ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF EAST BOURKE.

P R O C L A M A T I O N

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively:" I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, abolish the place of nomination and polling places already appointed for the electoral district mentioned in the schedule herunto annexed; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the place of nomination mentioned in the second column of the same schedule and the several places mentioned in the last column of the same schedule shall be respectively the place of nomination and the polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for the said district; and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits mentioned in the second column of the same schedule, shall be taken at any election for such district at the polling place or polling places in the said last column set opposite to the names of the respective divisions of such district, that is to say:—
