PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a certain building has been erected at Carisbrook, in the county of Talbot, at the public expense, as and for a lock-up for police purposes: And whereas it is deemed expedient to proclaim such building to be a gaol within the meaning of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders." Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, do hereby proclaim the said building, called and known as the police lock-up, situated within the municipal district of Carisbrook, in the county of Talbot, as and to be a public gaol, prison and house of correction, within the meaning of the said Act, for the said municipal district.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

AVOCA.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Avooca:—

CHAP. III.—CLASS B.

vi. *Extent of claim in wet sinking.*—In wet sinking, the extent of claim shall be for—

Four (4) miners, 36 x 36 feet,

Six (6) miners, 48 x 48 feet,

Eight (8) miners, 58 x 58 feet,

and no other sized claim shall be allowed except by special sanction of the local court.

Rule No. II. of chap. III. is hereby annulled.

CHAP. V.—CLASS D.

v. *Extent of claim.*—In quartz mining the extent of claim shall be for—

One (1) miner, 20 feet,

Two (2) miners, 40 feet,

Three (3) miners, 60 feet,

Four (4) miners, 80 feet,

along the course or supposed course of the reef, and in width three hundred feet, including all the dips and angles; and no other sized claim shall be allowed, except by special sanction of the local court.

Rule No. I. of chap. v. is hereby annulled.

CHAP. VIII.

i. *Extended area in mining.*—It shall be competent for the local court in special cases to grant areas more extended than those mentioned in any of the regulations for mining purposes, but in no case shall such extension exceed four (4) times the area allowed by existing regulations.

ii. *Application to state particulars.*—Any person or persons desirous of obtaining an extended area shall make application in writing to the court, such application to state the special grounds on which it is made, and shall also be accompanied with plans of the ground. A notice of such application shall be kept posted on some conspicuous portion of the ground applied for for eight days previous to the application being entertained by the court.

iii. *Objections.*—All objections to applications for extended areas must be made in writing to the court on or before the day such applications are entertained by the court.

iv. *Extended areas how to be worked.*—When an extended area is granted, such area shall be worked subject to conditions imposed by the court, and such conditions shall be deemed and kept as records of the court, a duplicate of which shall be given to the holder or holders of such extended area; the violation of any of the conditions shall render such extended area liable to forfeiture.

LOCAL COURT REGULATION.

BEECHWORTH.

REGULATION made by the Local Court of the District of Beechworth:—

lv. *Size of claims in old ground on the Woolshed.*—In all old worked and abandoned ground on the Woolshed not actually in the bed of the creek claims not exceeding 80 yards by 80 yards, and not less than 40 yards by 80 yards, may be granted

to each claim holder; it being imperative upon the claim holder to keep constantly employed on the claim not less than one man in possession of a miner's right for every 10 yards by 80 yards held under the above rule.

The foregoing Regulation, No. LV., has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

CASTLEMAINE.

REGULATION made by the Local Court of the District of Castlemaine.

XL. *Notice of application to register quartz claims.*—All parties applying for permission to register quartz claims shall post a notice on the said claim at least one week prior to making such application.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

HEPBURN.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Hepburn:—

XL. *Alluvial sinking, size of claims.*—In all cases of alluvial sinking under twenty feet in depth the size of claim shall be:—

- For one miner, 20 feet x 20 feet.
- For two miners, 20 feet x 40 feet.
- For three miners, 30 feet x 40 feet.
- For four miners, 40 feet by 40 feet.

XLII. *Alluvial sinking.*—In all cases of alluvial sinking over twenty feet and under forty feet in depth the size of claim shall be:—

- For one miner, 25 feet x 25 feet.
- For two miners, 25 feet x 50 feet.
- For three miners, 37 feet x 50 feet.
- For four miners, 50 feet x 50 feet.

XLIII. *Wet or rock sinking, size of claims.*—In wet sinking where slabbing is required, and in cement or rock sinking where the depth exceeds forty feet, the size and extent of claim shall be:—

- For one miner, 50 feet x 50 feet.
- For two miners, 50 feet x 100 feet.
- For three miners, 75 feet x 100 feet.
- For four miners, 100 feet x 100 feet.

Amalgamation of such claims in difficult and expensive workings will be allowed on application to the local court.

XLIV. *Extended area allowed to companies in deep, wet or hard ground.*—To encourage capital and enterprise any company formed for the purpose of working deep, wet, or hard ground, which shall prove to the satisfaction of the local court that it is too difficult to be worked in the usual manner, and possessing capital equal to the difficulties opposed, shall be entitled to a claim on application to the local court, not to exceed the size hereinafter mentioned, provided the ground be pegged out conspicuously, and a notice of the application to the court be posted on the ground so applied for seven days prior to the next sitting of the court.

Provided further that any such company shall not have less than eight men at work on the ground within a reasonable time after the grant of the same shall have been obtained. The size and extent of the claim shall be in the discretion of the local court, but in no case to exceed two hundred yards by two hundred yards.

XLV. *Extended quartz claims allowed to companies.*—Any company formed for the purpose of working quartz reefs or veins, which shall prove to the satisfaction of the local court that it is too difficult to be worked in the usual manner, and possessing or representing capital equal to the difficulties opposed, shall be entitled to a claim on application to the local court, provided the ground be conspicuously pegged out, and a notice of the application to the court be posted on the ground so applied for seven days prior to the sitting of the court.

Provided further that any such company shall not have less than eight men at work on the claim within a reasonable time after the grant of the same shall have been obtained. The size and extent of the claim shall be at the discretion of the court, but in no case to exceed one hundred yards along the main reef or vein with all dips and angles.

NOTE.—Rules 1. and 11. of this series are hereby annulled.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

MALDON.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Maldon:—

XLVII. *Written agreements.*—All persons engaged in, or entering into, any partnership or company for mining purposes, shall draw up and attest, by a witness, a written agreement, specifying the intent and terms of such company or partnership. Such agreement to be produced when required.

XLVIII. *Quartz mining companies.*—To encourage the formation of quartz mining companies, it shall be lawful for a company of miners, not less in number than twelve, to take up 240 feet of any partially worked or abandoned reef, and employ the requisite number of men necessary to prospect the same. They may work their claim from one or more shafts or tunnels as may seem to them most advantageous. Upon discovering gold in their claim that will yield, for every man employed, the current rate of wages, clear of all expenses, two additional men must be employed each month succeeding the crushing of the quartz and extraction of the gold, until at least twelve men are employed. And further, in case of extra difficulties presenting themselves in the working of any reef, thereby necessitating the employment of expensive labor or machinery, and it may in consequence be advisable to grant a greater extent of claim to a larger company, the local court, after a careful investigation of the circumstances, shall have the power of granting the same.

All disputes that may arise in reference to the ground being payable, and not properly represented by the right number of men, shall be determined by the local court, and if satisfactorily proved that the ground is payable and not properly represented, the members of that court shall order the full number of men to be employed in or upon the claim, within one week, after which, that portion of ground not represented shall become public property.

Application for all ground, under this rule, to be made in the following form, without which the existence of any such company shall be considered illegal:—

Notice, containing the names of all the applicants, name of the reef, extent of ground required, with the date upon which the application will be made, must be placed upon the ground applied for, at least eight days before the hearing of the application. A similar notice to be at the same time placed on the court house.

A written application being made to the warden, the ground applied for to be marked off in his or any other duly authorised person's presence.

All parties concerned must be present on the day of the hearing of the application.

The foregoing Regulations, Nos. XLVII. and XLVIII., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

LOCAL COURT REGULATIONS.

YACKANDANDAH.

REGULATIONS made by the Local Court of the District of Yackandandah:—

XXI. *Protection for sluicing claims during failure of water.*—Claimholders who may be unable to work hill sluicing claims from failure of the usual supply of water, may obtain protection for their rights for any period not exceeding one month, on making written application, and it shall be competent for the warden to extend such protection from time to time, at his discretion, or to withdraw it on giving forty-eight hours' notice to the responsible party registered up to this date. No claim shall have the benefit of this rule until deemed in proper working order, with head and tail races cut. The regulation of the Yackandandah Local Court, No. XVII., gazetted on the 6th February, 1857, is hereby annulled.

XXII. *Extended hill claims to be numbered.*—All parties holding extended hill claims, shall keep erect at each corner of their claims, a post at least four feet high and six inches in diameter, painted white, and having black numbers thereon to correspond with the registration numbers of their claims.

The foregoing Regulations Nos. XXI. and XXII., have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.
