## MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

By-law No. 5.—FOR COMPELLING PER-ONS TO REMOVE ALL REFUSE TO AN APPOINTED MANURE DEPOT.

WHAT all parties be and are hereby required to deposit all soil, manure, offal, offensive refuse, and rubbish, only in the spot to be fixed by the said council as a Manure Depot; and that any one depositing, or allowing or suffering to be deposited, any such matter, of any kind soever, in any other place within this municipal district than the said Manure Depot, pay, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

The following are the boundaries of the Manure Depot fixed by the council in accordance with the above By-law, namely:—Commencing at a point on a line being continuation of the north boundary of the cemetery, three chains from the north-east corner of the same; thence by a line bearing east 43° 50' south 2 chains; thence by a line bearing north 46° 10' east 4 chains; thence by a line bearing west 43° 50' north 5 chains; thence by a line bearing south 46° 10' west 4 chains; thence by a line bearing east 43° 50' south 3 chains to the commencing point.

The foregoing By-law, No. 5, made by the municipal council of Beechworth, has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Gazetted on the 24th day of March, 1857, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to make provision for the better administration of justice in County Courts in the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that local courts, to be called County Courts, should be established and holden in and for such cities, towns, counties, and other portions of the said colony of Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor should appoint; and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony from time to time to define by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such cities, towns, counties, and portions of the said colony, and the times and places at which such courts should be holden, and such limits, boundaries, places and times to vary, alter and repeal, as the said Lieutenant Governor should think fit: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of the said colony, in pursuance of the said Act, and under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, do hereby declare and appoint that a county court, to be called the County Court of Dunolly, shall be established and holden in and for the portion of the said colony, the boundaries of which are hereby defined to be as follows, that is to say:—Commencing at a point on McNeil's Creek six miles southward of its junction with Burnt Creek; thence by a line bearing west to the river Avoca; thence northwards by the river Avoca to Lake Bael Bael; thence by a line north-westerly to the south-western angle of the town reserve of Castle Donnington; thence by the western boundaries of that reserve to the river Murray; thence eastwards by the river Murray to the river Loddon; and thence southwards by the river Loddon and McNeil's Creek to the commencing point aforesaid:

And I hereby further direct and appoint that the said county court of Dunolly shall, until otherwise ordered, be holden at the time and place following, that is to say—at Dunolly, on the twenty-third day of April, A.D. 1857:

And I do further declare and appoint that if the judge of the said court should not arrive at the place aforesaid in time to open such court on the day hereinbefore appointed, the same may be opened and held on any day or days following such day so appointed.

Bullarook Creek; thence by a line east to the range dividing the waters flowing to Joyce's Creek and the Deep Creek; thence northwards by that range and by a line north-westerly to the junction of McNeil's Creek with the river Loddon; thence by McNeil's Creek to a point six miles southward of the junction of Burnt Creek; thence by a line bearing west to the river Avoca; and thence southward by the river Avoca to the commencing point aforesaid.

**BYE-LAWS OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.**

WHEREAS by an Act of Council passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 39, intituled, "An Act to establish a Board of Commissioners for the better sewerage and drainage of the City of Melbourne and for supplying water thereto and to the suburbs thereof," the said commissioners are authorized (section 13) from time to time

to make, alter and repeal bye-laws, for the following amongst other purposes, viz., for regulating the amount of assessment, and collection of rates, charges and contributions, the forms of rates, and the mode and period of and for appeals from rates and charges for default, and to impose such penalties as they may think fit, not exceeding twenty pounds for each breach thereof: Provided that no bye-law shall be of any force or effect until the same be submitted to and approved of by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, and published in three consecutive numbers of the *Government Gazette*:

Now, in execution of the said powers, the said commissioners do make the bye-laws following:—

1. A valuation shall be made from time to time, if the commissioners think fit, of the annual value of all houses and tenements opposite or convenient to which pipes for the conveyance of water shall have been laid by the said commissioners.

2. Notice of the amount of such valuation shall be given to the person liable to pay water rate for the same.

3. Such persons may appeal to the commissioners against such valuation on giving notice in writing of such appeal to the secretary of the commissioners within fourteen days of the service of such notice.

4. The commissioners may either confirm the valuation or make a new one, and in the event of the parties not acquiescing in the award of the commissioners, they may appeal to two justices of the peace, by whom the same shall be determined.

5. All persons applying for or receiving water from the said commissioners shall pay for the same until the 25th December, 1857, or until further notice be given by the said commissioners of any alteration in their rates, at the following rates, viz.:—

1. On houses of £50 annual value and under, a rate of five pounds per centum on the valuation.
2. On houses above £50 and under £300 annual value, a rate of four pounds ten shillings per centum on the valuation.
3. On houses at £300 annual value and upwards, a rate of four pounds per centum on the valuation.
4. Houses, stores, manufactories, or premises in which the quantity of water consumed, or likely so to be, would be greater or less than the average consumption of private houses of equal value, shall be subject to such special rate on the annual value as the said commissioners may think fit to impose, and as may be agreed to by the owners, in addition to or in deduction from the abovenamed rating at their annual value.

6. All such rates shall be paid in advance, by equal quarterly payments, at Christmas day, Lady day, Midsummer day, and Michaelmas day, in every year, and the first payment shall be made at the time when the pipe by which water is supplied is made to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners, or at the time when the agreement to take water from the commissioners is made.

7. Any person receiving water from the commissioners who shall supply any other house or premises with water than that for which he is himself liable, or who shall allow any person not subject to water rate to be supplied, or who shall allow water to be taken from his premises to be consumed elsewhere, shall be liable to a rate in respect of the premises so supplied, or to a penalty of five pounds for each case in which water shall be so supplied by him, as to the said commissioners may seem most fit.

8. Any person supplied with water by the commissioners, or liable to the water rate, who shall neglect to pay such rate at any of the times of payment thereof, shall be liable to pay a charge for default not exceeding four pounds for each quarter's rate, and the commissioners may stop the water from flowing into the premises in respect of which such rate is payable, by cutting off the pipe to such premises, or by such means as the commissioners shall think fit, and shall recover such charge for default, together with the expenses of cutting off the water and the costs of recovering the rate, from every such person.

9. Any person who shall open any ground so as to uncover a pipe of the commissioners, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with any such pipe, without giving to the commissioners fourteen days' notice of his intention so to do, or who shall make any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners without giving to them two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners, or who shall make such communication without the superintendence or contrary to the directions of the officer appointed by the commissioners, unless he shall fail to attend at the time mentioned in such notice, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the commissioners of a strength and material not approved of by the commissioners, or in case of dispute settled by two justices, shall forfeit for each offence a sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

10. In all cases where a stand pipe is erected for the supply of the houses and tenements in any right-of-way, lane, or other place, any person not occupying a house in any such right-of-way, lane, or other place, who shall take water from such stand pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding four pounds, unless he or she have received a written permission from the commissioners to take water from any such stand pipe.

11. Any person supplied with water who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
