BYE-LAW, No. 11.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE BETTER PREVENTION OF FIRE WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EMERALD HILL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, "An Act for the Establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the prevention of fire, and the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 26th day of May, A.D. 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the better prevention of fire within the municipal district of Emerald Hill, be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the said district, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act:

It shall not be lawful for any roof or exterior covering of canvas, duck, drill, calico, felt, or like material, to be placed upon any building to be erected within the municipal district of Emerald Hill; nor shall it be lawful for any such building now in use to be renewed or repaired with any of the before-mentioned materials, unless such building shall stand twenty (20) clear yards from any dwelling-house or building in which fire is used; and any person acting in contravention of this bye-law in any way shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

BYE-LAW No. 3.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE DRIVING OF CATTLE INTO OR THROUGH THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

WHEREAS it is necessary for the safety of the public to regulate the driving of cattle into or through the municipal district of Portland: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Portland, in pursuance of the powers in them on that behalf vested, that no cattle intended for sale, slaughter or shipment, or when passing from one part of the country to another, shall be driven into or through the municipal district of Portland, excepting between the hours of Eight o'clock at night and Six o'clock in the morning during the months of October, November, December, January, February and March, and between the hours of Seven o'clock at night and Eight o'clock in the morning during the months of April, May, June, July, August and September; and any person who shall drive, or cause to be driven, any cattle into or through the said municipal district contrary to to this bye-law, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty shillings for every head of cattle so driven, provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to extend to oxen in yoke.

WHE, the several persons whose names and addresses are set forth in the schedule hereunder written, being desirous of forming a company under the provisions of the "Act for the better regulation of Mining Companies," 18 Victoria No. 42, for the purpose of working certain abandoned ground situate at New Year's Flat, Bald Hill, near Fryer's Creek, in the district of Castlemaine, hereby give notice as follows, viz:—

1. That the name or style of the proposed company is "The Fryer's Creek Co-operative Gold Mining Association," and the place of business of such company is an office situate at the Bald Hill, near Fryerstown, in the said district of Castlemaine.

2. The ground proposed to be worked by the said company is situate at New Year's Flat, Bald Hill, near Fryerstown aforesaid.
