PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sis Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in "the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I. Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to, and be in force in, the township of Queenscliff, in the county of Grant, the boundaries of which township are as follow, that is to say.—

Commencing at a point on Lonsdale Bay, the sonth-west angle of section No. 21 of the township, bearing north 61 degrees east, distant 28 chains 50 links; bounded on the west by a line bearing north 7 degrees 20 minutes west 13 chains: on the north by Swan Bay; on the east by Port Phillip Bay; and on the south by Lonsdale Bay westerly to the commencing point.
