SPIRIT MERCHANTS.

THE attention of wine and spirit merchants is called to the fifth clause of the Act 20 Victoria No. 4, by which the meaning of "spirit merchant" is defined as being "any vendor of duty-paid spirituous liquors, or of duty-paid wine, or of fermented malt liquors, in quantities respectively not less than two gallons."

All persons to whom the notice applies are hereby cautioned that unless they forthwith register themselves as spirit merchants, and pay the fee as required by the above recited Act, they will be proceeded against as the law directs.

TRANSFERABLE DEBENTURES.—PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST PAYABLE ONLY IN MELBOURNE.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct that sealed tenders be invited, to be received at the Treasury, Melbourne, until Noon of the 28th instant, from persons desirous to advance the whole or any portion of the sum of Thirty-three thousand pounds sterling, secured by debentures to be issued by the Treasurer, under authority of the Act of Council 13 Victoria No. 40, as follows:—

200 due 1st January, 1867.
133 due 1st January, 1868.

These debentures were originally redeemable in 1857 and 1858 respectively, but as they had remained unsold, and had for the most part lapsed through effluxion of time, the dates have been extended to 1867 and 1868, and the debentures now form the final issue of the Water Works Loan.

1st. Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must state the year in which the tenderer wishes the debentures he tenders for to be payable.

2nd. The tenders must be sealed, and endorsed, "Tender for Government Debentures," and addressed to the Treasurer.

3rd. Should the tender be accepted, debentures in the form set forth in the schedule A to the said Act will be issued for One hundred pounds (£100) each, secured upon the general revenue of the colony of Victoria, and made a first charge thereon, and will bear interest from the 1st July, 1857, at the rate of Six pounds (£6) per centum per annum, payable half-yearly, on the 1st January and the 1st July, the first payment of such interest being due on the 1st January, 1858.

4th. The debentures will be made payable to the holders, and will pass by delivery without assignment or endorsement.

5th. The amount tendered, if accepted, together with the accrued interest from the 1st July, 1857, must be paid in cash within forty-eight hours after acceptance shall have been notified to the tenderers.

6th. No tender below par will be entertained, and the Government will not necessarily accept the highest nor indeed any tender.

7th. The tenders will be opened publicly at the time and place above specified, before the Chief Secretary, the Treasurer, and such members of the Legislature as may desire to attend.

TROOP HORSES REQUIRED FOR INDIA.

THE attention of breeders of horses, and dealers, is drawn to the following extracts from a despatch received on the 4th instant.

EXTRACTS FROM DESPATCH DATED "COUNCIL CHAMBER, FORT WILLIAM, 20TH JULY, 1857."

"The Right Honorable the Governor General of India will be much obliged to His Excellency the Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of Victoria, if he will cause enquiries to be made with respect to powerful horses about five years of age, suited to carry men of the Dragoon Guards, two of which corps it is understood have been ordered to India.

"An officer will be despatched by the next steamer to Sydney to select the horses, and it would be a great convenience if the parties having horses could be induced to have the horses ready for selection at that time.

"From three to four hundred horses, at least, will be required from each of the colonies of New South Wales, Victoria and Van Diemen's Land.

REGISTRATION OF PATENTS OFFICE.—REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Act of Parliament 20 Victoria No. 3, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following rules and regulations for the guidance of the Patent Office, viz:—

1. Indexes to all specifications, disclaimers and memoranda of alterations, heretofore or to be hereafter enrolled and deposited in the Patent Office, shall be prepared in the form annexed hereunto, schedule A.

2. The "Register of Patents" appointed to be kept in the Patent Office shall be prepared in the form schedule B, hereunto annexed.

3. There shall be kept in the Patent Office a book to be called "Deposit Book of Deeds," in which shall be regularly entered the particulars contained in the schedule C, hereunto annexed.

4. There shall likewise be kept in the said office a book to be entitled, "The Register of Proprietors," in which shall be regularly recorded the several particulars specified in schedule D, hereunto annexed.

5. The seal of the Patent Office shall be kept in the custody of the Registrar General.

6. The Patent Office shall be open to the public for the inspection of the registers and indexes, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Four p.m. on each day of the year, Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas Day, and public holidays excepted, and on Saturdays between the hours of Ten a.m. and Twelve noon.

7. Every person depositing in the said office any document relating to patents which it may be necessary under the said Act of Parliament to file, register or enrol, shall receive from the proper officer in the said office a printed receipt for the same, and on this receipt shall be stated the time when the depositor shall be entitled to receive back the said documents.

8. Deeds deposited in the Patent Office for the purpose of being filed, registered or enrolled, shall not be delivered up to any person except the person who deposited them; or if deposited by a clerk, a member of the firm who employed him, and who must return the receipt in exchange for the documents.

9. The following shall be the form in which inventions for which letters patent may be granted, shall be classified in the said office:—

Class 1. Agricultural implements, &c.

Class 2. Metallurgy, manufacture of metals, and instruments, &c.

Class 3. Textile manufactures and machines for preparing fibrous substances, &c.

Class 4. Chemical process, manufactures and compounds including medicines, dyeing, color-making, distilling, soap and candle making, mortars, cements, &c.

Class 5. Calorifics, comprising lamps, fire places, furnaces, stoves, preparations of fuel, &c.

Class 6. Steam and gas engines, boilers and furnaces, &c.

Class 7. Navigation and maritime implements, vessels, diving apparatus, life preservers, &c.

Class 8. Mathematical, philosophical and optical instruments, clocks, &c.

Class 9. Civil engineering and architecture, and apparatus employed on railroads, bridges, waterworks, &c.

Class 10. Land conveyances, roads, vehicles, wheels, &c.

Class 11. Hydraulics and pneumatics, water wheels, wind mills, apparatus for raising or delivering fluids, &c.

Class 12. Lever screw and mechanical power applied to pressing, weighing, raising and moving weights, &c.

Class 13. Grinding mills, gearing, grain mills, and mechanical movements and horse-powers, &c.

Class 14. Lumber, machines for dressing wood, &c.

Class 15. Stone and clay manufactures, pottery, glass, bricks, stone, dressing cements, &c.

Class 16. Leather dressing and manufactures, boots, harness, &c.

Class 17. Household furniture, domestic implements, feather dressing, mattresses, &c.

Class 18.—Fine arts, music, painting, sculpture, engraving, books, paper, printing, binding, jewellery, &c.

Class 19.—Firearms, implements, and munitions of war, &c.

Class 20.—Surgical and medical instruments, trusses, bathing apparatus, &c.

Class 21.—Wearing apparel, toilet articles, and instruments for manufacturing them, &c.

Class 22.—Miscellaneous.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.—SEA MOUTH OF THE RIVER MURRAY.
NOTICE is hereby given to masters of vessels navigating the sea mouth of the River Murray, that a rapid and important change has taken place very recently in the direction of the channel over the bar of that estuary.

Immediate steps will be taken to ascertain the precise nature of the change by actual survey, when further information will be made public.

In the meantime masters of vessels will only be acting with common prudence by securing the services of a pilot before attempting to pass the bar, as the leading beacons, until shifted, lead over the end of a shoal spit on the eastern side of the channel, which is supposed to be extending itself to the westward, thus diverting the passage, as shewn on the charts, to a more westerly direction.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, BEING FIRST INSTALLMENT GRANTED OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that every work proposed to be executed by any municipal council by funds raised by aid from the Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be the subject of a distinct and separate bye-law: And whereas the sum of Two thousand five hundred pounds has been by the Legislative Assembly during this present session granted to the municipal council of St. Kilda, subject to the conditions of the first recited Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of St. Kilda, that the said sum of Two thousand five hundred pounds shall be appropriated, more or less, in the forming, metalling and repairing of the streets and roads, and the making of drains and other public works within the municipality, particularly in the following streets and roads, viz.: the Punt road, the Alma road, Garner street, and the street intervening between the Punt road and the Alma road.

And whereas the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the council of the city of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the council of the said city, that the streets, courts and alleys, enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, shall within forty days from the date of this order coming into operation be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained and sewered, in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed and marked B; and it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts and alleys, enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed marked A, that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain and sewer, or otherwise complete and repair the street, court or alley, on which their respective tenements adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the council of the said city will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts and alleys, and pave, flag, macadamise, level, drain, sewer and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order, and will thereupon ascertain, determine and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate parts of the costs, charges and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court or alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition of pavement, flagging, macadamising, levelling, drainage and sewerage in which such streets, courts or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

SCHEDULE B, REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys, enumerated in schedule A, referred to in this order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than 1 in 120, and, where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline. In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick. The transverse sections of the right-of-way is to shew a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and in the fall from the crown of the water channels is to be at the rate of 1 in 25.

On either side of the roadway there is to be a water channel eighteen inches wide, consisting of two rows of bluestone pitchers, nine inches deep, and not less than nine inches by fourteen inches on the surface, with upright sides, set in loam and rammed with a rammer weighing forty pounds, so as to subside four inches.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven inches below the top of the kerbs.

On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than three feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a red gum plant or kerb ten inches by three, set on edge, and fastened with five-inch spikes to piles four inches by four of red gum three feet long, driven into the soil.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of 1 in 10. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of broken metal, broken to a two and a half inch gauge, and laid on seven inches thick at the channels and eight inches at the crown, and this when necessary is to be covered with a coat of loam one and a half inches thick.

Wherever private entrances lead from the right-of ways they are to be paved to the full width with bluestone pitchers in the same manner as the channels. The paving is to extend from the channels towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the City Surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles which the particularities of any case may require.
