SECTIONS V. TO X. OF TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE
ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT
OF CARISBROOK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of
the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and
Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in
the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intitu-
led, "*An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and
other places in Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted,
that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the
good order of towns and other populous places, being sections
numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X. in the said Act,
should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts,
and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation
in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation
of the same respectively, or any of them, and that it should be
lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such
places: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of VICTORIA,
do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of
the said Act, declare and appoint that the sections of the said
Act, being numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., shall
extend to and be in force within the limits of the municipal
district of Carisbrook, in the county of Talbot.

the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred
and fifty-seven, and in the twenty-first year of Her
Majesty's Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

EXEMPTION FROM SERVING ON JURIES.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the 16th day of
November, 1857.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of
the Reign of Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for
regulating Juries*," it is enacted that every member of any
corps of volunteers whom the Governor in Council shall in
any year release in that behalf, shall be, and they are thereby
absolutely freed and exempted from being returned and from
serving upon any juries whatsoever, and shall not be inserted
in the lists to be prepared as thereafter mentioned: And
whereas it is expedient to prescribe the practice to be adopted
and pursued in applying for exemptions under the said Act:
Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the
advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order
direct that the following regulations shall be observed, that is
to say:—

1. No exemption will be granted or continue in force for any
longer period than one year.
2. No exemption will be granted in any month except
January, nor in any year, unless applied for as hereinafter
directed.

3. No exemption will be granted except on the written re-
commendation of the officer in command of the corps.

4. Such recommendation must be signed by such officer, and
contain the christian name and surname *at full length*, together
with the residence and title, quality, calling, or business of
every person recommended for exemption, and must embody a
certificate that every person so recommended is and is likely
to continue a *bona fide* member of the corps.

5. Not more than fifty members of any corps, or if such
corps has less than one hundred and fifty members, not more
than one-third of such members will be exempted in any year,
and the members exempted in any year may consist wholly
of members who shall have been exempted in any preceding
year, or of members who shall not have been so exempted, or
partly of both classes.

6. Every recommendation must be forwarded to the law
officers of the Crown in the month of December next preceding
the year in which the exemption is to operate.

7. Orders in Council for the exemption of the persons re-
commended will be forwarded to the commanding officer of the
corps, who will deliver them respectively to the persons men-
tioned therein, in order that their names may be omitted on the
revision of the jury list.

And the Honorable William Clark Haines, Her Majesty's
Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary direc-
tions herein accordingly.

BYE-LAW No. 10.—FOR ALTERING THE TIME OF MEETING OF THE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it has been provided by Bye-law No. 3 of the municipal council of Belfast, for regulating the proceedings of the council by means of standing orders, that the meetings of said council shall be held on Wednesday in each week, at Eleven o'clock a.m.; And whereas the said hour is found to be inconvenient for the attendance of some members of the council: Be it therefore ordered and directed that from and after the publication of this bye-law in the *Government Gazette*, the hour of meeting of the council shall be Three o'clock p.m. instead of Eleven o'clock a.m. as heretofore.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 10, made by the municipal council of Belfast, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

BYE-LAW No. 50.—A BYE-LAW TO PREVENT NUISANCES ARISING FROM SUFFERING CATTLE TO BE AT LARGE IN THE STREETS AND UNENCLOSED PLACES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PRAHRAN.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of public health, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the more certain prevention of the nuisance occasioned from cattle being allowed to be at large in the streets and unenclosed places within this municipal district: Be it therefore enacted that from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer any kind of swine, or any horse, mule, ass, sheep, goat, or other cattle belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large in any street or public place, or in any unenclosed place within the said municipal district, unless the same shall be his or her freehold property, or in his or her occupation. Any person who shall so offend shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 50, made by the municipal council of Prahran, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative; and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will however in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice, are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the Military Commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account, in the prescribed form, within one month after each delivery, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station, it will be forwarded through the Government Storekeeper, for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Sub-Treasury of the district, as may be indicated on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours, from a reasonable time, to be fixed by the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be competent for the department, should circumstances require it, to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage, as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which, it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

ELECTION.

Councillor Armstrong having resigned on the 3rd of June, the nomination of candidates to fill the vacancy was held at the Athenæum, on the 6th of July, when Messrs. Moxham and White were duly nominated, and a poll having been demanded, two polling places were appointed, the chairman presiding at the Athenæum, and Councillor Stewart, as deputy chairman, at Dudley's Iron Store, North Williamstown. A public urinal and privies have been constructed on the wharf.

A weighbridge has been erected on the market reserve, capable of weighing five tons, and is under the charge of Mr. Cregin, of Cole street, market clerk.

Kerbing and channelling have been effected in several places on the terms prescribed by the council.

FINANCE.

The first half-yearly instalment of £500 in part repayment of the £5000 advanced was duly paid to the English, Scottish and Australian Chartered Bank on the 10th of September.

The second half-yearly instalment of the Legislative grant for the current year, amounting to £3448 18s. 2d., has been received.

MARKET.

The municipal surveyor, instructed by the committee, prepared a plan dividing that portion of the market reserve which is situated between the Catholic Church reserve and Little Nelson street into market stalls and stands, which was submitted to the council and approved.

A plan in detail of the construction of the market sheds is being prepared.

A schedule of charges for the use of the weighbridge has been adopted and is in force.

CEMETERY.

Borings having been made with a view to determine the most eligible site for a cemetery, and two portions of land west of the railway were recommended as suitable for the purpose. Application has been made to the Government for a grant of one of them.

For a grant of land at North Williamstown for a public park.—Under consideration.

For a sum of money to erect bathing accommodation.—Refused.

For similar implements to those used by the Humane Society in England for rescuing drowning persons.—Application to be renewed when the Estimates for 1858 are being prepared.

For the sum of £500, our moiety of the grant for enclosing and laying out cemeteries.—Granted.

To erect a morgue for the reception of dead bodies awaiting coroners' inquests.—Considered unnecessary.

For posts to be placed at the corners of the streets to define the width of the paths.—Acceded to.

For a race-course.—Refused.

ASSESSMENT.

Messrs. Billings and Lawson were appointed assessors of the municipality, and the council having held several special general meetings, finally adopted a valuation representing 1491 rateable properties, amounting in the aggregate to £64,774 10s.; a rate of 1s. in the pound was struck, and the first moiety of it became due on the 1st September, 1857.

APPEALS.

Courts of appeal were held at the police office, when the total number of appeals made were twenty-four, and the amount of reductions from the entire assessment was £750, leaving an assessment balance of £64,024 10s., a result which the council consider highly satisfactory.

ALTERATION OF TIME OF MEETING.

The time at which the council met having been considered inconvenient, inasmuch as it did not allow of the ratepayers being present, it was resolved, on the 16th of April last, that the council should thereafter meet every Wednesday evening, at seven o'clock.

EXTENSION OF PIERS.

Application having been made to the Government for the increase of pier accommodation, a sum of £5000 was voted, and a portion of it is now being expended in the extension of the Ann street jetty.

OFFICERS.

The office of town clerk having been rendered vacant in April last by the resignation of Mr. Rees, advertisements for candidates were inserted in the public journals; nineteen applications were received, and Mr. E. McD. Nicholson was duly elected. Mr. Nicholson, after holding office for four months, resigned his appointment, when it was again advertised, and Mr. Tattersall was duly elected. Candidates for the office of market clerk were advertised for, the remuneration being stated by the applicants, and the offer of Mr. Cregin was accepted.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council, viz.:—

No. 17. To prevent goats being at large within the municipal district.—Gazetted 19th June, 1857.

No. 18. For the appropriation of the sum of £3000, being the second instalment of the Government grant.—Gazetted 24th July, 1857.

No. 19. To alter and amend some of the tables in Bye-law No. 14.—Gazetted 3rd July, 1857.

No. 20. For the establishment of a market.—Under the consideration of the law officers of the Crown.

No. 21. For the conduct of municipal elections.—Gazetted 3rd July, 1857.

No. 22. To impose a rate of one shilling in the pound.—Gazetted 1st September, 1857.

No. 23. For authorising and regulating the affixing of boards or metal plates in front of the houses to denote the names of the streets.—Gazetted 2nd October, 1857.

No. 24. To prevent encroachments on the public roads or streets and footpaths.—Under the consideration of the law officers of the Crown.

NAMES OF STREETS.

Boards exhibiting the names of the different streets in the municipality have been placed in conspicuous places.

FIRE BRIGADE.

The members of this body have been furnished with the necessary accoutrements.

PUBLIC CLOCK.

Mr. Staughton has intimated his intention of contributing £100 towards the purchase of a public clock to be attached to the market.

POLICE COURT.

A municipal court house is in course of erection, on the allotment reserved for the purpose, in Thompson street.

PETITIONS.

Ten petitions have been received by the council during the half-year, all relating to the formation of roads and footpaths; some of the works have been contracted for, and others will be formed as soon as the council is in possession of sufficient funds to do so. Two petitions have been forwarded by the council to the Legislative Assembly: 1st, Praying that the

sum of £5000 might be granted for wharf accommodation ; 2nd, Praying that the water might be brought to Williams-town from the Yan Yean waterworks.

TOWN HALL.

The council, impressed with the necessity which exists for providing convenient offices, at a less expense than that incurred in the occupation of those rented from Mr. Conroy, has made application to the Government for the completion of the grant of the town hall reserve, upon which it is intended, as soon as possible, to erect a portion of the town hall, plans of which are now being prepared by the municipal surveyor.

SECOND HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BEECHWORTH, TO THE 9TH OCTOBER, 1857, INCLUSIVE.

MEETINGS.

DURING this half-year the council have held twenty-six general meetings (on Thursdays, at half-past seven p.m.) and twelve special meetings, as circumstances required, making in all thirty-eight meetings, at which the attendance of members was as follows, viz. :—

During the same period there have been six meetings of the Public Works Committee, and thirteen of the Finance Committee.

ELECTIONS.

On the 30th April, Eli Abbott, Esq., was duly elected (by 101 votes) a member of this council, in the room of councillor A. B. Pritchard, resigned.

On the 22nd May, the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of councillor Winter, was filled by the unopposed election of councillor G. B. Kerferd.

On the 29th September, councillors J. C. Gray, Charles Williams and Henry Robertson, who retired from the council by rotation, were replaced by councillors J. K. Brown (178 votes), R. Craig (136 votes), A. H. Lissak, jun. (133 votes).

APPOINTMENTS.

On the 14th May, the council elected from the eight candidates that presented themselves for the post, Mr. Michael Herbert, C.E., as their town surveyor, and at the same time to act as municipal architect and engineer, with a salary at the rate of £300 per annum.

No alteration in the original appointments has taken place with regard to the other municipal officers.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws having been passed by the council, and been assented to by His Excellency the Governor of the colony, are now in force :—

No. 6.—For appropriating the balance of the first moiety of the first Legislative Grant to this municipality.

No. 9.—For enabling the inhabitants of this district to obtain the permanent levels of the streets as adopted by the council.

[This was in some measure to meet the want arising from the refusal of His Excellency's sanction to the (No. 6) bye-law, passed by the council in the previous half-year.]

No. 11.—For compelling the inhabitants of this municipality to keep clean their chimneys and flues.

No. 12.—For regulating the driving of horses and cattle into and through the municipal district of Beechworth, and for preventing the breaking-in of horses in any of the surveyed streets or roads thereof.

No. 13.—For compelling the inhabitants of this municipality to keep their premises free from offensive and unwholesome matter, and for restraining noisome, offensive and unhealthy trades, and for otherwise preserving the public health.

No. 15.—For regulating building operations and licensing builders within this municipality.

No. 16.—For regulating and licensing nightmen.

No. 17.—For appropriating the second moiety of £3750 of the Government grant to this municipality.

The council have also passed bye-law No. 14, for regulating the height and width of shades and awnings over or across public footpaths, but it has not yet received His Excellency's sanction; notwithstanding which (and the council are glad to record such a sign of the willingness of their fellow-inhabitants to co-operate with them) its provisions are being generally carried out in the municipality.

To meet the urgent requirements of the district, the council, at the commencement of this half-year, likewise framed a bye

law (as No. 10.), for the suppression and prevention of nuisances arising from cattle and other animals being at large, or wandering in the streets of this municipality; but after being thrice modified (on its being as often returned by the law officers of the Crown for that purpose) those authorities eventually altogether declined to recommend it for sanction, and this, although a similarly intentioned enactment, had been previously approved of for another municipality.

The council have lately passed another bye-law (as No. 18) for preventing the use of dangerous and insecure erections, whether temporary or permanent, for public purposes, of any kind soever, within this municipality; the necessity for a regulation of which kind must be well known to every one in the district.

But this also has been disallowed. The council, however, believing that their usefulness would be greatly restricted if they were quietly to submit to have their efforts for the good governance of the district thus continually annulled by authorities at a distance, to whom the local necessities cannot be so well known as to those on the spot, have, through their chairman, sent in to the Chief Secretary an urgent remonstrance against such injurious interference with and curtailment of the powers accorded to them by Act of Council; and they hope yet to be able to report a favorable result. They have also to deprecate the injustice and inconsistency in, and the delay, trouble and annoyance, occasioned by, the Government sanctioning for some municipalities bye-laws which shortly afterwards are disallowed for others.

ASSESSMENT.

After the final settlement of all appeals (of which there were about eighty-nine), the total value of all properties in the municipality over which the council had control, remained at £158,881 5s. 6d., on which the 1s. rate amounted to £2676 5s. 3d.; and the council can refer with pleasure to the manner in which the rates have been paid, shewn in the appended half-yearly financial statement, as evincing a desire on the part of the inhabitants to contribute their efficient aid in promoting the interests of the district.

WATER SUPPLY.

A special committee, appointed for the purpose, are organising measures for obtaining a constant and adequate supply of water for the necessities and emergencies of the large population now located in and around Beechworth; and the council hope at an early period to attain so desirable an object, which, together with the bye-law prohibiting canvas and similar materials for buildings (now many months in force), and the intended immediate formation of a fire brigade, will, the council believe, offer still greater inducements for the further settlement of this already important inland town.

INTERMENTAL INTERMENTS.

In consequence of the Government having sold part of the old grave yard, on Camp and Loch streets, in this township, this council, on the 1st of September last (under authority of bye-law No. 7), caused the removal of the whole of the bodies buried therein to the new cemetery, without the township, where the same were re-interred, surmounted by proper head-board, and enclosed with a white paling.

The removal and re-interment took place under the personal superintendence of the council, John C. Dempster, Esq., M.D., and the Government authorities, and in the presence of many relatives of the deceased, to all such of whom as could be discovered the council had caused notice to be given.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The council have caused the construction of a culvert three feet square, from Star lane to Holmes's (or the Back) Creek, which, although they disapprove of culverts as an ordinary means of drainage, was rendered necessary by the natural fall of the ground in that locality, and will prove of great advantage for the drainage of the back part of the town.

Contracts have been accepted for the permanent formation of Camp street, from Finch street to High street, and for the permanent formation of High street from Short street to Camp street, and both works are now in operation.

The council have had the following portions of the town (in addition to those in former report) cleared of all trees, stumps, and boulders, and the holes therein properly filled up, viz. :—Last street, William street, and the market reserve, which latter place they intend shortly to let on building leases under certain conditions, and in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Council.

The public recreation reserve of sixty-five acres one rood twenty-two perches the council have agreed to lease to the Public Race Committee for three years from January next, that committee undertaking to fence and clear the same, and allow the use thereof for other purposes of public recreation as may be approved by the council.

The council have had properly fenced in the two acres granted by Government for a manure depot, and have carried out sundry other small works, as shewn in the appended half-yearly balance sheet.

Whilst on the subject of public works, the council must revert to the continued delay of the Government in proceeding with their portion of same. The approach to Beechworth from the bridge, on the Melbourne side, remains in the same impassable state that it was in previous to the institution of this municipality, now a twelvemonth back, ever since which this council have been urging the Government to form that

entrance, and have been receiving assurances that it should be done, but, although the money for the purpose has been voted and the plans prepared, the work is not proceeded with, notwithstanding the reiterated and urgent representations of the council, and of J. D. Wood, Esq., M.L.A., to the Central Road Board thereon.

The following applications have been made to the various Government departments, with the undermentioned results:—

APPLICATIONS TO CHIEF SECRETARY.

1. That additional magistrates might be appointed for this municipality.—No satisfactory reply hereto has been yet received.

2. That this council might have the benefit of prison labor for preparing road metal.—Application to be considered when the new gaol at Beechworth shall have been erected.

APPLICATIONS TO COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS.

1. That the site of new Court House might be changed from near the Rock to section 8 in the township.—After great delay, granted.

2. That section 8 might be withdrawn from sale, and reserved as sites for the centralization of Government buildings, as formerly agreed to.—Granted.

APPLICATIONS TO THE SURVEY DEPARTMENT.

1. For a grant of £350 to defray the expenses of the removal of the dead under bye-law 7.—At first promised, then refused; but eventually, through the exertions of J. D. Wood, Esq., M.L.A., accorded, and will be shortly paid.

2. That an additional number of town allotments might be offered for sale.—Acceded to, and the desired lands put up to auction.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The council received a petition from the miners residing on the portion of the diggings within the municipal boundary, praying that they might be exempted from payment of the municipal rate, which indulgence it was of course out of the power of the council to grant, and a reply to that effect was accordingly returned, and the rate has, with the exception of a few instances, been paid by all who remained on the ground, till it was called for; were it, however, within the province of the council to allow exemptions, they would certainly feel disposed to extend them to the dwellings of *bona fide* miners actually located on the diggings.

On the 23rd May, His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, being on a visit to Beechworth, was graciously pleased to receive an address from the council, but in consequence of then recent occurrences, the council deemed it unadvisable to obtrude upon His Excellency any special matter of business import.

FINANCE.

Appended hereto is the honorary treasurer's half-yearly balance sheet, duly audited by the local managers of the banks of New South Wales and Victoria.

Before concluding this report the council would express their thanks for the co-operation they have met with from their fellow-ratepayers, a continuance of which they hope to receive as long as their efforts are, as they have hitherto been, directed to the furtherance of the general good of the municipality.
