## NOMINATION AND POLLING DAYS FOR THE DISTRICT OF RODNEY POSTPONED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sie Henry Barrly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council "and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause to be adopted such measures as might be necessary for removing any obstacle or the doing of or the omission to do any act of a technical or formal nature by which, or the want of which, the due course of any election might be impeded: Provided that the measures so taken as aforesaid should be forthwith declared by the Governor, by a Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the Government Gazette:

And whereas the Returning Officer for the Electoral District of Rodney is absent from the colony: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, do hereby declare that, with the advice of the Executive Council, I have, by reason of such absence of the Returning Officer, postponed the nomination for the said Electoral District of Rodney until the twenty-ninth day of December instant, and the day of polling until the fifth day of January now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Scal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and in the twenty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.
