads of water.*—A ground sluice-head of water shall measure twelve inches in width and three inches in depth; a gauge-box constructed with as many orifices twelve inches by three inches as the race contain sluice-heads, with half an inch head and three inches drop, shall be placed not more than fifty yards from the head of the race with a waste gate six feet in length at least, to be placed adjoining the gauge-box, and set at the same level.

The foregoing Regulation, No. XX., has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

KYNETON.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-six householders of the town of Kyneton, in the county of Dalhousie.

The petitioners state that the town of Kyneton has of late vastly increased in population and importance, and may now be classed among the most flourishing inland towns in Victoria.

That it is contained within an area of nine square miles, and comprises a population of householders of one hundred and fifty and upwards, and that no one point in such area is distant more than six miles from any other point.

That several local improvements and institutions are being introduced into the said town, as lighting it with gas, and the petitioners believe that it would tend materially to the stability, progress and improvement of the town if it were constituted a municipal district.

That a considerable portion of the roads and streets of the town are still unformed, and owing to the rich alluvial soil are almost impassable in the wet season, and the petitioners are desirous of metalling, lighting and draining the same.

And the petitioners pray as follows :—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency may be pleased to take into your favorable consideration the subject matter of this petition, and to declare by Your Excellency's proclamation the town a municipal district, according to the proclaimed boundary of the town of Kyneton, under the name of 'The Kyneton Municipal District,' pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

RICHMOND MUNICIPALITY.

SECOND PETITION FOR ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 13 Victoria No. 15,
 His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the
 Executive Council, has directed the publication of the sub-
 stance and prayer of a petition as hereinafter set forth, signed
 by two hundred and eight householders resident within the
 municipal district of Richmond.

The petitioners state that by a Proclamation bearing date
 18th February, 1857, the boundaries of the municipal district
 of Richmond were declared to be as follow:—"Commencing
 at a point in the centre of Victoria street due north of the
 eastern boundary of Hoddle street; thence by a line passing
 through the centre of Victoria street, and produced thence due
 east to the River Yarra; thence by the western and northern
 banks of the River Yarra to the Punt road; and thence by the
 eastern side of the Punt road and Hoddle street to the com-
 mencing point."

That the Punt road and Hoddle street from the Yarra to
 Victoria street are at present within the city of Melbourne,
 but have hitherto been under the control and management of
 the Central Road Board.

That several of the petitioners represented to the municipal
 council of Richmond the impassable condition of Hoddle street,
 and were informed that that street being beyond the municipal
 limits, the council could not legally expend its funds in
 making it.

That applications have also been made to the Central Road
 Board and the Government by the municipal council and by
 the inhabitants of the district respecting the state of Hoddle
 street, and the petitioners are informed that it has been arranged
 between the Government and the municipal council to place
 the control and management of the Punt road and Hoddle
 street, and also of the Richmond punt, in the hands of the mu-
 nicipal council.

That they are desirous that such arrangement should be at
 once carried into effect, Hoddle street being impassable, and
 access to the premises adjoining it nearly impracticable, and
 all the residents on the eastern side of that street being rated
 in the municipal district.

That in order to enable the municipal council to apply its
 funds to making or repairing the said road and street, they are
 informed the municipal boundaries will require to be altered so
 as to include such road and street; and in order to give the
 council the proper control and management of the punt, a por-

tion of the road on the south side of the Yarra opposite the
 punt should also be included within the municipal boundary.

Lastly, that the area of the municipal district, if extended as
 proposed, will still not be nine square miles.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the limits and
 boundaries of the municipal district of Richmond may be ex-
 tended to the western side of the Punt road and Hoddle street,
 between the north side of the River Yarra and the south
 side of Victoria street, and thence further north across Victoria
 street to a point parallel with the commencing point referred
 to in the before-mentioned Proclamation of 18th February,
 1857, and thence east to such commencing point, and that the
 boundary may be extended to the south side of the river, so as
 to include so much of the road there opposite the punt as may
 be necessary (say one square chain) for the proper working the
 punt and collecting the tolls."

MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—FOR REGULATING THE DRIVING OF UNBROKEN HORSES AND CATTLE INTO, THROUGH AND OUT OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BEECHWORTH, AND FOR PREVENTING THE BREAKING IN OF HORSES IN ANY OF THE SURVEYED STREETS OR ROADS THEREOF.

WHEREAS great danger and inconvenience arises to the public of this municipality from the existing practice of driving mobs of horses and cattle (unbroken and otherwise) through the streets at all hours of the day, and from the breaking in of horses within the township: Be it, and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, that no horses or cattle intended for sale or slaughter, or when passing from one part of the country to another, shall be driven into, through or out of this municipality, excepting between the hours of Three (3) o'clock p.m. and Nine (9) o'clock a.m., from May to August inclusive in each year, and between the hours of Five (5) o'clock p.m. and Eight (8) o'clock a.m., from September to April inclusive in each year, unless secured by bridle, halter, or yoke; and also, that no horse shall, at any time whatever, be broken in, or raced, in any surveyed street, road or lane within this municipality. And any person who shall drive, or cause to be driven, any horses or cattle into, through or out of this municipality (except within the time prescribed by this bye-law) shall forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Ten shillings for every horse or head of cattle so driven. And any person who shall, at any time whatever, break in or race, or cause to be broken in or raced, any horse within any of the surveyed streets, roads or lanes of this municipality contrary to this bye-law, shall, for the first such offence, forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Twenty shillings, and for every second or other subsequent such offence, shall forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

This bye-law to come into and be in full force and operation from and after fourteen days from its being gazetted, as assented to by His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—FOR COMPELLING INHABITANTS OF THIS MUNICIPALITY TO KEEP THEIR PREMISES FREE FROM OFFENSIVE AND UNWHOLESOME MATTER, AND FOR RESTRAINING NOISOME, OFFENSIVE AND UNHEALTHY TRADES, AND FOR OTHERWISE PRESERVING THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

WHEREAS the health and comfort of the inhabitants of this municipality generally demand that all premises therein should be kept free from obnoxious and offensive matters, and also that offensive trades should be restrained: Be it and it is hereby ordered and directed by the municipal council of Beechworth that any person who shall, from the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of this colony, allow any animal, vegetable or other matter, or any skins or hides, or any rubbish whatever to accumulate upon, or in front of their premises, or in the rights-of-way or lanes bordering or abutting thereon, or who shall burn any bones, rubbish or animal or vegetable matter, or melt tallow, or render down fat, offal or refuse of any kind, or for any purpose soever, so as in any of the cases aforesaid to be a nuisance to the neighbourhood, or who shall throw upon any street, road, lane or path in the municipality any bones, rubbish or any animal or vegetable matter, or who shall carry on any manufacture, business or calling whatsoever which shall be deemed by the municipal council, or their appointed officer, to be offensive to the surrounding neighbourhood, or injurious to the public health, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, excepting only such cases of offensive trades as are being carried on under a special permission from the said municipal council.

For the purposes of this bye-law the occupiers of premises shall be deemed liable to the penalty herein set forth.

Erection of a substantial bridge over the Kilmore Creek, in Mill street.

Cutting an embankment in Mill street.

Forming, making, pitching and metalling 6 chains 20 links of Mill street.

Forming, making, pitching and metalling 14 chains of Union street, and cutting and forming 10 chains of Union street.

Forming, filling and pitching 4 chains of Mitchell street.

Forming and cutting 9 chains 50 links of Foot street.

Forming and cutting 11 chains 34 links of Bourke street.

Forming, making, pitching and metalling 1 chain 25 links of Victoria street.

Cutting and forming 2 chains of Albert street.

Cutting and forming 2 chains of Fitz Roy street.

Forming and making 2 chains of George street.

Forming and making 9 chains 80 links of Gipps street. The length of pathways formed is 32 chains 68 links, and of paved water drains 31 chains. The above works are all completed, or very nearly so.

The Central Road Board have, at the request of the council, inserted a culvert across Sydney street, at the junction of Mill street.

The council have it in contemplation to devote a portion of the money at their disposal to the kerbing and channelling of Sydney street, under such regulations as they may deem advisable to adopt.

The erection of a weighbridge, so soon as a suitable site can be obtained, has been determined upon.

Measures have been taken for the purchase of a fire engine. The council have agreed to pay one moiety of the expense provided the other moiety be raised by private subscription.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been framed by the council, viz.:-

No. 3.—For the suppression of nuisances, and to regulate noisome and offensive trade, and to preserve the public health.

No. 4.—To regulate the deposit of night-soil, manure, or other offensive refuse.

No. 5.—To regulate the licensing of public carters and nightmen.

No. 6.—For the prevention of fires, and to enforce the cleansing of chimney flues.

No. 7.—For the appropriation of the sum of Two thousand pounds, granted out of the public revenue to the municipality of Kilmore.

No. 8.—To prevent the nuisance arising from suffering cattle to be at large in the streets and other unenclosed places within the municipality of Kilmore.

The foregoing bye-laws were assented to by His Excellency the Governor on the 19th June, 1857.

The following bye-law, No. 9, has been adopted and transmitted for the consideration of His Excellency, viz.:-“For the appropriation of a second sum of Two thousand pounds, granted out of the public revenue for the year 1857, to the municipality of Kilmore.”

CORPORATE SEAL.

His Excellency the Governor has given his assent to the design for the above, adopted by the municipal council, viz., in addition to the Royal arms of England, the motto “Semper pro bono publico,” the device of a plough and a wheat-sheaf, and the words, “Kilmore Municipality, Victoria.” It is now in the hands of the engraver.

PUBLIC POUND.

The local bench were more than once communicated with requesting that an order might be made for the removal of the public pound to a more convenient site, and on the 16th of June an order to that effect was made. Believing that to be sufficient, the council have ceased to move in the matter, presuming that the necessary steps to give effect to the order alluded to have since been taken.

PETITION.

A petition, signed by thirty-two ratepayers, praying that Union street, between Melbourne and Sydney streets, might be opened up, was received and referred to the district surveyor, whose report thereon was published in the local paper.

An address was presented to His Excellency the Governor on the occasion of his passing through Kilmore *en route* to Beechworth.

MUNICIPAL REFORM.

The necessity for the amendment of the existing Municipal Act has for some time past engaged the attention of the council. They are now in a position to transmit through the proper channel various suggestions, which they hope will be embodied in the amended act about to be submitted to the Legislative Assembly.

TOWN HERD.

Peter Campbell was appointed to the charge of the town herd on the 24th of April last, subject to such regulations as the council might from time to time deem it necessary to adopt.

In concluding this report the council desire to express it as their opinion that much of the success which has attended the measures undertaken by them for the improvement of the town must be attributed to the steady co-operation of the ratepayers. They hope that a state of things so desirable may be maintained, as it is their earnest desire to exercise the trust reposed in them by their fellow townsmen for the advancement of this important municipality.
