REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH THE ABOVEMENTIONED REWARD OF ONE THOUSAND POUNDS IS OFFERED FOR THE DISCOVERY OF A FIRST-CLASS BUILDING STONE.

1st. The stone must be, to obtain the full reward, a limestone. It must be situate in a locality easy of access, and affording such facilities that the material can be brought into Melbourne at a moderate cost.

2nd. The quarries must be capable of yielding large quantities, and in large blocks.

3rd. Although a limestone would be greatly preferred, a very superior sandstone would be admissible for a reward.

4th. The Board appointed to adjudicate will be empowered to apportion the reward into two or more sums, should it be considered that none of the samples submitted were fully adequate for the requirements of the Government, but were yet capable of being usefully employed.

5th. The Board will be the sole judges of all matters connected with this proposal, and will make their award, taking into account the quality of the material, its color, its fitness for superior building purposes, and its cost.

6th. Sample blocks, containing not less than eight cubic feet, to be forwarded to the office of the Architect to the Houses of Parliament, on or before 1st December, 1857.

7th. All sample blocks sent in will be the property of the Government.

SPIRIT MERCHANTS.

THE attention of wine and spirit merchants is called to the fifth clause of the Act 20 Victoria No. 4, by which the meaning of "spirit merchant" is defined as being "any vendor of duty-paid spirituous liquors, or of duty-paid wine, or of fermented malt liquors, in quantities respectively not less than two gallons."

All persons to whom the notice applies are hereby cautioned that unless they forthwith register themselves as spirit merchants, and pay the fee as required by the above recited Act, they will be proceeded against as the law directs.

JURY LISTS.

CLERKS of Petty Sessions are requested to take notice that the New Jury Act, 21 Victoria No. 19, has altered the time for making out the Jury Lists, as also the mode of proceeding for that purpose.

Attention is called to section VI. of the Act, by which Clerks of Petty Sessions may agree among themselves as to the limits within which each will collect the jurors' names. This arrangement had better be made at once, as every clerk is liable to a penalty if the lists are not correct, whether the default be his or not.

Attention is also invited to section VIII., by which a notice is required to be published when the lists are made; and to section IX., which shews how the lists are to be dealt with.

21 VICTORIA No. 13, SECTION 239.

"All laws now or hereafter to be in force relating to the duties of customs and regulation of the customs shall extend and apply to the said river and all vessels navigating the same as fully and effectually as if such river were part of the high seas within one league of the coast of Victoria and all vessels navigating the said river shall be deemed to be vessels trading with the said colony or on the coast thereof."

TROOP HORSES REQUIRED FOR INDIA.

EXTRACTS FROM DESPATCH DATED "COUNCIL CHAMBER, FORT WILLIAM, 20TH JULY, 1857."

"The Right Honorable the Governor General of India will be much obliged to His Excellency the Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of Victoria, if he will cause enquiries to be made with respect to powerful horses about five years of age, suited to carry men of the Dragoon Guards, two of which corps it is understood have been ordered to India.

"An officer will be despatched by the next steamer to Sydney to select the horses, and it would be a great convenience if the parties having horses could be induced to have the horses ready for selection at that time.

"From three to four hundred horses, at least, will be required from each of the colonies of New South Wales, Victoria and Van Diemen's Land.

MEMORIAL FOR A ROAD DISTRICT.

KALKALLO, YAN YEAN, MERRIANG, AND TOOROURRONG.

THE substance and prayer of a memorial to His Excellency the Governor, signed by "William Kirby, chairman," on behalf of a public meeting of the inhabitants of parts of the parishes of Kalkallo, Yan Yean, Merriang, and Toorourrong, representing the desirableness of their locality being proclaimed a road district, by the name of "The Woodstock Road District," are published below for general information.

The memorialists state that they have been yearly subjected to very great loss and inconvenience through the deplorable state of the roads in their locality, and are of opinion that they will be greatly benefited by its being constituted a road district.

They therefore pray His Excellency the Governor to proclaim a district under the authority of the Act 16 Victoria No. 40, to be called "The Woodstock Road District," comprising parts of the parishes of Kalkallo, Yan Yean, Merriang, and Toorourrong, and bounded as follows, *viz.*:— Commencing at the south-east corner of portion No. 1, parish of Yan Yean; on the east by portions Nos. 2, 7, 10, 15 and 18, of the said parish of Yan Yean, and by portions Nos. 2, 7 and 10, parish of Toorourrong, in a line bearing north to the north-east corner of portion No. 9 of the said parish of Toorourrong; thence on the north by portion No. 15 of the said parish of Toorourrong, bearing west to the north-west corner of section No. 9 of the said parish of Toorourrong; again on the east by portions Nos. 15 and 16 of the said parish of Toorourrong, bearing north to the north-east corner of portion No. 31, parish of Merriang; on the north by part of the parish of Wallanwallan, bearing west to the north-west corner of portion No. 28 of the said parish of Merriang; on the west by portions Nos. 27, 22, 15 and 10, of the said parish of Merriang, bearing south to the south-west corner of portion No. 9 of the said parish of Merriang; on the south by part of portion No. 3 of the said parish of Merriang, bearing east to the Merri Creek; again on the west by the Merri Creek in a south-westerly direction to the north boundary line of portion No. 27, parish of Kalkallo; again on the north by part of portion No. 3 of the parish of Merriang, bearing west to a point on the south boundary line of the said portion No. 3 of the said parish of Merriang, and which said point is distant one mile west from the north-east corner of portion No. 27, parish of Kalkallo; again on the west by parts of portions Nos. 27 and 22, and by portion No. 14 of the said parish of Kalkallo, bearing south to the south-east corner of portion No. 14 of the said parish of Kalkallo; again on the south by part of portion No. 10 of the said parish of Kalkallo, bearing east to the north-west corner of portion No. 9 of the said parish of Kalkallo; and again on the west by portions Nos. 10 and 3 of the said parish of Kalkallo, bearing south to the south-west corner of portion No. 4 of the said parish of Kalkallo, and again on the south by parts of the parishes of Wollert and Morang, bearing east to the commencing point.

PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS.

NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL (GEELONG).

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition addressed to His Excellency, as hereinafter set forth, signed by three hundred and thirty-six ratepayers and householders of the districts of Newtown and Chilwell, within the corporate limits of the town of Geelong, in the county of Grant.

The petitioners state that they are desirous of having the districts of Newtown and Chilwell separated from the corporation of Geelong, and formed into a municipality, bounded as shewn on a plan, viz.:—"Commencing at the junction of Aberdeen street with La Trobe terrace, and bounded on the north by the centre of Aberdeen street, bearing west 1 mile 23 chains; on the east by the centre of the Great Western road, bearing north 20 chains; on the north, again by the centre of the Great Western road, bearing west 51 chains; on the west by the centre of the Government road in front of the Orphan Asylum, bearing south to the River Barwon 24 chains 50 links; on the west again and south, by the centre of the River Barwon as far as La Trobe terrace; and on the east by the centre of La Trobe terrace, bearing north 1 mile 12 chains, back to the commencing point."

They further state that the area defined is less than nine square miles, that no one point therein is distant more than six miles from any other point, and that the population far exceeds three hundred.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the said districts of Newtown and Chilwell may be declared a municipal district."
