QUARANTINE OF THE "COMMODORE PERRY."

THE existence of small-pox on board of the vessel *Commodore Perry*, now lying in Hobson's Bay, having been reported to the Government, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has ordered the said vessel and the crew thereof, and such of the passengers as are still on board, to perform quarantine, at the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, for a period of fourteen clear days from the convalescence of the last case of small-pox; and all persons are hereby required to take notice accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean are specified in a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of November, 1852.
