PLACE OF NOMINATION FOR THE NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively.*" I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation abolish the place already appointed for the nomination of candidates to serve in the Legislative Council of Victoria for the North-Western Province thereof, and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that CASTLEMAINE shall be the place of nomination as aforesaid for the said North-Western Province.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
